Dear Sir:

Due to the busy holiday season, and the rush of duties to perform in the limited time from December 15th. to January 15th.1938, it was impossible to make this detail report to you, a report which, as you know I said I would make before vacating my seat as a member of the Board of Trustees.

Whave prepared this report showing the operation of the City of Park Hills during the years of 1936--1937 and carried on this very detailed statement, the operation for the years 1933-1934-and 1935, which records were taken from the records of the City Clerk.

My object in preparing this statement, is that the present Board of Councilmen will have before them the records showing what has gone on in previous years and in the hopes that it will be as beneficial to your board as it has been to the Board, whose term expired at the closing of 1937.

We beileve, that some mention should be made of the performances of the Board of Trustees during the years of 1936-1937, in order that the present board of Council may be familiar with the conditions that existed during our term of office and that the actions taken by our Board was done with the interest of the tax payers at all times being foremost in our minds.

On January 1st. when this Board assumed office, we had in the General Fund \$ 458.24 and the tax money for 1936 to operate the city, at that time, the average revenue received from all sources to operate the city was about \$ 9.000.00 and the average expenditures about the same amount, so that the revenue received for the taxes during 1936 would have taken care of the fixed charges without assuming any additional obligations.

The Board of Trustees whose term expired in December 1939, did sign contracts for the reconstruction of Old State Road and the building of the Audubon Road Sewer, These contracts made with the U.S.Government placed the obligation upon our shoulders, which obligation amounted to \$8.012.71 which the Sponsor was to pay and the Government agreed to pay \$39.315.29 for their share of this work. These contacts for the two W.P.A. projects were signed before the board assumed office and it has developed that they were very badly needed and that the City of Park Hills was very fortunate to have the work done under the conditions existing at that time. I do not Condem the previous board for this action but commend them for their foresight.

There being insufficient funds in the treasury to meet these obligations, it was necessary to use the current taxes for 1936 to pay

for the bills from the W.P.A. projects as they were presented.

The work on these projects started in January 1936 and the first bills presented for payment were presented in February 1936, we continued to pay these bills until the both accounts were closed out in July, 1937.

We continued to use the money from the General Fund for this purpose as well as for the maintenance of the city, paying all bills as presented. On August 10th. 1936, the treasury required building up, our funds becoming so low that it was impossible to operate without additional funds and on this date we made a loan from the Security Bank of \$5.000.00 being as we received no additional revenue from any source during the balance of the year 1936, it was necessary to renew this note on December 10th.1936 which renewal held us over until the taxes for the year 1937 become due and when we did receive these taxes, we did on April 10th. 1937 pay this note in order to avoid the payment of any further interest.

We continued to operate on this money which we received as taxes for 1937 until August 15th. 1937, it was again necessary to borrow from the bank \$2.500.00 and when this note become due we renewed same for another 120 days on December 15th. and again renewed same on December 15th. 1937, which note expires in April 15th.1938.

In order to show whay it was necessary to borrow this money, allow me to show you the figures which appear on the attached atatement, our revenue from taxes and other sources during 1936 amounted to \$ 12.734,09 and expenses \$ 15.469.56 leaving a net defect at the end of the year of 2 2.935.47, This is excluding the loan of \$ 5.000.00 from the bank mentioned in the forepart of this letter.

Duringnthe year 1937, our revenue amounted to \$ 12.425.29 excluding the loan from the bank, and our expenses including this loan which had to be paid, amounted to \$ 18.152.16

We paid off this loan of \$ 5.000 and also placed in the treasury at our disposal \$\$ 2.143.56 of the 1938 taxes which was to apply for the operation of the city during the year 1938 and at the same time made the loan of \$ 2.500.00 from the bank in order to tide us over until the tax returns came in during the first few months of 1938.

According to the report of the Auditing committee we had in the treasury on December 31st.1937, \$ 1.316.69 and we owed the bank \$ 2.500.0 we used or rather placed at our disposal \$ 2.143.56 of the 1938 taxes, and by deducting the \$ 1.316.69 from the \$ 2.500.00 due the bank and the \$ 2.143.56 1938 taxes, we have a net defect for the present board of \$ 3.326.87 which they will have to work off during the next two years.

When the Trustees assumed office in 1936, with an obligation of \$ 8.012.71 we vacated the office in December 1937 with a defect of \$ 3.326.87 thereby without any additional taxation we did pay off, during the years 1936-1937 \$ 4.685.84 of the obligation we assumed.

It should be mentioned that during the year 1937, we spent more than \$ 1.000.00 in street repairs, placed into service three additional street lights, tested, flushed and repaired all the fire plugs, reduced the

water rate, reduced the electric light rate, completed the construction of the Audubon Road Sewer, the St. James Ave. sewer and the reconstruction of Old State Road.

May I close this report saying, it has been a pleasure and honor to serve the City of Park Hills and to work with such men who have been so capable, honest and energetic in conducting the business affairs of this beautiful city in which we live.

W wish the present board of Councilmen, the greatest success and know that the people of Park Hills will be served well during your administration.

WHEREAS, the City of park Hills, pursuant to Ordinance No. 86, passed and approved November 20, 1931, and the Bid of The Union Lightm Heat & Power company submitted thereunder under dat oe November 27, 1931, did, by resolution duly adopted and approved at its regular meeting heold on jecember 4 and December 11, 1931, respectively, award the franchise to the Union Light, Heat & Power Company for the supplying of electricity in said City to public and private consumers which said franchise expires on ecember 11, 1941; and,

WHEREAS, under the terms of said franchise grant no rates were provided for the furnishing of street lighting

in the City of Park Hills; and

WHEREAS, under date of June 13, 1938, The Union Light, Heat & Power company has made a proposal to the City of Park Hills specifying the price at which it will furnish street lighting as now exists on the streets of said City for the remaining term of said franchise grant, which proposal is in words and figures as follows, to wit:

> Covington, Tentucky June 13, 1938.

## PROPOSAL

For the lighting by electricity of the streets alleys. avenues, and other public ways of the City of Park Hills, Kenton cunty, Kentucky, for the remainder of the term of the Franchise Grant under Ordinance No. 86 of the City of Park Hills.

Honorable Mayor and Board of Trustees. City of Park Hills, Kentucky. Gentlemen:

The undersigned, The Union Light, Heat and Power Company, proposes to maintain and operate the existing electric street lighting system for the purpose of lighting the streets, alleys, avenues and other public wyas of the City of ark Hills, enton county, entucky, for the remainder of the term of its existing franchise with said city granted to it pursuant to Ordinance No. 86 passed and adopted November 20, 1931. Said street lighting system shall be maintained and operated in accordance with the following terms and conditions and at the following rates, to wit:

1. The street lighting equipment at present installed and as now located and as described in general terms in Paragraph No. 2, below shall comprise the street lighting system to be furnished under the terms of this proposal subject to such changes or alterations as are

hereinafter provided for.
The street lighting circuits shall consist as at present of series incandescent circuits operating on alternating current at approximately 6.6 amperes and at afrequency of 60 cycles per second and multiple circuits operating an alternating current at approximately 120 volts and at frequency of 60 cycles per second.

2. The rates to be charged by the Company and paid by the City of Park Hills for the classes of service as specified hereunder shall be as follows:

32-250 rated condlepower (2500lumens) boulevard units on Cleveland Brive and encircling the area bounded by Arlington Road, Hamilton Road, Amsterdam Pike, Terrace Drive, Old State Road and Berdeen Road, as now existing-\$45.00 per lamp per year.

7-100 watt units on overhead bracketts or mast arms, on starirway North of Alhambra Court, Amsterdam oad at Altavia Avenue, Old state Road at St. James Avenue, Dixie Highway at St. James Avenue, Audubon Road at Lawton Road and inclined walk South of Lawton Road, as now existing- \$36.00 per lamp per year.

2-60 rated candelpower (600) lumens units on overhead brackets or mast arms on Locust Street, as now existing-\$24.00 per lamp per year.

1-200 rated watt unit on overhead mast arm om Amsterdam Pike at Hillcrest Avenue, as now existing -\$45.00 per lamp year.

1-400 rated candle power (4000 lumens) overhead mast arm on Amsterdam Pike near Montague Avenue, as now existing -\$42,00 per lamp. per year.

- 3. Changes and locations- The undersigned agrees to relocate or to make any change of any existing lighting unit which the City may order to be changed or relocated, and the cost of such change or relocation to be at the expense of the City.
- 4. Future Extensions The undersigned hereby agrees to install additional overhead lighting units of the above mentioned sizes in locations designated by said City subject to the following conditions: In the event the city shall order the installation of a lighting unit more then 400 ft. from any installed and operating unit, the City shall pay the undersigned the actual cost plus 15% of installing all poles, wire, and other mecessary equipment required to install such unit in excess of said 400 ft.
- 5. All street lighting units as herein provided for shall be lighted each and every night in the year during the entire period of this proposal in accordance with the Company's general street lighting schedule in effect from time to time, approximately thirty (30) minutes after sunset until

Approximately thirty (30) minutes before sunrise for a total lighting period consisting of approximately 3950 hours per lamp per year.

All street lighting outages shall be reported by authorized representatives of the gity to the undersigned at its Third and fourt street office by telephone as soon as discovered, and as is reasonably convenient. Any outage, reported before and up to 11;99 o'clock p. m. shall be repaired within two hours and outages reported after 11:00 o'clock P. M. shall be repaired before the following evening.

It is further agreed if repairs are not made as hereinabove specified, deductions may be made at the hourly rate for the full time of the outage, provided, however, that no deductions shall be made for outages which are repaired within the time as hereinabove specified or which are beyond the control of the undersigned, such as might be caused by wind, storm, floom fire, or Acts of God, but the undersigned will use every means and effort reasonable possible to promptly restore the service when outages are thus caused.

- 6. All street lighting equipment as herein described or any additional units which may be added to the system duting the period of this proposal ad all equipment associated therewith, including lamps, refelctors, and glassware, shall be kept in good operating condition and repair and all street lighting units shall be adequately cleaned as often as necessary tommaintain a reasonable operating efficiency, but not oftener than ince per month, and all ornamental standards shall be painted as often as proper maintenance and appearance may require, but not oftener than once per year. All such maintenance and repairs shall be done by and at the expense of the undersigned.
- 7. The undersigned shall not be responsible in damages for any failure to supply electricity or for the interpuption of the supply if such failure or interruption is without wilful default or negligence on its part.
- 8. This proposal is submitted and its acceptance shall be conditioned upon the company being able to secure renewal of its franchise grants from other political subdivisions wherein its main distribution system is now located and from which system extensions shall be made in the streets and public places of the City of Park Hills. It is expressly understood and agreed that no obligation shall be imposed upon the undersigned by reason of this proposal and its acceptance to fulfill or perform its obligation to furnish electric service thereunder in the event that during the life of this proposal the franchise previously granted to the undersigned by other political subdivisions for the

transmitting of said electricity through such political

and from which distribution system the electric lines have been extended for the supplying of electricity as therein provided expires and no further franchise is secured by the Compsny. In such event the company shall be relieved from durther fulfillment of its obligation to furnish electricity under this proposal during the remainder of the term thereof, or until such time as a franchise may be secured by the undersigned from such political subdivision.

9. All bills for service as described herein shall be rendered by the Company on the first of each and every month for the equal monthly installments at the rate heretofore set forth and shall be payable within ten (10) days after date of bills and shall bear interest at the rate of six percent (6%) per annum after thirty (30) days from date thereof until paid.

The undersigned for said prices upon the acceptance of said terms by proper resolution of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Park Hills agrees to fulfill all the terms and conditions specified herein.
