THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION ON MONDAY, JANUARY 8, 1962, IN THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING AT 8:00 P.M. WITH MAYOR SCHULER PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN GORMLEY, HELLMAN, MCCLUNG, SMITH, SCHADLER, AND TABELING PRESENT.

The minutes of the December 11, 1961 meeting and the January 1, 1962 meeting was approved as read by the clerk. The regular routine of business was suspended to permit the organization of this new council.

The city attorney read Ordinance No. 1, 1962: AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE TIME AND PLACE OF THE REGULAR MONTHLY MEETINGS OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS FOR THE TWO YEAR TERM OF OFFICE BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1962, AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 1963. A motion was made by Mr. Hellman and seconded by Mr. Gormley that Ordinance No. 1, 1962 be adopted as read. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

The city attorney then read Ordinance No. 2, 1962: AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE TAX RATE OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS AND LEVYING A TAX ON ALL REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY SUBJECT TO TAXATION FOR GENERAL PURPOSES: LEVYING A TAX FOR THE RETIREMENT OF THE BONDED INDEBTED NESS: FIXING THE DATE OF PAYMENT, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FORFAILURE TO PAY SAME AT SUCH TIME. A motion was made by Mr. Schadler and seconded by Mr. McClung that Ordinance No. 2, 1962 be adopted as read. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

The city attorney read Ordinance No. 3, 1962: AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ADVERTISING AND RECEIPT OF BIDS FOR THE LEASING BY THE CITY OF PARK HILLS OF AN AUTOMOBILE TO BE USED AS A POLICE CRUISER IN THE CITY. A motion was made by Mr. Tabeling and seconded by Mr. Gormley that Ordinance No. 3, 1962 be adopted as read. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

The city attormey then read Ordinance No. 4, 1962: AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LETTING OF A CONTRACT BY THE CITY OF PARK HILLS FOR PROVIDING TELEPHONE SERVICE BONTINUOUSLY FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT AND FIRE PROTECTING IN THE CITY OF PARK HILLS. A motion was made by Mr. Smith and seconded by Mr. Gormley that Ordinance No. 4, 1962 be adopted as read. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

The city attorney then read Ordinance No. 5, 1962: AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES FOR THE CITY ATTORNEY, CITY CLERK AND TREASURER, CITY ASSESSOR, CITY ENGINEER, CHIEF MAINTENANCE MAN, CHIEF OF POLICE AND CITY PATROLMEN, AND AMENDING EXISTING SALARY ORDINANCES TO CONFORM TO THE SALARIES AS ESTABLISHED IN THIS ORDINANCE. Following the reading of Ordinance No. 5 a motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. McClung that the following persons be employed in the designated capacities as paid employees of the City of Park Hills. City Clerk and Treasurer, Russell Clark;

City Attorney, Francis Burke; City Engineer, John Morlidge Jr., City Assessor, Helen C. Ayres; Chief of Police, Ben Schaefer; Full Time patrolmen, W. E Buchanan and Frank Smith; Part time patrolmen, Gerhard Warther and James Rich; Chief Maintenance man John Vocke; Laborer, public works Dept., August Schwartz. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

A motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Hellman that Mr. Frank Dreyer be reappointed Chief of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

Mayor Schuler then announced the following appointments of council members to the farious departments within the City. Public Works Department, Mr. Dan Schadler; Police Department, Mr. Beach McClung; Fire Department, Mr. Paul Hellman; Finance Department, Mr. Richard Tabeling and Mr. Joseph Gormley. Mayor Schuler announced that Councilman Smith's appointment would be made at a later date.

A motion was made by Mr. Schadler and seconded by Mr. Gormley that Councilman Richard Tabeling be selected as Vice-Mayor of the City of Park Hills to preside in the absence of Mayor Schuler. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

The city attorney then read Resolution No. 1, 1962: A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE UNINCORPORATED TERRITORY KNOWN AS FORT PERRY FOR FIRE PROTECTION FOR A ONE (1) YEAR PERIOD. Mr. Hellman made a motion, seconded by Mr. Tabeling, that Resolution No. 1, 1962 be adopted as read. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

The City Attorney then read Resolution No. 2, 1962: A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY, AUTHORIZING COUNCILMAN RICHARD TABELING TO SIGN CHECKS TOGETHER WITH THE CITY TREASURER ON THE BANK ACCOUNTS OF THE CITY. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

Mr. Schuler then announced the appointment of members to the Park Hills Planning and Zoning Commission for a term ending December 31, 1963. Councilmanic member--Mr. Paul Hellman; Administrative member, City Clerk Russell Clark; Mayor Schuler serving as a member of the Commission by virtue of his office as Mayor of the City of Park Hills.

The regular order of business was then resumed. In response to letters written to the following persons, owners of real estate on Hamilton Rd. adjacent to the Luteran Church, the following persons appeared before Council to discuss with council a solution of the water trouble which exists from time to time in the basement of these properties, Messrs. Walter Moellering, and Green, Mrs. Schwede

the third owner, was unable to appear. This discussion continued from previous meeting involved an attempt to relieve the owners of the property in question from frequent damage due to the backing up of sewers into the basements of said apartments during periods of heavy rainfall. Mr. Burke, City Attorney, again outlined the lack of legal responsibility on the part of the City of Park Hills in this matter. The discussion revolved about the point of mutual participation by the owners of the property and the City of Park Hills in the cost of a project designed to prevent reoccurrence of this flood. Under the discussion two owners present were at this time unwilling to state the extent to which they would participate financially in the solution of this problem. One of the points brought up involved the fact that the owners felt that they should not bear alone the residents' portion of this cost but felt that such persons whose property was involved in the water shed which contributed to the excess flow should also participate. Mr. Schadler told Council that the plan as devised by City Engineer Morlidge would entail an outlay of approximately \$5500.00. Members of the council were at this time unable to agree on (a) the City's participation in the plan or (b) if the city did participate, what portion of the cost should be borne by the City and by the affected residents. Unable to reach any definite decision in the light of this inability to prorate the cost or determine the city's participation, the matter was reffered to a later meeting.

Old Business

- In response to advertisements, as per city ordinance, the clerk then read the following bids for the purchase of fire hose, being 300 feet of $l\frac{1}{2}$ inch fire hose as per advertised specification. Bid #1--Fyr Fyter Sales and Service--300 feet best quality Super Fyr-Flex XL 600 lb. test, \$1.43 per foot. Bid #2--The Sutphen Co.--Buckeye grade, \$1.55 per foot; Arrow grade, \$1.50 per foot; Atlas grade, \$5.35 per foot; Kent grade \$1.25 per foot. Bid #3--The American LaFrance Co.--1.30 per foot. Bid #4--The Fire Equipment Co.--Eureka Fire hose, Multex brand \$1.40 per foot; Superior #4 brand, \$1.25 per foot; Eureka brand, \$1.21 per foot; Warren brand, \$1.19 per foot. Following the reading of the bids, those bidders having representatives present were permitted to address council in behalf of their bid. piscussion followed; the bids were referred immediately to Mr. Hellman, Fire Commissioner, and Mr. Dreyer, Fire Chief, for consideration and tabulation. Following this action Mr. Hellman returned to council table and made a motion which was seconded by Mr. Schadler that the bid of the Fyr Fyter Sales and Service Co., for the purchase of 300 feet of $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch fire hose as per specifications at a unit cost of \$1.45 per foot be accepted. The total cost being \$429.00, subject to no discount. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.
- 2. Golf Manor Subdivision. The city clerk in his capacity as building inspector reported to Council that there had as yet been no attempt made to extend the water mains or install fire hydrants to Section 2 of the Golf Manor Subdivision.

- 3. Civilian Defense. Mayor Schuler stated that Mr. Baily Root Executive Director of the Kenton-Campbell Civilian Defense Unit was unable to accept the invitation given by the Park Hills City Council to appear at this meeting to discuss the value of Civilian Defense and the City of Park Hills' financial participation therein.
- 4. Park Beautification. In view of the fact that an attempt to relieve the water situation on Hamilton Rd. would involve this area the matter of the beautification of the Park on Hamilton Rd. was postponed.
- 5. Fallout shelters. The clerk in response to Mr. Schadler's request had secured for council's consideration two items involving construction of fallout shelters. The first of these being the procedure followed by the City of Cincinnati in approving the structural construction of said shelters, and secondly, a wealth of information from the Civilian Defense Organization, Washington D. C., which provided approved plans for the constructions of such shelters. Mr. Schadler said that he had not had time to digest this material and asked that it be delayed until further notice. Upon question directed to the city attorney by Mr. Schadler, Mr. Burke, the city attorney, gave the opinion that under the building code and the planning and zoning ordinance the City of Park Hills had the right to determine that no such structures may be built without the issuance of a building permit by the City of Park Hills and that said structures, when built, must meet such specifications as might be laid down by the city council of the City of Park Hills.

Committee reports. Public Works Dept.

1. Mr. Schadler reported routine repairs and maintenance and discussed the matter of the safety of the streets during periods of heavy snowfall.

Police Dept.

- 1. Mr. McClung presented the monthly report for December 1961 and the annual report for the year 1961 of the Park Hills Police Dept. which was received and filed.
- 2. Judge Grayson submitted \$246.00 in police court fines.

Fire Dept.

1. Mr. Hellman submitted the monthly report for December 1961, and the annual report for 1961 of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. which was received and filed.

Finance Dept.

1. The clerk-treasurer submitted the report of the general fund for December 1961 which was received and filed.

Building Permits

1. The clerk announced that during the month of December no building permits had been issued.

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THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION WITH MAYOR SCHULER PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN GORMLEY, HELLMAN, MCCLUNG, SCHADLER, SMITH, AND TABELING PRESENT, ON FEBRUARY 12, 1962 AT 8:00 PM.

The minutes of the January 8 1962 meeting were approved as read by the clerk. The regular order of business was suspended to permit the appearance of the delegation from Hamilton Road in reference to the surface water and sewage difficulty in the apartments adjacent to the Zion Lutheran Church. Mr. Walter Moellering appeared as spokesman for this group. Mr. Schadler, Public Works Commissioner, told the delegation that certain investigations had been carried on which might lead to a change in the plans as originally scheduled in the matter of relief for the protestants in this matter. He told the delegation that certain work would be done the next day to determine the necessity of carrying into operation the major proposed plan. The residents would be informed of the success or failure of these preliminary steps.

Mr. Bailey Root, Executive Director of the Kenton County Civilian Defense Organization spoke before councib outlining the benefits to be derived by the City of Park Hills by its active participation as a paying member of this organization. He discussed the possible results of the discharge of an atomic bomb in the area as well as the proposed plan under federal auspices to develop mass shelters within residential areas. He asked that the City of Park Hills become a member and discuss the annual membership dues levied for such membership under a per capita arrangement. After Mr. Root's departure, the City Council discussed the advisability of participating as a paying member in this organization. It was the unanimous opinion of the council that the City of Park Hills does not at this time seek membership within the framework of the organization. The City Clerk was directed to so notify Mr. Root.

Committee reports:

Public Works

1. Mr. Schadler reported routine maintenance of streets, sewers, and city building, pointing out that much time had been spent in clearing the streets due to heavy snowfall.

Police Dept.

- 1. Mr. McClung presented the report for January 1962 of the Park Hills Police Dept. which was received and filed.
- 2. Judge Grayson submitted \$88.00 in police court fines.

Fire Dept.

1. Mr. Hellman presented the monthly report for January 1962 of the Park Hills Fire Dept. which was received and filed.

Finance Dept.

1. The clerk presented the monthly report for January 1962 of the General Fund of the City of Park Hills, which was received and filed.

- 2. The clerk pointed out the necessity of reducing expenditures for the balance of the fiscal year due to the condition of the treasury.
- 3. Following discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Schadler and seconded by Mr. Gormley that the Mayor and the Clerk-Treasurer be authorized to withdraw from the reserve account of the City of Park Hills at the Acme Federal Savings and Loan Assn. such sum of money as was necessary to augment the funds in the general fund in order that current expenses might be paid until the close of the fiscal year. Mr. Schadleraye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; Mr. McClung aye; and the motion carried.
- 4. Mayor Schuler announced that the finance committee and the mayor would meet with the City Clerk Treasurer to review the proposed budget for the fiscal year beginning April 1, 1962 in order that such budget might be presented to the City Council for enactment at its March meeting.

Old Business

- Golf Manor Subdivision water mains and hydrants -- Mr. Hellman and the City Clerk reported that the ditches were now being dug for the installation of the water mains and that the location of the fire hydrants had again been specified to the contractor. In the matter of the ereation of fall out shelters the City Attorney gave the opinion that under its building code and its Planning and Zoning Ordinance the City has the right to control the ereation of all such structures and to insist upon the securing of a building permit before such structures be permitted. The matter of the payment by the City for certain equipment installed on the rescue and salvage truck was again a subject of discussion. At the previous meeting these bills had been referred to Mr. Hellman for investagation since it appeared at the time that the expenditure of these sums exceeded the amount set forth by Council for the completion and equipment of said truck. were two in number, one for \$99.91 for an electronic siren, the other \$61.80 for a beacon light. A motion was made by Mr. Hellman and seconded by Mr. Tabeling that the above bills be paid and charged against the budget of the fiscal year 1961-62 of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. Discussion followed, and the vote being taken showed the following: Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Schadler No, and the motion carried by a vote of 5 to 1.
- 4. The Clerk then read the bid of Mrs. Alvina Hiltz to provide continuous fire phone servace for the benefit of the park Hills Fire Dept. for a two year period beginning April 1, 1962. This, in response to the Ordinance passed by the City Council of the City of Park Hills at a previous meeting. The clerk announced that Mrs. Hiltz's bid was the only one received. Her bid was in the amount of \$600.00 per annum payable at the rate of \$50.00 per month. A motion was made by Mr. Hellman and seconded by Mr. McClung that the bid of Alvina Hiltz as specified above be accepted. Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

New Business The City Attorney read Ordinance No. 6, 1952: AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ADVERTISING AND RECEIPT OF BIDS FOR THE PURCHASE OF AN AUTOMOBILE TO-BE USED BY THE POLICE DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY. A motion was made by Mr. Tabeling and seconded by Mr. Hellman that Ordinance No. 6, 1962 be adopted as read. Under discussion, it was pointed out that at the January meeting council had enacted an ordinance advertising for bids for the leasing of an automobile to be used as a police cruiser. Members of Council, speaking on the motion, indicated that since both bids, one for the leasing of an automobile, and the other for the purchase of an automobile to be used as a police cruiser, would be considered at the same time, council was thus in a position to determine which course was the better for the City. The vote being called showed Mr. Tabeling aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Schadler No, Mr. Smith aye; and the vote carried five to one.

2. The city Attorney then read Ordinance No. 7, 1962; AN ORDIN-ANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LEETING AT PUBLIC SALE OF A CONTRACT FOR THE COLLECTION AND DISPOSITION OF GARBAGE, ASHES, CINDERS, AND OTHER REFUSE IN THE CITY OF PARK HILLS. A motion was made by Mr. Hellman and seconded by Mr. Tabeling that Ordinance No. 7, 1962 be adopted as read. Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Smith aye; and the motion carried.

3. Mayor Schuler then announced the appointment of the Park Hills Board of Equalization whose duty it is to hear complaints and review assessments of property subject to municipal taxation. The Board, appointed for a two yearperiod, as named by Mayor Schuler is: Mr. George Wiechorster, Mr. William Schaeffler, and Mr. Joseph Niehaus.

4. Mayor Schuler brought up the question of what effect might result in the proposed plan whereby the Kenton Co. Water Commission would purchase a portion of its water supply from the City of Covington. In response to Mayor Schuler the City Clerk produced the contract between the City of Park Hills and the Kenton Co. Water Commission specified the rates to be charged and the duration of the contract, said contract expiring in March 1975. The clerk pointed out that under provision of the contract it. appeared that the City of Park Hills was amply protected. Area Planning Committee -- Mayor Schuler stated that in company with Mr. Hellman the councilmember of the Park Hills Planning and Zoning Commission and City Clerk Clark the administrative member of the planning and Zoning Commission a visit was made to a quarterly meeting of the Kenton-Campbell Counties Area Planning Commission, whose membership is made up of a number but not all the municipalities within the two counties. Mr. Schuler stated that in view of Park Hills having its own Planning and Zoning Ordinance the nature of the terrain of the City of Park Hills and the fact that little undeveloped territory remained within said City, it appeared that membership by the City of Park Hills in the area planning committee was of little value to this city. This opinion was concurred in by Mr. Hellman and Mr. Clark and the council expressed its appreciation to the committee from Park Hills for its visit to the meeting of the area commission and expressed approval of the views set forth by Messrs. Schuler, Hellman and Clark.

6. Mr. Schadler asked that the City Attorney prepare an ordinance for presentation at the March meeting of council advertising for bids for major street repair. Said Ordinance to follow the pattern as that enacted by Council in 1961. Council concurred and Mr. Schadler's request that the City Attorney prepare said Ordinance was granted.

7. Mr. Smith requested that in response to requests made by various residents of Park Hills the City consider the installation or marking of a crosswalk at Terrace Dr. & Amsterdam Rd. Discussion followed and the matter was referred to the Safety Committee for further consideration and recommendation.

Building Permits

The Clerk announced that during January, one building permit had been issued for remodeling purposes.

Communications

The clerk read the following communications:
A. From the City Jailer of the City of Bovington announcing the increase of the per diem cost for prisoners lodged in the Covington jail from \$1.00 to \$1.50.

B. A communication from the Ky. State Highway Dept which announced the replacement of traffic lights and control boxes now in use by the city of Park Hills with standardized equipment.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION ON MONDAY, MARCH 12, 1962, AT 8:00 P.M. IN THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING WITH MAYOR SCHULER PRESIDING, AND COUNCILMEN GORMLEY, HELLMAN, MCCLUNG, SMITH, AND TABELING PRESENT. MR. SCHADLER WAS ABSENT DUE TO HIS ABSENCE FROM THE CITY.

The minutes of the February 12, 1962 meeting were approved as read by the clerk. Delegations and pettions: Mr. Burris, a resident of Old State Road at Harriett, appeared before council to request some improvement of Harriett St., this street being an accepted but unimproved street. Queried as to if he wished the street improved by paving, Mr. Burris was unable to say at this time since he had not consulted the other owners of property on Harriett St. The city agreed to make temporary repairs and the matter was referred to the PublicWorks Dept.

Committee reports: Public works dept.
In the absence of Commissioner Schadler no report was given.

Police Dept.

- 1. Mr. McClung presented the monthly report for February 1962 which was received and filed.
- 2. Judge Grayson submitted \$393.00 in police court fines.

Fire Dept.

- 1. Mr. Hellman presented the monthly report for February 1962 which was received and filed.
- 2. Mr. Hellman was questioned by several council members on the legality and/or advisability of the city fire department engaging in the fighting of fires in unincorporated areas not covered by contractual arrangements with the City of Park Hills, and/or not covered by any department which is connected with the Northerm Ky. Volunteer Fireman's Assn. and thus protected under the moveup system. This question was brought up specifically since the Park Hills Fire Dept. had answered a call at the Teddy Bear Lounge which seemed not to fit into any of the categories above described.

Finance Dept.

1. The clerk presented the report for the general fund for the month of February 1962, which was received and filed.

Old Business

- l. The clerk announced in the Golf Manor Subdivision matter, that the fire hydrants and water mains had been installed according to specifications presented by the city and its fire department and that this matter was now closed.
- 2. The Hamilton Rd. Sewer project--Mr. John Morlidge, City Engineer reporting in the absence of Mr. Schadler, reported that the main 12 inch sewer along Hamilton Rd. in front of the apartment buildings adjacent to the Zion Church had been cleaned through the cooperative efforts of our Public Works Dept. and the Jay Harriss Company, and that broken sewer pipe in same had been replaced. Since this had been done, there had been no history of flooding of the basements in the apartments along Hamilton Rd.

- 3. Garbage collection -- The clerk announced that in response to the ordinance two bids had been received for the collection of garbage within Park Hills. The bids were read by the clerk--Bid No. 1, C. L. Hopkins, a total \$10,800.00 per annum payable at the rate of \$900.00 per month. Bid No. 2, Frank Barth, \$11,205.00 per annum, payable at the rate of \$933.75 per month. Discussion by members of council followed the reading of bids, and a motion was made by Mr. McClung and seconded by Mr. Gormley that the bid of \$11,205.00 made by Frank Barth be accepted. Mr. McClung said that he felt that Mr. Barthslong and satisfactory service must be considered by the city in the awarding of the contract. Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried. Receipt of bids for leasing of police cruiser -- The clerk announced that in accordance with the ordinance he had advertised for bids for the leasing of an automobibe to be used as police cruiser. In addition he had mailed approximately 15 invitations to bids to leasing firms within the area. clerk further stated that in spite of these efforts, no bids had been received by the city for the leasing of an automobile to be used as a police cruiser.
- purchase of an automobile to be used as a police cruiser--The clerk announced that in response to the ordinance advertising for bids for purchase of an automobile to be used as a police cruiser, he had received four bids. Bid No. 1, Newport Sales, \$2334.42, Bid No. 2, Wellen Ford, Bour alternate bids ranging from \$2733.63 for a six passenger ranch wagon to \$2822.37 for a nine passenger station wagon. Bid No. 3, The Lou Bauer Co., \$2507.43 for a six passenger station wagon, Bid No. 4, Joseph A. Kuchle Co., \$2502.93 for a Ford Station The clerk pointed out that none of the bids took into consideration the 3% Ky. State Usage Tax which is levied against automobile purchasers. Following reading of these bids the council discussed at length the matter of a choice between leasing and the purchase of a cruiser and decided to defer any further consideration until March 19 at a meeting adjourned from the present meeting.

6. Civilian Defense--The clerk read to council two letters grom Mr. Bailey Root, Director of the local Civilian Defense Council again urging participation by the City of Park Hills in the Kenton-Campbell Defense Unit. Following the reading of the letters the matter was referred to Mayor Schuler who would contact Mr. Root before any action would be taken by Council.

7. In the matter of the establishment of a crosswalk at Terrace and Amsterdam Rds. Mr. McClung stated that Chief Schaefer had for several days made an accurate survey of a number of persons lighting from buses at this spot between the hours of 4 and 6 P. M. Chief Schaefer reported that only very few persons used the area in which it had been proposed that a crosswalk be established. In view of these facts, council was of the opinion that the establishment of a crosswalk for pedestrians was not at this time practicable.

New Business

L. The City attorney read Ordinance No. 8, 1962: AN ORDINANCE PROFIDING FOR THE LETTING OF PUBLIC BIDS AND CONTRACTS FOR THE REPAIR OF SECTIONS OF STREETS IN THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY. 2. The Board of Equalization report. The clerk reported to council that the Board of Equalization had met as specified by law and had reported to the clerk-treasurer that during its three days of session it had received no complaints and had made no changes in the assessed valuation of real estate or personal property as submitted to it

by the City Assessor.

3. Mr. Hellman told Council that the pump on the International Fire truck had broken while in use and that it had been necessary that the truck be driven to Battle Creek Michigan for the necessary repairs. He described for Council several possible or probable reasons for the break in the housing of the pump; as of this time he had received no official opinion from the American Fire Apparatus Co., from whom the truck had been purchased, as to the cause of the break or as to the liability in the matter of cost of repairs by said Fire Apparatus Co. or the City of Park Hills.

Building permits

1. The clerk reported that during the month of February no building permits had been issued.

Budget for fiscal year 1962-63.

1. The clerk presented to council the annual budget for the fiscal year 1962-63 beginning April 1, 1962, and ending March 31, 1963. This budget had been prepared by the clerk-treasurer after consultations and meetings with the members of the finance committee. Much discussion followed, centering largely around the efforts of council members to include raises in pay for members of police dept. and the public works dept. Following lengthy discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Tabeling and seconded by Mr. Gormley that the budget ad submitted by the clerk-treasurer and approved by the finance committee of the City of Park Hills be accepted subject to the following amendment; that the sum of \$205.00 be added to the proposed expenditure in the public works dept. representing the added cost for garbage collection during said fiscal year. THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION ON MAY 14, 1962, WITH MAYOR SCHULER PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN GORMLEY HELLMAN, MCCLUNG, SMITH, SCHADLER AND TABELING PRESENT.

Following the reading of the minutes of April 9, which were approved as read, the council observed a moment of silence in memory of the late Mrs. Grayson, deceased wife of Park Hills' Police Judge, Raymond G. Grayson.

Committee reports:

Public Works: 1. Mr. Schadler reported routine repairs and then requested that the City Attorney prepare an ordinance advertising for bids for the purchase of a new power lawn mower, of the riding type to replace the present mower of the city. Mr. Schadler then read a list of the streets which were to receive major repair under the street improvement program for 1962 as follows: Aberdeen: From Arlington to Old State, Old State: From S. line of house @#1140 to New B/C North of Alhambra Court, Old State: From S. line of new B?C @ 1207 to N. Side of intersection of Terrace, Old State: S. property line @ #1336 -New B/C to Manhole @ #1323, Morgan Court: Circol at lower end, Morgan Court: From circle to B/C patch @ Adams, #1160, Audubon Road From Water Meter @ W. edge Giltner@ #1219 to high side of driveway approach @ #1206, Hamilton: From crossover to Amsterdam Road @ bus stop (uphill side) to good paving. N. Arlington: Fown hill side of #833 to B/C overlay, N. Arlington: From property line between #814 & 818 to center line of driveway at #807. Mr. Schadler then told council the cost of this work would be \$7128.32. The clerk-treasurer called the attention of council to the fact that this sum exceeded the amount set forth in the budget, which had been \$6500.00, and therefore requested that council take separate action in approving the work as outlined. Mr. Schadler moved, seconded by Mr. McClung, that the work as above outlined at the price stated be approved by the council. Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Tabeling No; and the motion carried by a vote of 5 to 1. Mr. Tabeling explained his vote by saying that he felt this department should live within the budget as set forth and approved by action of the city council. Mr. Schadler then told council that after careful examination of the city lines in front of the apartments on Hamilton Rd. he was of the firm opinion that any flooding of the basements of these residences was in no manner caused by or the responsibility of the City of Park Hills, since the lines in question had been observed to be ample to carry off water flow.

Police Dept.

- l. Mr. McClung presented the report for the Police Department for the month of April 1962, which was received and filed.
- 2. Judge Grayson submitted \$301.00 in Police Court fines.
- 3. The clerk read a letter from Judge Grayson in which he complimented the Chief of Police for his excellent work in aiding in the conduct of the Police Court.

- 4. Mr. McClung inquired of the City attorney the obligation and the right of the Police Dept. in policing "Dickman's Lake Territory," which had been sold by the Dickman estate to the Commonwealth of Kentucky. The City Attorney told Mr. McClung that the change of ownership in no manner reduced the right or obligation of the city to police this area and that the jurisdiction of the city therein continued.
- 5. Mr. McClung announced that the newly leased police creuser had been turned over to the police department and the following equipment would be put into service.

Fire Dept.

- l. Mr. Hellman presented the monthly report of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Department for the month of April which was received and filed.
- 2. Mr. Hellman announced that there would be an open house at the Fire Department following the Park Hills Memorial Day Parade.
 3. Council discussed the matter of the purchase of two tires and tubes for the salvage truck of the Fire Dept. The city clerk was empowered to secure prices and buy same at the best possible price if under the \$100 statutory limitation.

Petitions and Delegations:

At this time Mr. Tom Cardosi appeared before council asking permission of council to establish a roadway nine feet wide from Arlington Rd. along the unimproved Coram St. to a point within 90 feet of Harriett St. Following discussion council informed Mr. Cardosi that if any street were built it must follow the pattern set forth by the construction of the present Coram St. from Alhambra to Harriett, and must be a minimum of 16 feet in width connecting with the present Coram St. paving and extending to Arlington Rd. Said road to meet specifications laid down by the City of Park Hills and subject to the approval of the City Engineer, the developers to pay the entire cost of construction as well as the City Engineer's fee for supervision.

Old Business:

- l. The matter of the park improvement was again introduced by the City clerk. This matter was again laid over pending the completion of the road built by the state of Kentucky from the new Northern Ky. Vocational School to the new Amsterdam Rd.
- 2. The city attorney gave an opinion that in the matter of the construction of fall out shelters these must meet the requirements of the city planning and zoning code and the city building code and that no other ordinance for their control was necessary.

New Business:

l. Mayor Schuler reported that a few days before this meeting a meeting had been held at the City Building with a number of residents of Mt. Messrs. Smith and Clark were given full authority to act without further consultation.

 2. Mr. Schadler stated that he had inspected the major street resurfacing program, had found the work satisfactory and asked that the City Clerk be directed to pay the bill when money is available.

In the matter of the septic tank condition existent on Cecelia Avenue, Mayor Schuler reported that Mr. Baute had called him and indicated that an examination made by a plumber had indicated no fault in Mr. Baute's septic tank. This action on the part of Mr. Baute having been brought about by complaints reveived by council and which had resulted in the clerk being directed to write Mr. Baute informing him of the nature of the complaints.
- 2. In the matter of Park Hills becoming a fourth class city, City Attorney Burke outlined the differences existent between a fourth and fifth class city, but indicated that any action on the part of Park Hills to seek fourth class status would have to be delayed until the next session of the legislature two years hence.
- 3. City Engineer Morlidge reported that the developers of the Coram Street area had not further contacted him relative to its improvement.
- 4. City Attorney Burke said that in the matter of the complaint made by certain residents of St. James Ave. against the Old Mill Service Station in the discharge of waste materials from said station that he had written Mr. Boylson, the owner and indicated the probable cost of this improvement but had not heard further.

New Rusiness

- l. Mayor Schuler on behalf of the Fassler Brothers invited members of the Park Hills official family to the ribbon cutting ceremony which would mark the opening of Fassler's new Gift and Florist Shop in Schuler's Shopping Center on the Dixie Highway.
- 2. Mayor Schuler announced that there would be another meeting held October 18 at which time members of the City Councils of Park Hills and Lookout Heights would further discuss the matter of a merger of the two cities.
- Mr. Schadler introduced before council the question of the necessity to secure additional revenue for the operation of the city in the fiscal year 1963-64. He indicated to council that the matter had been the subject of discussion on several occasions and that he felt additional funds were necessary to properly operate the city in the next fiscal year. He indicated that the finance committee had discussed the matter and that it appeared that the principal source of revenue would have to come from an increase in the tax valuation of the city of Park Hills. Upon request by Mr. Schadler Mr. Burke gave the legal opinion as to the manner in which said increase in assessments could be done. Mr. Hellman read a prepared statement in which he opposed any increase at this time and stated that the city should make an attempt to operate within its budget without additional sources of revenue. It was Mr. Schadler's contention that the increase in revenue was necessary because of the increased costs of operating the city, the necessity for additional funds to repair major sewer trouble and the desire to give increases in wages to the full time city employees. Mr. Schadler stated that there had been no increase in assessments in Park Hills for a number of years. Upon inquiry by members of council, the city clerktreasurer stated that the finance committee consisting of Messrs. Tabeling and Gormley had reviewed the possible sources of additional revenue, but had make no recommendation as to which one should be pursued. These had included an increase in the liquor license fee, increase in occupational license fees, increase in automobile sticker fees, and the imposition of a gross sales tax and wage tax upon operators of business and wage earners working within the City of Park Hills. No other sources were deemed to have a broad enough base to justify any consideration.

Mr. Tabeling stated that at this time he was opposed to any tax increase and suggested that the City delay any action pending the retirement of the city building bonds and the final payment on the recently purchased fire truck. He pointed out that after 1963-64 the city would have the additional income of money now being used to pay off the fire truck and then in four years the City building bond would be paid off, and if an increase in the assessment was made at that time, when the extra levy for the retirement of the bonds was no longer collected, that an increase in the assessment would probably result in no actual increase in the amount of money being paid by each real estate owner.

Mr. Mcclung told council that he felt that under any circumstances that the City of Park Hills should make an attempt to grant wage increases to members of the Police and Public Works Departments.

He felt that the wages paid members of these departments were not in keeping with the cost of living for the services which they rendered.

Mr. Smith and Mr. Gormley participated in the discussion. Mayor Schuler stated that at this time he preferred that no increased assessment be made for the next fiscal year, stating that the money might be raised through the merger of Lookout Heights and Park Hills.

Following this lengthy discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Schadler and seconded by Mr. McClung that the council direct the city assessor to make a blanket increase of 10% in the assessed valuation of all real and personal property within the City of Park Hills. Mæ. Schadler aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Gormley No; Mr. Hellman No; Mr. Smith No; Mr. Tabeling No; and the motion was defeated by a vote of four to two.

4. Mr. Schadler asked to be relieved of duties as chairman of the Public Works Dept. gince this was an appointment by the Mayor, no action was taken by the City Council.

The clerk then read a series of bills payable out of the general fund.

Public Works: Mayor Schuler reporting

Police:

1. Mr. McClung read the report of the Park Hills Police Dept. for the month of Oct. which was received and filed.

2. Mr. McClung ask that Council give consideration to the drawing up of an ordinance regulating the sale of guns and other fire arms within the City-of Park Hills. Chief. Schaefer explained to Council the reason for the necessity of such ordinance and presented a copy of the Newport, Ky. ordinance regulating gunx sales as an example of such law. The City Attorney for directed to prepare such an ordinance for the December meeting of Council

Fire Dept:

1. Mr. Tellman read the report of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. for the month of Oct. which was received abd filed.

Finance Dept:

1. The Clerk presented the monthly report for Oct. of the General Fund which was received and fuled.

Old Business:

1. On the matter of the Old Mill drainage problem the City Attorney told Council he had no reply from the owner of the property after his last letter to same.

2. Cora, Street Development- City Engineer Morlidge presented the plat for street improvement of Coram Street from Harriett to Arlington. Sewer and water lines were tobe installed as platted here and the installation of fire hydrant as to type and location had been approved by Chief Dreyer of the Park Hills Fire Dept. Mr. Cardosi, one of the developers, was present and sought a change from previous decision of Council as to the installation of street as an necessary adjunct to the development of the area. Mr. ardosi felt that the street might be delayed as he could get into the first building now under construction without the building of a street. The matter was discussed by Council who were prone to stand by the original agreement made that street must be built accrding to specifications. The Clerk was directed to research this matter farther and report back at the meeting of Council.

3. Park Development- Mr. Smith told Council that this event would take place in spring as the general idea for plan had been completed.

4. Report on meeting with officials of Lookout Heights Re: merger discussion. Nothing definite decided, little progress made as only two members of the Lookout Council were present while two members of the Park Hills Council were absent

5. The expenditure of \$827,68 for the majorv sewer repair back of the Park Drive discussed and the money to come out of General Fund.

New Business:
The Clerk read a letter from Kenton Heights Womens Club asking permission to use City Building one night each month as a meeting place. Council cincurred in the request and directed the clerk to so inform the group.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET INA SPECIAL SESSION ON MONDAY, DECEMBER 12, 1962, AS A MEETING HELD UNDER THE STATE LAW OF KENTUCKY AND HELD BY A CALL OF A MAJORITY OF MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL, AND RELAYED TO ALL MEMBERS AND THE MAYOR THROUGH THE OFFICES OF THE CITY CLERK. THOSE PRESENT WERE COUNCILMEN GORMLEY, HELLMAN, MCCLUNG, SMITH, SCHADLER, AND TABELING. ABSENT DUE TO HIS EMPLOYMENT WAS MAYOR SCHULER.

A motion was made by Mr. Schadler and seconded by Mr. Smith that Mr. Joseph Gormley, a member of council, act as Chairman of the meeting in the absence of Mayor Schuler and the tardy arrival of Vice-Mayor Tabeling. Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Hellman pass; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. McClung aye; and the motion carried with four aye votes.

The members of council present were informed by the City Attorney, Mr. Frank Burke, that action at this meeting could be of a discussion nature only and was limited to discussion of those items for which the meeting had been called. The clerk announced that the three items on the agenda in which any action would be limited to discussion only included 1. the matter of sewer installation, street paving, water installation on the newly developed subdivision line between Harriett Street and Arlington Road along the proposed Coram Street improvement. 2. a discussion of the possibility of securing a federal grant for the installation of sanitary sewers along Scenic Avenue, Cecelia Avenue, and Exter Drive .3. a discussion of the possibility of increasing the automobile sticker license fee as a means of raising additional revenue for municipal purposes.

All information on these items was provided by the City Clerk who had been so directed to secure said information at the last regular meeting of the City Council held in November, 1962.

In the matter involving the opening of the Coram St. subdivision planned by Mr. Tom Cardosi, et al, the clerk presented the following item: (a) in the matter of permitting a partial installation of an improved street from Harriett to N. Arlington which had been requested by the subdivider the clerk quoted from the Planning and Zoning Ordinance adopted by the City Council of Park Hills in 1954 as follows: "the street shall be extended to the boundaries of the tract to be developed unless prevented by topography or other physical conditions where in the opinion of the commission such extension is not necessary or desirable for the coordination of the layout of the subdivision with adjoining subdivisions or tracts. From Section XII. Further, " the character and extent of the improvements and utilities to be constructed or installed in the proposed subdivision are as follows: (1) the street shall be graded full width, (2) the roadway shall be paved and permanent curbs installed in accordance with city specifications and approved by the City Engineer. From Section XIII. The council was of the opinion upheld by the City Attorney that this would eliminate the possibility of constructing houses along the

proposed developed Coram Street without first grading and paving

same.

2. In the matter of consideration of the increase in the auto sticker license fee the clerk presented the following items.

(1) a list of the cities in the Northern Ky. area which charge an auto sticker license fee and the amount each city charged, being as follows:

\$7.50 per year . Covington Newport 10.00 per year Ludlow 3.00 per year Ft. Thomas 5.00 per year Dayton 5.00 per year Bellevue 5.00 per year Bromley 3.00 per year 5.00 per year Elsmere

He stated that as of the date of inquiry in December of 1963 the following cities did not provide for an automobile license Erlanger, S. Ft. Mitchell, Ft. Wright, Highland Heights, Lookout Heights, and Ft. Mitchell. The clerk informed members of council that an increase in Park Hills' stickers fees from \$5.00 per year to \$7.50 per year would bring in additional revenue estimated at \$4000.00. further suggested that if council increased the auto license fee to any extent that as a means of granting relief that the personal property tax now charged by the City of Park Hills and levied against automobiles be materially reduced or eliminated. He pointed out that the City of Park Hills received from this source i.e., personal tax collected on automobiles, approximately \$2500.00. He indicated to council that doubling the present fee would bring in \$8000.00 additional and if the personal property tax were eliminated the city would have a net gain in revenue of approximately \$5500.00. The clerk presented figures in the matter of the collection of these taxes levied against automobiles as 105 bills were returned by the United States Post Office Department indicating that the individual so billed had left the City of Park Hills and that in the clerk's opinion it was a practical impossibility to collect these bills since all bills rendered by the city are for the current year. These 105 bills totalled \$295.80, or an average unpaid indebtedness of \$2.80 per person who had been billed and moved. Of the 105 bills 48 were for automobiles valued by the assessor at 100 dollars each. He further stated that the tax books of the City of Park Hills for the year 1962 indicated that 81 persons presumed still to be living within the confines of the City of Park Hills and therefore subject to the tax had not paid the bill as rendered by the City Clerk and Treasurer. These 81 bills totalled \$222.70, an average unpaid bill of \$2.73. It was further disclosed that of the 81 bills unpaid 44 were on automobiles having an evaluation by the assessor of \$100.00. He indicated that delinquent tax bills had been sent to all the above as well as to other delinquents who had paid same and that the cost of collection from the 81 delinquents did not justify any further action on the part of the City. As this was a special meeting the report of the clerk was received but no action taken by the council present in this matter.

The clerk informed council that in the matter of securing a federal grant for the installation of samitary sewer lines on Cecelia Ave., Scenic Ave., and Exter Dr., he had proceeded as directed by council to endeavor to secure information relative this matter. First, a letter had been addressed to Mr. Carl Wachs, Executive Secretary of Kentucky Municipal League asking for information. A reply from Mr. Wachs to the Clerk indicated that federal frunds in the form of grants or loans were available to cities for sewer installation through the community facilities division of the federal government with offices in Atlanta, Ga. and under the 1962 accelerated Public Works Act which is being administered by the Area Redevelopment Administration of the U. S. Department of Commerce. Thereupon, he had communicated with this division and in return had received an answer enclosing the necessary application blanks for the filing of a request for a grant from the federal government in the implementation of the proposed sewer project. The clerk then briefed the council upon what he deemed to be the most pertinent facts in determining if the City of Park Hills was eligible for such grants and the manner of application. These pertinent facts given were as follows: The City of Park Hills to be eligible for said grant must be in an area designated by the Secretary of Commercas having substantial unemployment in at least nine of the twelve months preceding the application, and in areas designated by the Secretary of Commerce as so-called redevelopement areas.

The Federal Government would grant 50% of the cost of such project under normal conditions and up to 75% if the municipality shows that it does not have financial capacities to assume all additional obligation necessary above the 50% grant.

The manner in which the federal funds would be paid.

Providing that all funds to be used in this project be deposited in a separate account.

- That any project to be eligible for the grant must contribute substantially to the reduction of unemployment within the area by providing that of the money spent 20% more must be spent on labor than is spent on materials.
- That all projects must be initiated within a reasonably short period of time and completed within a twelve month period.
- That the applicant cannot reduce the amount of money which it has spent in the previous year for public works improvement.
- Engineering and legal fees are payable out of the grant or loan. Wages paid on the project must be not less that the prevailing
- wage as determined by the Secretary of Labor, that is, in our case, not less than the union wage paid to all types of labor involved on the project.

That competitive bidding is necessary for the project.

That the applicant must provide competent supervision and inspection of the project construction, subject to supervision by the engineers and auditors of the Bureau through which the funds are provided.

The method of making application

The authorization of a person by the applicant to whom communications and requests for information can be directed. person must be an official or employee of the applicant.

14. That the applicant must provide an estimated cost of the project whether entirely financed by federal grant or otherwise. That preliminary expenses incurred which directly relate to the development of the project or its application may be included if and when the grant is allowed.

16. That all estimates should cover only contractural service cost and contingency.

17. If in the payment of the applicant's portion assessments are made or improvement bonds issued by the applicant that the applicant must attach to the application a description of the method of assessment i.e., front foot or other basis and of determination of benefits, the anticipated number of parties to be assessed, and the anticipated cost for annual maintenance and operation expenses.

The clerk was directed to secure from the regional body an answer to an inquiry if the entire portion of the applicant's cost could be raised by assessment against the property owners affected by the installation of the sanitary sewer line and to determine if the City of Park Hills met the first requirement of being in an area of substantial unemployment as required under the act.

Again, no official action was taken by council on any of these reports.

This having completed all items under the special agenda a motion to adjourn this special meeting was made by Mr. Schadler and seconded by Mr. Smith. Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; Mr. McClung aye; and the motion carried.
