NORTHERN KENTUCKY AREA.

WHEREAS, The Covington Kenton County Industrial Association in conjunction with various other Industrial Civic organizations of Kenton, Campbell and Boone Counties, has exerted and is exerting much effort and time toward obtaining for this locality, industries engaged in the National Defense program; and

WHEREAS, there are approximately 200,000 people residing in these three Northern Kentucky Counties, comprised mostly of home owning families, skillful workmen and artisans as well as adequately and well equipped and staffed training schools and

WHEREAS, in Northern Kentucky there are large areas strategically located, suitable and available for such industries, offering an abundance of raw materials with all necessary shipping facilities, both by rail and water; and

WHEREAS, notwithstanding the many desirable features of the locality herein enumerated and the untiring and unselfish toil of numerous civic minded persons to obtain Defense Program Industries for the employment of our people at home have been unfruitful to date, and representative persons in positions to render effective assistance have been lackadaisical in their cooperation, resulting in Industries actively campaigned for going elsewhere, now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY, as follows;

Section No. 1: That it does hereby petition our U. S. Senators, Hon. Alben W. Barkley, and Hon. Albert Benjamin Chandler, and our Congressman, the Hon. 
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



WHEREAS, it is essential that the costs incident to the prosecution of such work be borne by the citizens of Kenton County, through their regularly constituted legislative bodies;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Park Hills, Kentucky:

Section 1, That there is hereby appropriated to the use and benefit of the National Council for Civilian Defense for Kenton County, Kentucky, the sum of \$200.00, to be used by it in partly defraying the costs incident to the prosecution of said work.
