Mr. Vogt stated ~~at~~ that a Compact of nine states was being formed. It had reached the point so it was only awaiting the entrance of the State of Virginia.

Mr. Vogt stated further that a Sanitary District was being formed in Northern Kentucky, this would contain 16 different municipalities. As soon as all the communities enter the Sanitary District then it will be certified properly and the District then can borrow money from the Federal Government to make a thorough investigation. The different communities will then be advised whether it is advisable to enter the Sanitary District permanently or to withdraw. Each municipality has the privilege of withdrawing from the Sanitary District after the survey or investigation is made, if it can handle the sewage better or more economically through some system of its own. The only restriction is the method system or plan must meet with the approval of the persons in charge of the Sanitary District.

The Council asked numerous questions of the Mr. Vogt and Mr. Michaels. The questions were answered quickly and intelligently.

The Council thanked Mr. Vogt and Mr. Michaels for the time they spent with the Council.
