

Mark Hills- Annexed Territory.

After receiving the blue print showing the area which your city proposes to annex, and other data in connection with the proposed annexation, we graded the fire protection for this combined area and we are glad to say that even with this additional area your city will still grade sixth class. However, the margin between the sixth and seventh class grading has been considerably reduced, so that it will be imperative that all of our recommendations are strictly maintained at all times and that no additional territory be included, if the sixth class grading is to be safely maintained.

We shall appreciate it very much if you will send us a copy of the ordinance by which this additional territory is to be annexed to your present city limits.

In closing we wish to thank you and your City Council for the co-operation shown us in this matter and we trust that the fire protective features will be properly maintained at all times.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING
THE CLERK TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS FOR
FIRE HOSE

WHEREAS, the Safety of the Council of the City of Park Hills has recommended to the Council that it is necessary to purchase 300 feet $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch hose for the Fire Department in order to maintain the Standards set by the Kentucky Actural Bureau; and WHEREAS, the cost of such hose will probably exceed the minimum prescribed by law, for which public advertisement must be made; THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Park Hills does resolve as follows:

1) The Clerk of the City of Park Hills is authorized and directed to advertise, in the Kentucky edition of the Cincinnati Enquirer, the official paper of the City of Park Hills, for bids for 300 feet of $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch double cotton jacketed rubber lined wax and gum treated fire hose, with rocker lug type bronze couplings, with $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch national standard threads. The terms of the purchase shall be for cash within thirty (30) days after the hose has been delivered and inspected and found to conform with the specifications herein set out.

2) The advertisement shall be placed in the Kentucky edition of the Cincinnati Enquirer, on the 21st. day of February 1945, and sealed bids shall be received by the Clerk up to and including 8 P. M. (C.W.T.) on the 12th. day of March 1945.

3) This resolution shall take effect and be in force when properly published and recorded according to law.
