

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION AT 8:00 P.M. ON MONDAY, JANUARY 14, 1963, WITH THE FOLLOWING COUNCILMEN PRESENT: GORMLEY, HELLMAN, MCCLUNG, SCHADLER, SMITH, AND TABELING. MAYOR SCHULER WAS ABSENT DUE TO EMPLOYMENT.

In the absence of Mayor Schuler, Vice Mayor Tabeling presided as chairman of the meeting. The clerk read the minutes of the December 10 meeting which had not been held for the lack of a quorum, and a special meeting of December 17, 1962. A motion was made by Mr. Smith and seconded by Mr. Schadler that the action of the clerk in indicating the lack of a meeting be noted as prepared by the clerk. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried. The minutes of the December 17 meeting were approved as read.

Delegations and petitions:

1. Mr. Tom Cardosi appeared before council relative to improvements in a subdivision along unimproved Coram Street. He asked council for permission to install the water main and sewers. Council reminded Mr. Cardosi that this permission had been previously granted subject to approval by Mr. Morlidge, the City Engineer. Mr. Morlidge stated that to date he had not received any plans or specifications regarding these installations and Mr. Cardosi was instructed to forward same to the City Engineer who would grant approval before installations could begin. Fire Chief Dreyer indicated that he had provided Mr. Cardosi with the necessary information relative to the installation of fire hydrants along the water main. Mr. Cardosi again introduced the matter of the street construction and told council that the major developer of the subdivision had for the time being deferred any action in developing the subdivision. In the discussion that followed it was pointed out by the clerk and members of council that on several occasions Mr. Cardosi and the other developers had been informed that the installation of a street laid according to city specifications, as previously outlined to said developers was necessary before any residence construction be started and that said street must extend from the present paving of Coram St. at Harriett along the proposed street to Arlington Rd. Mr. Cardosi said that since the plans for development had been deferred and that the subdividers had deferred the construction of the street, it would be impossible for him to follow the procedure set forth above in providing a street for his own residence which was being constructed. After lengthy discussion Mr. Cardosi was advised to contact the Park Hills Planning and Zoning Commission relative to this problem.

1. In the absence of Mayor Schuler, no report was received.

Police Dept.

1. Mr. McClung presented the monthly reports of the Park Hills Police Dept. for the months of November and December which were received and filed.
2. Mr. McClung presented the annual report for the year 1962 of the Police Dept. which was received and filed.

3. The City attorney then read Ordinance No. 3, 1963: AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE SALE AND PURCHASE OF PISTOLS, REVOLVERS AND RIFLE OR SIMILAR INSTRUMENTS, REGULATING THE LICENSING OF DEALERS, PROVIDING FOR BONDS, RECORD OF STOCK, QUALIFICATIONS OF PURCHASERS, INSPECTION OF RECORDS, ETC., PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS HEREOF, AND REPEALING ANY AND ALL SECTIONS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH. A motion was made by Mr. Schadler and seconded by Mr. Smith that Ordinance No. 3, 1963 as read be adopted. Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

4. The City Attorney read Ordinance No. 4, 1963: AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ADVERTISING AND RECEIPT OF BIDS FOR THE PURCHASE OF AN AUTOMOBILE TO BE USED BY THE POLICE DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY. A motion was made by Mr. Schadler and seconded by Mr. Gormley that in consideration of the passage of Ordinance No. 2, 1963, by City Council, which ordinance advertised for bids for leasing of a police cruiser, that this ordinance be tabled. Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

5. Chief of police Schaefer presented to council a certificate signed by a physician chosen by Police Commissioner McClung stating that in the physician's opinion Patrolman William Buchanan was sufficiently recovered from a heart disturbance as to safely resume his duties as Park Hills patrolman, from which he had been absent on sick leave. This certificate was put in charge of the Chief of Police.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET ON JANUARY 28, 1963 IN A SESSION ADJOURNED FROM JANUARY 28, 1963, WITH MAYOR SCHULER PRESIDING, AND COUNCILMEN GORMLEY, HELLMAN, MCCLUNG, SCHADLER, SMITH, AND TABELING PRESENT.

The purpose of this meeting was a discussion of the city financial affairs for the fiscal year 1963-64, beginning April 1, 1963. All members of council and the mayor spoke at length on the question at hand. It seemed apparent that with the rising cost of municipal government and the relatively fixed income of the city under its present tax structure that in order to provide a balanced budget for the fiscal year 1963-64 that it would be necessary to follow one of two courses. Reduce expenditures or increase revenues through new or additional taxation. There was a divergence of opinion among members which of these two to follow. The treasurer pointed out that it was most likely that the income of the city would not be increased for the next fiscal year. Among the items there being an apparent reduction in the amount received through police court fine revenues. He also pointed out that it was unlikely that there would be an appreciable amount of increase received through real estate taxes due to the few building permits which had been issued, since there existed few buildable sites within the City of Park Hills. He advised council that if it wished to retain the present tax structure that reduction in expenditure from the present fiscal year would be necessary. Mr. Schadler suggested that one way of increasing the revenue of the city would be to increase the auto sticker fee from \$5.00 to \$10.00 per year. He moved that the City Attorney be directed to prepare an ordinance which would be considered at the next regular meeting of council raising the auto sticker license from \$5.00 to \$10.00. The motion was seconded by Mr. McClung. Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman No; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Tabeling No; and the motion carried by a vote of four to two. Mr. Gormley and Mr. Smith both stated that they were in favor of preparation of the ordinance at this time but reserved the right to vote as they saw fit at the time of its presentation which would follow the presentation by the City Clerk Treasurer of the proposed budget for the year 1963-64. Mayor Schuler stated his opposition to the motion upon the basis that without the presentation of the budget the city's exact need for funds would be unknown.

The Council directed the clerk-treasurer to prepare the budget for presentation at the February 11, 1963 meeting.

Mayor Schuler announced to council that the plans for the proposed merger between Park Hills and the City of Lookout Heights which he had fostered had been dropped and that at this time he had no further interest in furthering said merger. He said that this action on his part was taken due to certain actions of the City of Lookout Heights which did not tend to implement such merger plans.

A large crowd was present at the council meeting. The minutes of the January 14, 1963 and January 28th 1963 meetings were approved as read by the clerk.

Police Dept.

1. Mr. McClung presented the monthly report for January of the Park Hills Police Dept. which was received and filed.

Fire Dept.

1. Mr. Hellmann presented the monthly report for the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. for January which was received and filed.

Finance Dept.

1. The Clerk-Treasurer presented the report for the general fund for the month of January 1963 which was received and filed.
2. The Clerk-Treasurer presented the budget for the fiscal year 1963-1964 as he had been directed by the city council. Each item in receipt and expenditures was carefully explained by the clerk and the entire council joined in a thorough discussion of the budget. Following the discussion a motion was made by Mr. Tabeling and seconded by Mr. Hellman that the budget as prepared by the Clerk-Treasurer for the fiscal year 1963-64 be adopted. Mr. Tabeling aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. McClung No; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Schadler No; and the budget was accepted by a vote of 4 to 2. Mr. Schadler explained his opposition was based on a reduction in the amount of money budgeted for major street repairs and that he felt that additional income should have been provided by council to meet the obligations of the city. Mr. McClung explained his negative vote based upon the fact that the increase granted to members of the police department was less than he had recommended and that he too felt that additional income should have been provided. The Clerk-Treasurer had pointed out that he had prepared the budget as instructed based upon no additional income and that therefore reductions in certain areas had to be made to stay within the budgetary figure of income.

Old Business

1. In the matter of the improvements on the Coram St. subdivision relative to the installation of an approved street, sewer and water lines, the Clerk told council that to date there had been no further information from Mr. Tom Cardosi who had petitioned council to permit him to install only a small portion of the Coram St. extension. He announced that in keeping with the wishes of council, which had referred the matter to the Park Hills Planning and Zoning Commission, that this commission was scheduled to meet with Mr. Cardosi on

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING ON MONDAY MARCH 11, 1963, WITH MAYOR SCHULER PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN GORMLEY, HELLMAN, MCCLUNG, SCHADLER, SMITH, AND TABELING PRESENT.

The minutes of the February 11, 1963 meeting were approved.
 Petitions and delegations: Mrs. Doris Telford, 1412 Amsterdam Rd., appeared before council relative to a break in the sewer line during the recent hard rain which had resulted in the flooding of her basement. Mayor Schuler assured Mrs. Telford that as soon as the weather was suitable this broken sewer line would be repaired, and that damage done to her driveway in the relaying of a new line would be repaired by the City. Mr. Morlidge, the City Engineer, informed council and Mrs. Telford that a survey would be made of all the sewer lines in this area and that action would be taken as a result of the survey. Mr. Morlidge further told council that stoppages in the sewer lines below 1412-1416 Amsterdam had been discovered and removed. Mr. Schultz of 1414 Amsterdam Rd. thanked the City and the Fire Department for their effort in preventing the flooding of his basement at the same time.

Mr. Ray Suetholtz, 1007 Jackson Rd., complained to council that recently water had begun to back up through the cesspool of his basement. The public works dept. was authorized to investigate and if possible to remedy the cause.

Mr. Byron Davidson, 1311 Amsterdam Rd., spoke to council about the dog situation and asked that the ordinance prohibiting dogs from roaming at large be enforced. The matter was discussed and City Attorney Burke was directed to investigate the efficiency of the present ordinance.

Fire Hose Bids: The clerk read a series of bids in response to advertisement for the purchase of fire hose by the City of Park Hills. Bid #1: The Eureka Fire Hose Co., 4 bids ranging from \$1.45 per ft. to \$1.85 per ft. for 2 1/2" line. Bid #2: The Sutphen Co. bids ranging from \$1.95 to \$2.65 per ft. Bid #3: The American La France Co., \$1.95 per ft. Bid #4: Fyr Fyter Sales, \$2.22 per ft. Representatives were given an opportunity to address council relative to the merits of their bids. Only one was present, being from the Fyr Fyter Sales and Service. Following reading of bids and discussion the bids were referred to councilman Hellman, Park Hills Fire Commissioner, and Fire Chief Frank Dreyer. When they reported they recommended that the bid of the Fyr Fyter Sales and Service for the purchase of the hose at \$2.22 per ft. be accepted. A motion was made by Mr. McClung and seconded by Mr. Gormley that the bid of the Fyr Fyter Sales and Service for the purchase of 300 feet of 2 1/2" fire hose at \$2.22 per ft. be accepted. Mr. McClung aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellman aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Schadler No; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried by a vote of five to one.

2. The clerk announced that he had then been informed by the Federal Bureau in charge of such affairs that Park Hills was not in an area eligible for federal funds for sewer construction.

3. The matter of the poor condition of Park Hills streets, result of the severe weather, was again discussed. Mr. Schadler pointed out that numerous bad holes existed in the Park Hills streets and pointed out that certain were in need of immediate repair, specifically identifying certain conditions existent on Audubon Rd. and Rosemont Ave. Mr. Schuler told council that the Public Works Dept. was proceeding as fast as possible to take care of the many situations on our streets resulting from the weather.

New Business

1. The City Clerk announced that the contract had been executed for a one year period for fire protection of the Ft. Perry Community by the City of Park Hills.

2. The clerk announced that the Park Hills Planning and Zoning Commission had been asked to hold a public hearing in which petitioner would request the following zone change: from Residence C to Highway Business Area that property lying along the Dixie Highway from South Arlington Rd. southward to St. Joseph Lane and being all of Block B of the Rosemont Subdivision and portion of the St. Joseph Subdivision adjacent to lot 8 of Block B of Rosemont Subdivision.

3. Mr. William Schaeffler, a member of the Park Hills Board of Equalization was present and reported to council that in the three day session held by this board that they had not received any complaints of assessed valuations within the city and had made no changes in the assessed value for tax purposes as submitted by the City Assessor for the fiscal year 1963-64.

4. A Mr. Herringer, a contractor, appeared before council to request permission of council in the matter of tapping into the St. James Ave. sanitary sewer sewage from the new Lookout House being built in Lookout Heights. Following discussion, of the matter, the City Council followed the advice of Mr. Morlidge the City Engineer that permission be refused since he was afraid that the capacity of the St. James Sewer was insufficient to carry such sewage as might be the result of this tap in.

5. Mr. Schadler introduced the matter of a written directive by Mayor Schuler that no expenses of the Public Works Dept. should be incurred without his specific permission. Following lengthy discussion of the purchase of items by the various departments without authorization by an administrative head a motion was made by Mr. Hellman and seconded by Mr. Gormley that no department purchase any single item in excess of \$100.00 without the specific authorization by the head of the department incurring said expense or by action of the clerk treasurer, and that purchases of more than \$100.00 should not be made by any one without first submitting the question to vote of City Council. Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. McClung abstaining; Mr. Schadler aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried by a vote of five ayes and one abstention.

Petitions and Delegations:

1. Upon request by a representative of the Vocational School adjacent to Park Hills a motion was made by Schadler and seconded by Tabeling that permission be granted to this school to erect in the traffic circle at the entrance to the school from New Amsterdam Road a lighted sign directing persons to the site of the school. Committee Reports:

Public Works. Mayor Schuler reporting :

1. Motion was made by Schadler and seconded by McClung that the City pay to have trees located at 1416 Amsterdam Road removed as same were endangering the sewer lines. Petitions and delegations:

1. Mr. Tom Cardosi appeared before council to request permission to install a private six inch sewer line from his residence being constructed on Coram St. along the undeveloped Coram St. to Arlington Rd. The City Engineer discussed the matter with council and motion was made by Mr. Hellman seconded by Mr. Tabeling that the request as stated be denied. Committee reports:

Public Works Dept.

1. The matter of the repair of the washout of New Amsterdam Rd. was introduced. Mr. Smith told council he had contacted the City Engineer of Covington who had agreed that this portion of the road was in the City of Covington and that they would assume responsibility for its repair.
