- ~There needs to be a better line of communication between the mayor, council members, and residents. There also needs to be more respect between the mayor and council.
- ~Unhappiness with road repair: Some have found the new curbs to be an eyesore, dangerous for larger vehicles to drive by and inadequate for directing rain water. There is also displeasure with the amount of time it has taken to have roads repaired and the order in which the roads were repaired (those done by the mayor's and members of the council's homes first). There are many sidewalks and roads still in need of repair. Residents also want to know how much longer the road tax will continue, seeing as it has already been extended from its original time frame.
- ~The police need to have a greater presence in Park Hills through more patrolling and make a greater effort to get to know the residents on a personal level.
- ~Too much money is being spent on beautification, especially since not all of Park Hills benefits from it. There is not enough done around Dixie Highway.
- ~Some streets do not receive snow removal in a timely manner.

- ~City residents are divided on the importance of Trolley Park. Some believe that a bathroom would be a great addition to the park while others find it to be a complete waste of money that would be better spent elsewhere.
- ~Many streets (St. Joseph, South Arlington, Amsterdam, Cleveland, St. James, Cecelia Avenue, and Sleepy Hollow) are still in need of street repairs or have vehicles passing through that disregard the speed limits. There are also issues with the timing of traffic lights on Dixie Highway and South Arlington; they make it hard for residents to exit. Also, many streets do not have adequate sidewalks or lighting at night.
- ~A community/public pool or gym would be a nice addition to the city.
- ~Many are pleased with the beautification of the green spaces in the city but feel that some areas are of higher importance than others, and that in these times of economic hardship, money should be spent on more important things.
- ~Residents would like to have fall leaf pick-up and not have to pay extra for it.
- ~Some are dissatisfied with the lack of enforcement of parking tags. Those who do buy them find it unfair that many residents who don't buy them get away with not having to pay the added expense.
- ~Residents would like more community activities that are for all ages, from children to seniors.
- ~A 5 year plan, or something equivalent, of what the city's vision is in regards to spending tax money would be appreciated by many.

- Keep City Website about City Business, not students who are on the honor roll.
- Link to fire department does not work, meet the officers is incomplete.
- Look for the hub site more often than the city because it has more information on it, but the website is hard to find, possibly put a direct link on the city site to the hub.
- Looked at site a few times.
- Many of Park Hills residents are not as involved with electronics as you might think.
- More links to more info on specific item.
- Poorly done and hard to find information.
- Post things in a timelier manner.
- Remove non Park Hills items (Devou Park and private facebook page) post agendas for meetings at least one week in advance. List all dates for scheduled meetings.
- The hub should be included as well as the civic association information. No need to separate the social from business/ politics of the city.
- The site is more of a social website then a useful community tool.
- The website is good.
- The website was very outdated and not user friendly.
- There are noticeable improvements to the website and seem to be more organized and updated more frequently. Would like to see all events listed on the calendar. Fire department icon doesn't work.
- Times of meetings should be posted; if they are and I overlooked them I am sorry.
- Very few updates.
- Web site is good.

- Why should we look at the website, it doesn't get updated very often. Why not have emails from the city for updates on criminals and street closures?

 neighborhood issue a few years ago and it was met with indifference, I would also like
 to see more emphasis put into cleaning up the Dickman apartments.
- I quit attending because of the disrespect shown by council and the mayor to residents. They need to be civil.
- I was very pleased the location of the city meetings changed, it is much easier to access now. Would prefer if the executive session was at the end of the meeting so those in attendance don't have to sit and wait.
- I would like it if a recap of the events was posted to the website.
- I would like to see transparency and cooperation between the mayor and ALL the councilmen. They should be working as a team with all involved and informed about Park Hills issues.
- Is there something published that tells when the meetings are going to be on cable.
- It is nice having the meetings once a month at the CCH building. Easy access and a bigger room.
- Keep to the point.
- Location of the council meetings is very good but I dislike the personal videotaping, it causes residents to feel intimidated about speaking up.
- Mayor should be less belligerent and more respectful to other people, his behavior is outrageous.
- Mayor's behavior is embarrassing.
- Meetings are not streamlined, verbal banter that is meaningless. Keep them focused and on a timeline so that people can get home at a reasonable hour CCH location is a pain.
- Meetings at the park so kids can play.
- Most issues of resident interest end up in an executive session. The mayor's ignorance and overall behavior have made it a worthless endeavor for citizens to attend.
- Moving the city meetings to Covington Catholic was a great idea.
- People should be allowed to speak freely with no time limit; city should not have to pay for a venue to host.
- Post recorded meeting to the internet, on website.
- Post the recording on the website.
- Send email reminders.
- Sound quality is very poor.
- The mayor needs to "brush up" on Roberts Rules motion, second, discussion; council member calls the question, vote to close end discussion. If passed then vote on motion.
- The mayor's conduct is intolerable and unacceptable. He is a bully and does not have a
 grasp on the issues, or the English language. He should be removed ASAP.

- Cars parked on Cecelia don't have stickers. I and others don't have a view from our homes, we have to look at the back of houses, and we were told we would only see roof tops, what happened to the codes and laws?
- City clerk is very accommodating and professional; police personnel are much more visible and polite.
- City council needs more new members. Really like the new mayor.
- City employees tried to cut down bushes I had planted. Failed to pick up recycling several times last year. Ran into my wall and destroyed reflectors.
- Cleveland has new markings painted on the road bed; I hope this doesn't mean Duke is going to dig up the new road.
- Continue to provide funds for the fire department and keep it in the city of Park Hills.
 Could be better with the snow removal on Arlington. We hope the police department will continue to serve the residents of Park Hills and not other cities.
- Cut down on cats and dogs doing their business in your yard.
- Dennis Finke is a real asset to the city.
- Desperately need bus shelters. Move bus shelters at St. Joseph and Dixie so bus doesn't block intersection. The light at St. Joseph has too long of a red light, it's hard to get out onto Dixie highway. Have planters on south side of park hills entrance.
- Don't like new curbs on Cleveland, hard for bigger vehicles to drive by. Police chief not very responsive.
- Find it curious that money is spent on some roads but not all. City should invest in improving utility service.
- From my limited but reliable sources, the mayor has only his self interest in mind and half of the city council is afraid to challenge him.
- Have seen neighbors park vehicles in their front yard, vacant properties are not maintained.
- I am embarrassed for those council members who ask legitimate questions regarding our city and are rudely "shut up" by the mayor, who shows little respect for the members not "on his team".
- I am not dissatisfied with the mayor or council at an individual level. I am dissatisfied with their inability to bridge their divide and provide nonpartisan leadership.
- I am pleased with the current mayor and the council's decisions for Park Hills and the vote to not raise property tax.
- I am sometimes embarrassed by the behavior of the mayor and the council. Some of the city plants block line of sight for turning onto and off of streets.
- I had an ambulance call last year after I fell down some stairs; the EMT felt me and said nothing was wrong. 2 weeks later my son took me to the hospital and I had 10 broken ribs and a ruptured spleen. I almost died! So much for EMT's input.
- I have been very pleased with the appearance of the city. There is a divide between those on opposite sides of Dixie highway as to one side being favored. Lots of positive changes have been made by the mayor. I notice that the fire chief is often absent from meetings.
- I have needed a small repair of approximately 2 feet of the curb in front of my house and have asked the maintenance department for the repairs for several years. I do not want this repair with blacktop since it is concrete. I would appreciate if someone could contact me about this.

- I have only read negative reports of the mayor and council in newspapers, I don't feel like I directly know what they have contributed to the city.
- I have tripped a couple of time on the Terrace sidewalk, would have liked to see it repaved when the street work was done.
- I like the water fountain for dogs in Trolley Park.
- I live on the corner, since the last paving of Old State Road the street is higher than my driveway. When it rains waste is washed into my driveway. There should be a sewer midway on the street.
- I think Dixie highway is very unattractive. The south side of Dixie has no place to picnic. The old wooden city council sign has got to go.
- I think Park Drive area looks good but Trolley Park is too cluttered. New things are being added while money is tight, it is wasteful. The mayor is doctorial and does not allow his team to collaborate. It is painful watching the meetings. He bullies the council and residents.
- I think the curbs look awful.
- I think the smaller cities should merge on fire and police protection to save tax payers money.
- I think we need more patrol for speeding and running stop signs.
- I thought the road assessment was to last only 2 years.
- I was under the impression that our new police officers were going to be on bike patrol which would save the city money and help the officers get to know the residents. I have not seen a single bike, although I have noticed more patrol via cars.
- I would love it if someone would take care of the landscaping on the corner of Amsterdam and Sleepy Hollow.
- In a snow emergency I would like the cars that stay on the street to be ticketed or towed, not just given a warning.
- Inconsistent spending on street and road projects. Some streets receiving more funding than others, in relation to number of taxpaying residents.
- Irish Rose is always last to have snow removed. The road work on Exter is terrible, the whole street should be repaved.
- It seems like some neighborhoods get more attention than others.
- It would be nice to have a meet the mayor or meet the city council night. The only time we
 hear from them is around election time. Perhaps a social gathering would promote more
 participation.
- I've been paying into road tax for years and am now informed that there will be an item on the ballot to eliminate this. How is this fair? Residents whose street has been replaces versus patched are going to vote to get rid of it and the rest of us get screwed. thanks council!
- Keep road fund. Be proactive.
- Leaf pick up should be provided and paid for only by those who use it. Snow removal is not done in a timely manner.
- Love the flowers.
- Love the increased presence of the police force.
- Many police just harass the residents with speeding tickets.
- Many sidewalks are in need of repair or replacement and some streets as well like lower west Amsterdam.
- Mayor and council are too divided.
- Mayor Catchen and the police are doing a superb job it is wonderful to see and talk to
 police and the many patrols afford a secure feeling.

- Mayor Catchen's arbitrary firing of our police chief is disturbing and opens another sex discrimination suit against Park Hills.
- Miller Pavilion is not attractive. Lighting that building up at night is unnecessary. Memorial suggestion: plant a tree with a plaque at its base.
- Most services are excellent, the mayor, council, and police seem to have priorities and agenda that are not about the best interests of Park Hills.
- My curb was skipped; it is an eyesore, broken and crumbling.
- My end of Coram Street could be repaved.
- Need more police patrol on Sleepy Hollow road while school is in session.
- Need some holes patched on Aberdeen.
- New curbs look great but the new curbs make it difficult for two cars to pass at the same time. Amsterdam down to Montague needs repairs.
- No park on our side of park hills.
- On Scenic Drive we have a dog problem. People have three or four dogs and let them run all over, they get in my garage and I can't get rid of them.
- Our city is beautiful; everyone does a really good job maintaining the area.
- Our roads need to be fixed, the potholes.
- Pedestrian cut through in neighborhoods could be maintained better, concrete work and cut back shrubs.
- Park Hills could do a better job encouraging and promoting recycling. I am surprised and disappointed when I don't see people recycling their garbage. It is easy and convenient.
- Police are not as friendly as they use to be; very disappointed that Amy was fired from police chief. Public works is friendly and efficient.
- Police should not write tickets for vehicles parked on private property. Mayor Catchen needs to be less dictatorial in conducting council meetings.
- Potholes on Amsterdam down to Covington need to be fixed.
- Provide maintenance of paths or request homeowners along the paths to help keep them clear of weeds and refuse.

- What service does city council provide? Volunteer programs are dangerous for someone
 whose life is in danger. Too much time elapses before they arrive, the same with the
 firefighters.
- Where is our road fund money being used?
- Whoever takes care of the plants and flowers around Trolley Park and all does a great job.
- Why pay for recycling, it's a known fact Rumpke doesn't really recycle.
- Wish the hill below Hamilton could have a higher retaining wall at entrance to gateway. As you can see by all the mud we are losing our hill.
- Would like to have taxes lowered.
- Would like to see the police out more so they can meet the residents, they are suppose to be "bike cops" yet more patrol cars were bought. Better way to fight wildlife concerns than with guns.
