

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION AT THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING ON MONDAY, APRIL 13, 1964 WITH MAYOR SCHULER PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN FEIGHERY, GORMLEY, PRICE, SMITH AND TABELING PRESENT. COUNCILMEN HELLMAN ABSENT DUE TO EMPLOYMENT.

The minutes of the March 9, 1964 meeting were approved as read by the clerk.

#### Petitions and delegations:

Mrs. Bresser of St. Joseph Lane again appeared before Council relative to the water situation as a result of the construction of Notre Dame High School. Mayor Schuler informed Mrs. Bresser that in the company of the Park Hills City Engineer he was to meet with the school authorities on April 16 in an effort to work out a solution to this problem.

#### Committee Reports:

##### Publoc Works:

1. Mayor Schuler told Council that he was to meet with the State Highway Department relative to Amsterdam Road repair and maintenance and would report at the May meeting of Council
2. In the matter of the repair of Montague Road, Mr. Schuler advised Council that a program whereby the Cities of Park Hills and Covington with aid from the County was being proposed but that further information would be given in May.
3. City Attorney Burke presented the garbage contract for Mr. Barth signature.

##### Police Dept:

1. Mr. Feighery presented the monthly report for March of the Park Hills Police Dept. which was received and filed.
2. Mr. Feighery reported that the leasing of new police cruiser as done by Council, progress in preparation of cruiser by leasing Co.
3. The matter of paying the S.P.C.A. a sum of 25.00 a month for rounding up stray dogs was discussed and tabled to a later meeting.

##### Fire Dept:

1. In the absence of Mr. Hellman the Clerk presented the report of the Fire Dept. for the month of March which was received and filed.

##### Finance Dept:

1. The Clerk presented the report of the general fund for the month ending March 31. which was received and filed.
2. The Clerk presented the report for the fiscal year 1963-64 which ended March 31, 1964. A motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Feighery that the annual budget report as presented by the Clerk be accepted. 3. The Clerk next presented the annual budget for a fifteen month period beginning April 1, 1964 and ending June 30, 1965. 4. No report on the securing of plats needed for consideration of annexation of Meyerridge, Ft. Perry and adjacent territory
5. Mayor. Schuler announced that officially Park Hills would enter its 4th class status on June 18, 1964
6. Report on providing Fire and Police Protection to Lookout Heights- no report at this time.

1. The City Attorney was directed to prepare an ordinance calling for bids for major street repairs to be presented at next meeting.
2. Chief of Police Dreyer spoke to the Council about securing additional revenue by making additional fire protection contracts.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION ON MAY 11, 1964 WITH MAYOR SCHULER PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN FEIGHERY, GORMLEY, HELLMAN, PRICE, SMITH AND TABELING PRESENT.

The minutes of the April 13th meeting were approved as read by the Clerk.

#### Committee Reports:

##### Public Works

1. Mayor Schuler reported that City Engineer Morlidge and himself were to meet with authorities of Notre Dame High School to discuss some remedy of the flow of water from the school to St. Joseph Lane which was causing flooding in certain locations on the street.
2. In the matter of securing the State Highway Department to make the repairs to both old and new Amsterdam Road, Mayor Schuler said that on the following Friday he was to meet with the State Highway Dept. in Frankfort.
3. Repair of Montague Road-Mayor Schuler said the City Manager of Covington had failed to call a meeting to discuss mutual repair and maintenance of this street. Meanwhile our Public Works Dept. had carried out a patching program on the street.
4. In the matter of the flow of water onto Hamilton Road, near 1051 City Engineer Morlidge said that it was apparent that the flow of water was due to a spring in the area. He outlined a plan whereby the water would be diverted but gave the opinion that it would be too large a job for our Public Works to handle and that the job be done through contract. Council decided to have Votel Contractors give a price for repair as outlined by Mr. Morlidge.
5. Mayor Schuler discussed a drainage problem existing on Hillcrest Ave near Amsterdam Road. Water lay in the street there and was a hazard. The matter was referred back to the Public Works Dept. to come up with a solution in carrying the water from the street.

##### Police Dept:

1. Mr. Feighery presented the monthly report for April of the Park Hills Police Dept. which was received and filed.
- 2/ ~~Mr.~~ The Volunteer division bought a new red light for mounting on police cruiser and the Council authorized the cost of having same mounted.

##### Fire Dept:

1. Mr. Hellman presented the report of the Department for April which was received and filed.
2. Mrs. Hiltz, who has the fire answering service for the Fire Dept. ask to be relieved of this position. Mr. Hellman was directed to proceed in finding a replacement for this service in order that Mrs. Hiltz request might be granted.
3. Council directed City Attorney Burke to draft an ordinance for presentation at the June meeting advertising for bids for the purchase of 500 feet of inch and a half fire hose as per specifications prepared by the Fire Department.
4. The Clerk read a letter from the Ky. Inspection Bureau stating that the Meyer Ridge Community now covered for fire protection under the contract with the City of Park Hills would be covered under the contract of Lookout Heights which had annexed this area. The Clerk stated that contract with Meyer Ridge would expire June 30, 1964

##### Finance Dept:

1. The Clerk Treas. presented the monthly report of the General Fund for the month of April which was received and filed.
2. Upon request of the Clerk a motion was made by Mr. Tabeling and seconded by Mr. Smith that the Clerk-Treas. be authorized to pay \$ 5,000 plus interest on the City Hall Bonds which would be due on May 15. Mr. Tabeling, aye. Mr. Smith, aye; Mr. Feighery, aye; Mr. Gormley, aye, Mr. Hellman, aye, Mr. Price, aye and the motion carried.



3. The Clerk reminded Council that the new auto sticker would go on sale June 1 and be on sale each evening, Mon. thro gh Friday during the month.

#### Old Business:

1. Meyer-Edwards dispute- Mr. Price said he has another phone call from Mrs. Edwards re this matter and that she has a new attorney who said that Mrs. Edwards was contemplating filing a suit against Mr. Meyer and the City of Park Hills.

2. City Attorney Burke announced that the City was gathering depositions for its defense in the suit levied against the City of Park Hills and other parties by Mr. Evans of Lawton Road.

3. Mr. Morlidge announced no progress in securing plats for annexation of certain adjoining territory. This has been slowed up by the action of Lookout Heights in annexing Meyer ridge.

4. It developed that the black top bus alighting area to be installed at Altavia Ave had not been done. This was referred back to the public works for action since same had been authorized by Council several months ago.

5. Mr. Feighery stated that his inquiry into the possibilty of securing some type of bus service on the Main Park Hills line on Sundays had died for lack of interest on the part of Park Hills Citizens.

6. In the matter of dog control Mayor Schuler prestned a copy of an ordinance in effect in a neighboring City. While this did not meet the Park Hills situation in all respects it was given to the City Attorney was directed to revise the present Park Hills Ordinances on dog control to enable the City to enforce the control of dogs.

7. Mr. Smith stated that the Memorial Day prarade of the Civic Association would be held. Mr. Smith would be the Chairman with Mayor Schuler, the Master of ceremony at the dedication of a plack to President Kennedy which had been paid for and installed by the Park Hills Civic Assocaition. It was indicated that no City funds had been expended in this project.

#### New Business:

1. The City Attorney read Ordinance Number 11, 1964" AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LETTING OF PUBLIC BIDS AND CONTRACTS FOR THE REPAIR OF SECTIONS OF STREETS IN THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KY."

A motion was made by Mr. Gormley, seconded by Mr. Smith that Ordinance Number 11, 1964 be adopted as read. Mr. Gormley, aye; Mr. Smith, aye; Mr. Feighery, aye; Mr. hellman, aye; Mr. Price, aye; Mr. Tabeling, aye and the motion carried.

2. The Clerk announced that the Council should employ the auditor for the fiscal years 1962-63 and 1963-64. A motion was made by Mr. Hellman and seconded by Mr. Gormley that Mr. Clifford Kohlhepp of Park Hills be contacted as to the audit at a fee not to exceed \$ 400. Mr. Hellman to make contact. Mr. Hellman, aye; Mr. Gornley, aye; Mr. Feighery, aye; Mr. Price, aye; Mr. Snith, aye; Mr. Tabeling, aye and the motuob carried.

The Clerk then read the following applicat ons for Park Hills beer and liquor licenses:

Mrs. arie, Sanzere, Mr. Bem astleman, Mrs. Olga Wooten and the V.W.F.W. Post 1484 each having applied for a retail liquor license. A motion was made by Mr. Gormley, seconded by Mr. Smith that the Clerk be directed to issue said licenses. Mr. Gormley, aye; Mr. Smith, aye; Mr. Feighery, aye; Mr. Hellman, aye; Mr. Price, aye; Mr. Tabeling, aye and the motion carried.

4. The Clerk announced that the following had not as yet applied for liquor licenses:

1. Retail liquor licenses- Mrs. Helen Flannery and Mr. Floyd Rosenhan; Carry out Mr. Floyd Rosenhahn and Nocero Bros.

A motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Hellman that if these applications, accompanied by proper payment were in the hands of the Clerk before May 31, 1964 that he be directed to issue same as indicated. Mr. Hellman, aye; Mr. Gormley, aye; Mr. Feighery, aye; Mr. Price, aye; Mr. Smith, aye; Mr. Abel, aye and the motion carried.

5. Mr. Feighery brought up the question of out of town industry paying Park Hills occupational license following short discussion same was referred to later meeting

6. The City Clerk in his capacity as City Bldg inspector said he had a complaint from Mrs. Rich of St. Joseph Lane about a garage and storage structure being erected on the property of the Park Hills small animal hospital. This permit had been issued in conformity to the ordinance as this lot is being used for business purposes and the structure was within the limits of the code.

#### Report of Building Permits.

The City Clerk announced that only one remodeling building permit had been issued during April

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION ON JUNE 8, 1964, WITH VICE MAYOR TABELING PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN FEIGHERY, GORMLEY, HELLMANN, SMITH, AND PRICE PRESENT.

The minutes of the May 11, 1964 meeting were approved as read.

Petitions and delegations:

1. Miss Sandra Karrick of St. James Avenue representing her parents appeared before council seeking permission to install concrete between the street and the sidewalk paving in front of the residence at 816 St. James. Lengthy discussion followed and a motion was made by Mr. Hellmann seconded by Mr. Smith that in line with the policy pursued by the city that this request be denied, and that the petitioner be directed to replace such soil as had been removed in preparation of this request. Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.
2. A request by a tenant at 822 Aberdeen Rd. for permission to build a concrete parking area in front of his residence was also denied. This request was made for the same area where similar requests had been previously denied. The public works dept. was directed to fill in the gully in front of this residence while the tenant agreed to seed or sod same.

Committee reports:

Police Dept.

1. Mr. Feighery presented the monthly report of the Park Hills Police Dept. for May, which was received and filed.

Fire Dept.

1. Mr. Hellmann presented the monthly report of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. for the month of May, which was received and filed.
2. Mr. Hellmann reported re the matter of finding a successor for Mrs. Hiltz' fire phone answering service that arrangements had been made to have the calls received by the Covington Fire Dept. who would have control of the Park Hills siren. A motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Smith that the City of Park Hills enter into a contract with the City of Covington for the above described service. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Price aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.
3. Permission was granted to the fire dept. to make certain repairs in their quarters. Cost of same to be defrayed by the City and charged to this department's budget.
4. Permission was granted to the fire dept. to erect a wall not to exceed 7 feet high around the gas heating boiler in the fire dept.
5. Mr. Hellmann announced that after the 30th of June, 1964 the Park Hills Fire Dept. would not make runs to the Meyer Ridge Subdivision, Meyer Ridge having become a part of Lookout Heights and subject to fire protection by that City. The present contract with the citizens of Meyer Ridge ending on that date.

Finance Dept.

1. The clerk treasurer submitted the report of the general fund for May 1964, which was received and filed.
2. The clerk treasurer gave a partial report on tax collections for the year 1964.
3. The clerk treasurer reported that all applicants for the issuance of liquor licenses had received same through payment of proper fees.



4. The clerk treasurer presented to the council a list of those persons who were delinquent in payment of the occupational tax. The clerk was directed to extend the time for payment to June 15, following June 15 the provided penalty of 10% would be added and after July 1 those persons not having met the requirement would be cited to court.

Public Works Dept.

1. In absence of Mayor Schuler, Chairman of this Committee, no report was given.

#### Old Business

1. The clerk announced that in response to the advertisement for bids for major street resurfacing three bids had been received: Bid #1--Northern Ky. Asphalt Co., \$.76 per sq. yd. laid. Bid #2--LE. Burgin Co., \$1.13 per sq. yd. laid, Bid #3--Eaton Asphalt Paving Co., .689 per sq. yd. The clerk announced that all three bids met the specification and furthermore that all bids were lower than ever received before. In view of the favorable price, a motion was made by Mr. Price and seconded by Mr. Hellmann that the bid of Eaton Asphalt Paving Co. be accepted at \$.689 per sq. yd. and that the Public Works Dept. and the City Engineer be directed to provide such streets as would constitute repairs in the amount of 10000 sq. yds. and that not more than \$7000.00 be expended from the budget for this purpose. Mr. Price aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

2. The City Attorney then read Ordinance No. 12, 1964: AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ADVERTISING AND RECEIPT OF BIDS FOR FIRE HOSE TO BE USED BY THE FIRE DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY. A motion was made by Mr. Hellmann and seconded by Mr. Price that Ordinance No. 12, 1964 be adopted as read. Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Price aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

3. The City Attorney then submitted Ordinance No. 13, 1964 to Council for approval: AN ORDINANCE PROTECTING THE PUBLIC HEALTH SAFETY AND WELFARE OF THE CITIZENS OF PARK HILLS, BY FORBIDDING THE STRAYING AND WANDERING OF DOGS, CATS, OR OTHER ANIMALS ON THE PUBLIC STREETS, ALLEYS, WALKWAYS AND OTHER PLACES IN THE CITY OF PARK HILLS: AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF. A motion was made by Mr. Price and seconded by Mr. Feighery that Ordinance No. 13, 1964 be adopted as read. Mr. Price aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

4. The City Attorney presented Resolution No. 5, 1964: A RESOLUTION UPON THE DEATH OF WILLIAM SCHAEFFLER. A motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Smith that Resolution No. 5, 1964 be adopted as read. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Price aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

5. The Meyers-Edwards dispute. Mr. Hellmann announced that in compliance with Mrs. Edwards' request, Mr. Meyer had removed the blacktop curbing to which Mrs. Edwards had objected.

6. The City Attorney announced that depositions were still being taken in the suit filed by Mr. Evans of Lawton Rd. against the City of Park Hills and other parties.

7. Mr. Morlidge announced that no progress had been made on the securing of plats necessary for consideration of annexation of certain territory adjacent to the City of Park Hills, specifically Ft. Perry Community and that portion along Sleepy Hollow Rd. formerly known as the Bluegrass Subdivision.
8. It was announced that the blacktop bus alighting area at Altavia and Amsterdam had been completed.
9. Mr. Hellmann announced that Mr. Kohlhepp of Park Hills had accepted the job of auditing the Park Hills books and that he would contact the City Clerk and Treasurer.
10. Discussion on an expanded occupational license ordinance was postponed.

#### New Business

THE CITY COUNCIL OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION ON MONDAY, JULY 13, 1964, AT 8:00 P.M. WITH VICE MAYOR TABELING PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN GORMLEY, HELLMANN, FEIGHERY, PRICE, AND SMITH PRESENT. MAYER SCHULER WAS ABSENT, BEING ON VACATION.

The minutes of the June 8, 1964 meeting were approved as read by the clerk.

Petitions and delegations:

1. Mrs. Nehring, of 844 St. James, and son appeared before council to seek relief from surface water overflowing her property from Old State R Rd. The matter was referred to Mr. Price of the Public Works Dept. Mrs. Nehring also protested about weeds on Kremer's Farm. This matter was referred to Mr. Smith for investigation and action. Upon inquiry, council informed Mrs. Nehring that parking was prohibited upon her side of St. James Ave. She contended that she had requested the police to move a car illegally parked in front of her residence but had been informed by the patrolman that the car was legally parked.

2. Mr. Jack Cain of 1144 Audubon, appeared before council to question the erection of a board fence by Mr. John Brooking between the Cain and Brooking yard. He inquired if council permitted such. The City Clerk and the City Attorney told council and Mr. Cain that the only restrictions concerning fences were deed restrictions to be found in certain of the Park Hills deeds, but that these restrictions prohibited front fences only. Mr. Cain then asked council if, in order to prevent future occurrences, it was possible for the council to pass an ordinance to prohibit erection of all fences. This matter was referred to the city attorney for legal study.

3. Mr. Al Beckman of 1119 Audubon appeared before council complimenting it for the street repairs recently made, but further inquired if it were possible to pave Audubon Rd. at this time. Council thanked Mr. Beckman for his interest but informed him that no additional money was available at the present time for major street repair.

The regular order of business was suspended to permit the receipt of bids for fire hose. The Clerk read the following bids: Bid #1: Eureka Fire Hose Co., \$1.14.5 per foot. Bid #2: The Riggs Equipment Co., Type MW, \$1.40 per ft., Type DJ, \$1.36 per foot, Bid #3: Fyr Fyter Sales Co. \$1.38 per ft., and Bid #4, Sutphen Co. \$1.14 per ft. Mr. Halpin of the Riggs Equipment Co., and Mr. May of Fyr Fyter Sales spoke to council about the merits of their product. All the bids were then referred to Mr. Hellmann and Chief Greyer who upon report recommended that the bid of the Fyr Fyter Sales at \$1.38 per ft. be accepted as the best bid. A motion was made by Mr. Hellmann and seconded by Mr. Gormley that the Fyr Fyter bid be accepted and that the City Clerk be empowered to enter into a contract with the Fyr Fyter Sales at the bid price. Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

## Committee reports:

### Police Dept.

1. Mr. Feighery presented the report of the Police Dept. for the month of June, which was received and filed.
2. The Clerk read the resignation of Mr. Gerhardt Warther as a part time paid patrolman. Following discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Feighery that the resignation be accepted. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Price aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.
3. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Gormley that Chief of Police Schaefer be permitted to attend the meeting in Frankfort called by the Governor on July 16 to discuss traffic within the State. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Price aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.
4. Mr. Feighery stated that at this time he had no report on the possibility of permitting the police to affiliate with the state operated county employees association under a pension plan. He wished to give the matter more consideration.
5. Mr. Feighery next reported that in a matter of establishing unified police control for certain of the hilltop cities that a meeting had been held, attended, by Vice Mayor Tabeling, Chief of Police Schaefer and himself who met with representatives of Lookout Heights, Ft. Mitchell and Ft. Wright. A Discussion was held as to implementing this unified control, approximately stated the cost for each of the areas was established and while it appeared that certain of the cities were not too interested that another meeting was set up for August 21.

### Finance Dept.

1. The Clerk presented the report of the general fund for June, which was received and filed.
2. The clerk treasurer gave a detailed report of the 1964 tax collections.
3. He also presented a detailed list of delinquent real estate taxes.
4. He presented to council a report on delinquent personal taxes.
5. He told council that for the present fiscal year the auto sticker license fee collected amounted to \$7592.00 to date.

### Public Works.

1. Vice Mayor Tabeling announced that in the absence of the Mayor Mr. Price had accepted the responsibility as Chairman of the Public Works Dept. Mr. Price made the following reports:
  - A. That in the company with the City Engineer he had visited various trouble spots.
    - (a) Rosemont Avenue, water coming up through expansion joints in the street. It appeared that this was due to a broken surface line below street level. It was estimated that the cost of repair would be about \$200.00.



(b) Arlington and Far Hills-- a break in a surface line drainage line, although on private property, this line serves several residents and the city engineer felt that the city should assume responsibility for repair, cost \$100.00.

(c) Old Amsterdam Rd. near junction with new, the head wall of a storm sewer falling down, loosening supports of a guard rail. This should be repaired to prevent accidents. Since this road had been put in by the State Mr. Price assumed the responsibility of determining if the State would make the repair.

(d) Jackson Rd. sewers, repairs needed to prevent raw sewage from leaking into the open, most of these feeder lines of private residences, and the responsibility of these only. However, there were several breaks in the main sewer lines, and manhole repairs needed which would have to be made by the City at an estimated cost of \$100 per manhole. Council directed Mr. Feigher to proceed with this project as having priority.

(e) There were several broken tile of both sanitary and surface lines on Old Amsterdam Road. (Estimated cost of repair \$120.00)

Following these reports, council told Mr. Price to proceed with the repairs using City labor where possible, otherwise to arrange with contractors to the work.

#### Fire Dept.

1. Mr. Hellmann presented the report of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Department for the month of June, which was received and filed.

2. Announced that an agreement had been made with the City of Covington for fire phone answering service, replacing Mrs. Hiltz, who had asked to be relieved of this duty. Said agreement with Covington at an annual cost of \$300.00 extending from July 1, 1964 to June 30, 1965. The City attorney then read Resolution No. 6, 1964:

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL TERMINATING THE CONTRACT OF MRS. FRED HILTZ FOR FIRE TELEPHONE SERVICE TO THE CITY. THE REMAINDER OF SAID TERM WITH THE CITY OF COVINGTON FIRE DEPARTMENT TO PROVIDE SUCH SERVICE.

A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Smith that Resolution No. 6, 1964 be adopted as read. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Price aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

3. The City Attorney was directed to draw up a resolution for presentation to council expressing to Mrs. Hiltz, the thanks of the City for her long term of service in answering the fire telephone of the City of Park Hills.

4. Mr. Hellmann introduced the matter of the need of a new fire truck, suggesting that the matter be submitted to the voters in the November 1964 election. Following lengthy discussion the matter was deferred for further consideration to the next meeting.

#### Old Business

1. The Evans suit. No additional information available at this time.
2. The amending of the occupation license to include solicitors and extending the license to include all persons doing work within the City of Park Hills, regardless of the location of their business site. Discussion followed by referral to the next meeting.
3. The City Attorney read Ordinance No. 14, 1964:

AN ORDINANCE PROTECTING THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE OF THE CITIZENS OF PARK HILLS, BY FORBIDDING THE CONSTRUCTION OR INSTALLATION OF ANYTHING IN, OVER, OR UPON ANY STREET, ALLEY, SIDEWALK OR PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Gormley that Ordinance No. 14, 1964, be adopted as read. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Price aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

Immediately before the passage of this motion Mr. Smith had asked to be excused as he was ill.



#### New Business:

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION ON MONDAY, AUGUST 10, 1964, WITH MAYOR SCHULER PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN GORMLEY, HELLMAN, FEIGHERY, SMITH, PRICE AND TABELING PRESENT.

The minutes of the July 13 meeting were approved as read by the acting Clerk, Mrs. Helen C. Ayres, City Assessor who was appointed in the absence of Clerk Clark on vacation.

Petitions and delegations:

1. Mr. Robert Wagner of 930 Terrace appeared before Council seeking to erect a fence in his side yard at the above address, indicating that his immediate neighbors had no objection. Mr. Morlidge, City Engineer told Council that in his opinion there was no restriction against this action and the Council so informed Mr. Wagner.

2. A delegation of residents from Exter Drive appeared before Council seeking the repeal of Ordinance # 13, 1964 an ordinance regulating the keeping of cats, dogs and other animals. Included in the delegation were: Mr. Robert Harvard, Mr. Al Exterkamp, Mr. Jack Exterkamp, Mr. Ed. Wille, Mr. Al Stoeckle all of whom expressed opposition to the existing ordinance for various reasons. Mr. Feighery, Park Hills Police Commissioner explained the purpose of the present ordinance and the position of the Police Department in answering complaints. Others who voiced opposition to the ordinance were Mrs. Norma Ostendarp, Mr. Jack Schlotman. Opposition to the use of the police cruiser in bringing to the Police Stations persons who wished to swear out warrants against dog owners was brought up by those opposed to this ordinance but the City Attorney gave the opinion that the Police Department was within the legal rights in transporting such persons for such purposes. Following additional discussion the matter was deferred to a meeting which would be held Aug. 17 for discussion by Council on this matter. THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION ON MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 14, 1964, WITH VICE MAYOR TABELING PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN GORMLEY, FEIGHERY, HELLMANN, PRICE, AND SMITH PRESENT. MAYOR SCHULER ABSENT FROM THE CITY.

The minutes of the August 10 and August 17 meetings were approved as read by the clerk.

Delegations: Mr. Charles Coslett of Mt. Allen Rd. headed a delegation of residents from that street protesting speeding and the ignoring of stop signs by students of the University of Kentucky Extension Center. Mr. Coslett presented the problem to council and was assisted by Lt. Hahn, a member of the Park Hills Police Department, and a resident of the street who bore out Mr. Coslett's statements and told council that approximately half of the students ignored the stop signs. Various actions were proposed by the residents as a means of eliminating this situation. Chief Schafer of the Park Hills Police Dept. agreed to place unmarked cruisers in the area in an effort to break up these traffic violations.

Committee reports:

Public Works Dept., Mr. Price reporting:

1. No progress on condition of guard rail on New Amsterdam Rd. since he had been unable to contact Mr. Kingsbury, Dept. Commissioner of the State Highway Dept. He agreed to continue efforts in this direction.
2. The Public Works Dept. employees had completed repairs on a sewer break on Old Amsterdam Rd.
3. A water leak on lower Amsterdam had been referred to the Kenton Co. Water Commission.
4. A number of dead trees were becoming hazardous along the edge of Old Amsterdam. Mr. Smith was directed to determine if the trees were on the City right of way or on private property and directed to take appropriate action dependent upon his findings.
5. The dispute between Mrs. Bresser of St. Joseph Lane and the authorities of the Notre Dame High School over the surface water question which had inconvenienced Mrs. Bresser was being settled privately between the two parties.
6. The water problem in front of 1051 Hamilton-- no progress had been made. City Engineer Morlidge suggested that the pipe which currently reached the edge of the paving be continued and that the water be permitted either to flow into the open in the park area adjacent to the road or tapped into the sewer in the park in this area.
7. Mr. Price reported no progress on a sewer condition existent at So. Arlington and Far Hills.
8. In regards to the Jackson Rd. Condition near the Hamilton residence that he had contacted the Eaton Asphalt Paving Co. to investigate and make recommendations for repair but to date no report from this company.
9. Reported that the complaint of Mrs. Nehring about water flowing into her yard from Old State Rd. had received some attention, certain repairs had been made in this area but it would be necessary to wait for a heavy rainfall to determine if further steps should be taken.
10. Mr. Price inquired if council wished the employees of the department to seal the cracks in the street before winter. Council was of the opinion that this was a worthwhile project and suggested that the department do as much of this work as possible.

11. Mr. Price reported that certain repairs had been made on the Rosemont paving. This had been done without his knowledge and a survey among council members revealed that none of them had authorized such repairs. The clerk reported that he had received no bill for this work and the question remained as to who had done this work.

12. Vice Mayor Tabeling asked about certain sewer odors emanating from the Old Amsterdam Rd. sewer near the bottom of the hill. Mr. Price replied that this was the area in which repairs had been made. Mr. Tabeling requested that the public works Department continue its investigation and make repairs if same still appeared to be needed.

#### Police Dept.

1. Mr. Feighery reporting: Presented the monthly report for August for the Park Hills Police Dept. which was received and filed.
2. Reported that Mrs. Nehring's complaint raised certain actions by the Park Hills Police Dept. had been settled within the department.
3. Suggested that the City drop for the time being any further discussion of the Police Dept. participation in the county employee pension system.

#### Fire Dept.

1. Mr. Hellmann reporting: Presented the report for August 1964 of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. which was received and filed.
2. Read a letter from the Covington Fire Dept. thanking the Park Hills Fire Dept. for the hospitality it extended to delegates in the recent state convention held in Covington.
3. Requested that the City pay the sum of \$397.13, convention expenses, incurred by the Park Hills Fire Dept. in connection with this convention. Council concurred and directed that this bill be included in the regular monthly accounts.
4. The City Attorney read Resolution No. 8, 1964: A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A VOTE BY THE VOTERS OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS AT THE REGULAR NOVEMBER ELECTION IN 1964 FOR BOND ISSUE IN THE AMOUNT OF TWENTY-SEVEN THOUSAND (\$27000.00) DOLLARS FOR THE ACQUISITION OF A NEW FIRE TRUCK AND FIRE FIGHTING ACCESSORIES NECESSARY TO EQUIP SUCH TRUCK. A motion was made by Mr. Hellmann, seconded by Mr. Smith that Resolution No. 8, 1964 be adopted as read. Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Price aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.
5. Following a discussion of the choice of a fiscal agent for the proposed fire equipment bond issue, a motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Hellmann that the Hoessinghoff Company of Cincinnati be selected as the fiscal agent in this matter on its bid of \$695.00 according to the terms and specifications found therein. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Price aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; Mr. Smith aye; and the motion carried.
6. It was revealed that the accepted bid for a fiscal agent of \$695.00 was lower than the price which had been received from Merrill Lynch, Fenner Pierce et al, which had been \$1250.00 for the same services.

#### Finance Dept.

1. The City Clerk-Treasurer presented the monthly report for August 1964 which was received and filed.
2. The Clerk-Treasurer announced that the City was in receipt of an additional \$250.00 from the Decoursey estate. The question arose if this money like a previous bequest must be used only for public park expenditure. The treasurer was directed to hold funds until such time



as the City Attorney could investigate the will of Anna Decoursey from whose estate this money had come. If the same reservations were attached to this bequest as to the previous, the money was to be deposited by the treasurer in the City of Park Hills' reserve account, to be used for park expenditure only. If in the opinion of the attorney this condition was not existent, the placing of the money was to be determined by action of the council.

3. The clerk reported that he was in receipt of the annual payment in the amount of \$250.00 from the Kenton Co. Fiscal Court as payment under the contract existent between the county and the City of Park Hills for ambulance service in unincorporated sections of the county. Since this was an anticipated receipt within the framework of the budget, he announced that the money must be placed in the general fund.

4. The clerk asked if the council wished to continue its membership at a cost of \$50.00 per year in the Greater Cincinnati Safety Council. Discussion followed and Police Commissioner Feighery requested that the matter be tabled pending his investigation of benefits accruing to the City from this membership.

5. Mr. Gormley made a partial report on the occupational license matter giving council certain statistics from the City of Ft. Thomas. Council felt that further investigation should be carried out before the City took any action in changing the scope of the present occupational license ordinance.

#### Old Business.

1. It was announced that the suit involving the City of Park Hills and others vs Harry Evans had been continued to November 19, 1964. In the discussion that followed it appeared that there had been no authorization for the continuation of Park Hills as a participant in the suit. A motion that Park Hills continue as a litigant was made by Mr. Hellmann and seconded by Mr. Tabeling. Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; Mr. Gormley No; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Price aye; Mr. Smith No; and the motion carried by a vote of four to two.

2. The Clerk Treasurer announced that since by council action the Police Dept. had been relieved of the duties of notifying delinquent auto sticker purchasers, that the Finance Dept. would mail out notices to all those whose records showed they had not purchased same. Council agreed to this action and relieved the Finance Dept. of any further responsibility in this matter after the delinquent notice had been mailed. The matter of enforcement against delinquency was the Police Department's responsibility.

3. Mr. Feighery reported that in the matter of discussion of an inter city police department between Park Hills, Lookout Heights, Ft. Wright, and Ft. Mitchell, a meeting had been held but that only representatives from Park Hills and Ft. Wright had attended. He said that one more meeting would be held to determine if all the cities were sufficiently interested to continue investigating the feasibility of such action.

4. Mr. Feighery also asked council for permission to investigate the possibility of making a charge against incorporated areas who were receiving ambulance service through the Police Dept. of Park Hills. It was pointed out that the contract of the Kenton Co. Fiscal Court covered payment for this service in unincorporated areas. The feeling of council was that such action could be taken and that an attempt made to enter into contractual agreement with surrounding cities or failing in this to refuse to answer calls in incorporated areas who had failed to make contractual agreement. Mr. Feighery was directed to continue his investigation.

## New Business

1. Vice Mayor Tabeling inquired if a letter had been sent to Mr. Harvard of Exter Dr. by Mayor Schuler concerning the decision reached by council in the matter of enforcement of the present dog ordinance. The Clerk was directed to determine if said letter had been written and if not to inform Mr. Harvard that at the present time council wished to make no change in this existing ordinance.
2. The City Attorney was directed to check the wording of the building code ordinance to determine whether the porch which had been erected by a resident at 1120 Exter Dr. without a building permit constituted an actual violation.
3. The clerk was directed to send bills for occupational licenses to Mr. George Dacy of Ft. Wright and Mr. Robert Lang of Park Hills for acting as news vendors within the City of Park Hills.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET ON SEPTEMBER 28, 1964 at 8:00 P.M. IN THE CITY BUILDING IN A MEETING ADJOURNED FROM SEPTEMBER 14, 1964, WITH MAYOR SCHULER PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN GORMLEY, FEIGHERY, PRICE, SMITH AND TABELING PRESENT. MR. HELLMANN ABSENT DUE TO EMPLOYMENT.

Delegations:

1. A delegation from Mt. Allen Rd. was again present to discuss with council the problems arising out of the heavy traffic on Mt. Allen Rd. due to its use by students at the University of Kentucky Extension Center. Mr. Hahn of 1117 Mt. Allen Rd. spoke for the delegation and presented a petition to council asking that in some manner Mt. Allen Rd. be returned to its former status of a "no outlet street". Mr. Hahn presented a drawing explaining the traffic conditions and asked that council take steps in connection with the University authorities in the elimination of this condition. It was suggested that alterations in the traffic pattern be made so as to require the use by those persons visiting the university center of the road from the Dixie Hwy. to the Extension Center, which road had been built by the State of Ky. for this purpose. Numerous facets of this proposal were discussed. Mr. Burke, the City Attorney, stated that it would be illegal for the City of Park Hills to erect a barricade at this point to prevent the use of Mt. Allen Rd. by University students. He also pointed out that any blockade erected on the University grounds was within the City of Covington and that such property, formerly a portion of Devou Park, had been deeded to the State of Kentucky, for school purposes, by the City of Covington, and it was his opinion that any agreement made would necessarily concern all or a portion of the following: The City of Park Hills; The City of Covington; The State of Kentucky; and the University of Kentucky, Parent Organization of the Northern Extension Center. Certain residents of Park Hills on Mt. Allen Lane were opposed to any blockading since their only present suitable means of entrance and egress to their property was through the grounds of the extension center. It developed during the meeting that some of the residents present were opposed to any action that would blockade free entrance and egress to the University grounds. In an effort to reach an amicable solution, Mayor Schuler announced a committee consisting of Vice Mayor Richard Tabeling as Chairman, Mr. Daniel Hahn, Mrs. Jack Fightmaster, and Police Commissioner Feighery, who were to meet with University authorities and any other necessary group in an effort to arrive at a solution of this problem. Vice Mayor Tabeling to contact the other committee members as to time and place of meeting.

2. The clerk read a letter being the official offer of the Hoefinghoffer Co. of Cincinnati re the matter of acting as fiscal agent for the City of Park Hills in the proposed fire equipment bond issue to be voted upon in the November 1964 election. A motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Feighery that the bid as outlined with specifications attached of the Hoefinghoffer Co. to act as fiscal agent in the matter of the proposed bond issue re fire equipment to be voted upon at the November 1964 election at a cost of \$695.00 be accepted. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Price aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

3. Council authorized change of location of a billboard sign located on the property of the Sisters of Notre Dame at St. Joseph Heights, said request having been made by the Sisters. Chief Schaefer was directed to check the location of the sign and Mr. Tabeling authorized to grant permission if the sign did not constitute a traffic hazard.

4. Mayor Schuler presented his resignation as Mayor of the City of Park Hills effective October 1, 1964, due to his removal from the City. Since this was Mayor Schuler's earnest desire, a motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Gormley, that the resignation of Mayor Schuler be accepted with regret. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Price aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried. City Attorney Burke, upon inquiry by council, informed them that since Mayor Schuler's resignation would take effect less than 45 days before the next regular election that under the KRS statutes Vice Mayor Tabeling would succeed to the office of Mayor, holding such office for the remainder of Mayor Schuler's unexpired term to December 31, 1965. He also pointed out that council should select a councilman to succeed Mr. Tabeling in the capacity which he would vacate on October 1, 1964.

There being no further business to appear before council, a motion to adjourn was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Price. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Price aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Tabeling aye; and the motion carried.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION AT THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING AT 8:00 P.M. ON MONDAY, OCTOBER 12, 1964, WITH MAYOR TABELING PRESIDING, AND COUNCILMEN GORMLEY, HELLMANN, PRICE, AND SMITH PRESENT FOR THE ENTIRE MEETING WHILE MR. FEIGHERY ARRIVED DURING THE MEETING.

The minutes of the September 14 and 28 meetings were approved as read.

#### Delegations:

Mr. Lange of 510 Scenic Avenue appeared before council to discuss the bill received by him under the occupational ordinance license in his capacity as news vendor within the city. He was accompanied by Mr. Dacy of Ft. Wright likewise a news vendor within the city. Upon direction of council the clerk had mailed these persons bills for occupational licenses. Following discussion, it was agreed by council that the collection of the bills would be suspended pending further investigation of the Park Hills occupational license ordinance.

Several residents of Mt. Allen Rd. were present concerning the discussion which had taken place for the past several months concerning traffic problems on Mt. Allen Rd. brought about by the use of the road by students of the University of Ky. Extension Center. Mayor Tabeling informed the delegation that a meeting with the University officials was to be held on October 13 and that further information would be provided following that meeting.

At this time, council took under consideration the selection of a person to fill the councilmanic vacancy existing when Vice Mayor Tabeling was elevated to the Mayoralty following Mr. Schuler's resignation. A motion was made by Mr. Smith and seconded by Mr. Hellmann that Mr. J. F. Holtmann be selected to fill the vacancy for the term expiring December 31, 1965. Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Price aye; and the motion carried.

It now became necessary to name a councilman to the position of Vice Mayor which had been vacated by Mayor Tabeling in his succession as Mayor. A motion was made by Mr. Price and seconded by Mr. Smith that following the usual tradition of the Park Hills Council that Mr. Joseph Gormley, the senior member of council in terms of service be named Vice Mayor for the councilmanic term ending December 31, 1965. Mr. Price aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; and the motion carried.

#### Committee reports:

Public Works--Mr. Price reporting.

1. In the matter of cooperation with Covington in the repair of Montague Rd. Mr. Price stated that this project which had been under former Mayor Schuler's direction, had not been further implemented, and since the City of Park Hills lacked funds necessary for major road repair and the weather was no longer suitable for same, that further consideration of this project be delayed until next year. Council concurred.
2. In the matter of the surface water condition existent at 1051 Hamilton Rd. Mr. Price was to investigate in cooperation with the City Engineer.
3. Announced that the condition existent at Hillcrest and Amsterdam apparently had been taken care of.
4. That it would be necessary to secure an outside contractor to do the work on the surface drain problem at So. Arlington Rd. and Far Hills Dr.



Mr. Price estimated the approximate cost at \$500.00. No further action was taken on this matter.

5. In the matter of the guard rail repair on New Amsterdam Rd. Mr. Price stated that he had been unsuccessful in his attempt to get the State to assume maintenance of this road which would include the guard rail repair. Mr. Morlidge stated that this job would require services of a contractor, and Mr. Price was further directed by council to contact the present head of the Ky. State Highway Dept. in a further effort to have them assume the obligations to which they had agreed at the time of the building of this road, i.e., the State's total maintenance of the road less snow control and removal.
6. Mr. Price stated that he had contact the Eaton Oil Co. concerning repairs on Jackson Rd. near Harry Hamilton residence but had received no response. He was directed to again contact this firm.
7. In the matter of Rosemont paving, it appeared that the work had been done by an unknown party, that no authorization for work had been granted by the City, and that the City had not been billed for same. Since the work appeared satisfactory, Mr. Price suggested that the matter be dropped from further agenda, and council concurred.
8. In the matter of tree removal along Old Amsterdam Rd., Mr. Price and Public Works Maintenance Man, Mr. Vocke, had investigated location of trees determined that they were in the City right of way and that the City had removed this hazard.
9. In the matter of crack filling streets for the winter, Mr. Price was authorized to buy a sufficient quantity of crack filler and proceed with this work.
10. Mayor Tabeling stated that the sewer odor which he had complained about at the last meeting along lower Old Amsterdam Rd. still existed. Mr. Price said that work had been done by his department in this area but that he would investigate further.
11. The Public Works Dept. was directed to repair a street depression in front of 900 Terrace Dr.
12. The Public Works Dept. was directed to use its best judgment in replacing the window glass material which had been broken out of the bus waiting station, and
13. The Public Works Dept. was directed to check for a sewer break on Montague Rd.

#### Fire Dept.

1. Mayor Tabeling announced the appointment of newly appointed councilman J. F. Holtmann as Chairman of Fire Dept. Committee. Mr. Hellmann, formerly Chairman of this committee was assigned to memberships on the Finance and Public Works Departments.
2. Mr. Hellmann presented the monthly report of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. for Sept., 1964, which was received and filed.
3. Mr. Hellmann received council's permission to make certain mechanical repairs to the Chevrolet and International Fire trucks.
4. Mr. Hellmann made a report on the proposed publicity by the City in cooperation with the Park Hills Civic Association and the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. in the matter of the proposed bond issue for the purchase and equipping of a new fire truck to be voted upon as a bond issue by the citizens of Park Hills in the election on November 3, 1964.

#### Finance Dept.

1. The Finance Dept. presented the report of the general fund for the month of September which was received and filed.

2.

#### Police Dept.

1. In the absence of Councilman Feighery, the clerk presented the monthly report for September for the Park Hills Police Dept. which was received and filed.

2. Mr. Feighery arrived at this time, and relative to Park Hills' participation as a member of the Greater Cincinnati Safety Council gave the report that in 1963 only 6 Northern Ky. cities were members, Park Hills not participating. Upon his request, further discussion of membership was tabled.

3. In the matter of cooperation of several cities in an intracity police force it was stated that no meeting had been held.

4. Mr. Feighery invited all members of council to attend the monthly meeting of Park Hills Police Dept. on November 2, at 8:00 P. M.

#### Old Business

1. The Mt. Allen traffic situation. Mr. Tabeling stated that a meeting with Mr. Hankins, Director of Northern Extension, University of Ky., would be held at 8:00 P. M. on October 13.

2. Chief Schaefer told council that to date 1578 auto stickers for the year 1964 had been sold.

3. The City Attorney told council that the recent additional bequest of \$250.00 received from the Decoursey estate was entailed in that all sums from this estate must be used for Park development only, and that the City Treasurer had been directed by him to deposit this money in the escrow funds set up for this purpose.

4. The City Clerk announced that in response to council's request, he had written Mr. Harvard concerning the council's stand on the enforcement of Park Hills' dog ordinance.

5. Mayor Tabeling, following a report by Chief Schaefer was authorized to inform the Sisters of Notre Dame Heights of permission to move a billboard located on their property. This request had been made by the Sisters but permission had been delayed pending investigation by the Police Dept. to determine if the removal and relocation of said sign would in any way constitute a traffic hazard.

6. The Clerk announced that the Automotive Leasing Co. had paid for oil used by the Police Cruiser under terms of the lease agreement.

#### New Business

1. The Clerk read a letter from the Civil Defense Authority of Northern Ky. requesting that Park Hills become an active participant in this authority by the payment of the annual fee based upon population of the City. Discussion followed, and a motion was made by Mr. Hellmann, seconded by Mr. Gormley, that the City not participate, and that the Clerk be directed to so notify the Director of the Civil Defense Authority. Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Price aye; Mr. Smith aye; and the motion carried.

2. The City Attorney was directed to prepare an ordinance for the November meeting again adopting the Kentucky Standards of Safety.

#### Communications:

1. A letter from a citizen of Puerto Rico asking to be declared an honorary citizen of the City of Park Hills was tabled.

2. Communication from Greater Cinti. Safety Council regarding a meeting to be held was read but tabled.

## Building Permits

1. The clerk presented the report of building permits issued during the month of September 1964.
2. Mr. Feighery asked that the City Attorney check the right of the City to determine if any and all contractors doing work in the City of Park Hills be directed that they must have an in force liability insurance by said contractors before a building permit could be issued.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION AT THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING AT 8:00 P.M. ON MONDAY, NOVEMBER 9, 1964, WITH MAYOR TABELING PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN GORMLEY, FEIGHERY, HELLMANN, HOLTMANN, AND PRICE PRESENT. COUNCILMAN SMITH ABSENT DUE TO ILLNESS.

The minutes of the October 12, 1964 meeting were approved as read by the clerk.

Delegations:

Residents of Mt. Allen Rd. were again present at council to discuss the use of Mt. Allen Rd. by students of the University of Kentucky Extension Center. Mayor Tabeling told the delegation that in company with Mrs. Fightmaster and Mrs. Coslett had met with Mr. Hankins, Director, of the University Center, to discuss this problem. He reported that Mr. Hankins had informed the committee that in his capacity as director he had no right to direct the closing of the road into the Extension Center or to make any decision which would in any way affect the use of said facility. He told the committee that this matter had to be referred to higher authority at the University of Ky. in Lexington. The clerk then read two letters, one from Mr. Hankins, the other from Mr. Godly of Lexington, in which it was stated that the University would take no steps to discontinue the use of the entrance and exit from the center onto Mt. Allen Rd. In reply to questions by members of the delegation present, Mr. Tabeling stated that it was his opinion that since the University had refused to take the necessary steps on their own property that the City of Park Hills was powerless to close Mt. Allen Rd. at its entrance into the University property. He then asked members of the delegation what further steps they might suggest to satisfy the objectors within the keeping of the rights of the City. Mr. Dennie Hahn, one of the objectors, stated that he was opposed to the conclusions drawn by the University and requested that the City take some action in reducing the number of cars using the street from the University Center. Mrs. Fightmaster, who had opposed the closing of the street, repeated her opposition to such a move and stated that it was the opinion of the group she represented that there was no opposition to use of the street by students and she felt that it was only the speed factor which constituted a hazard. Under questioning Mr. Frank Burke, Park Hills City Attorney, stated that it was his opinion that the City could not close off the street under any circumstance. Councilman Hellmann then inquired of the Attorney and the Board if there existed any manner of preventing the use of Mt. Allen Rd. by the University students. In the discussion that followed, representatives favoring and opposing the closing of the street were heard, and Mr. Coslett requested that the Park Hills Police Dept. patrol the street more frequently during the periods of peak use. Mr. Tabeling suggested that the speed limit on this street be reduced while Commissioner Feighery stated that the police would patrol the area as much as possible, keeping in mind the needs of police service in other sections of the city. The council agreed with the consent of the delegation present to erect more traffic signs in an effort to reduce the hazard, and the petitioners were invited to present any other ideas which they felt might be helpful in a solution of this case.

Committee reports:

Public Works, Mr. Price reporting.

1. In the matter of the street drainage problem in front of 1151 Hamilton Mr. Price suggested that since this problem seemed to be due to roof water from this building flowing onto the street that the owner be directed to cut off the roof drains in such manner as the water would flow onto his own lawn. Council concurred in this suggestion and Mr. Price was directed to so notify the resident.
2. In the matter of the surface drain problem on S. Arlington Rd. Mr. Price said that he had contacted Contractor Carl Votel who had agreed to make necessary repairs for \$50.00. Council authorized Mr. Price to have this work done with inspection being made by Mr. Price and the City Engineer. It was felt that this could be done within a two week period.
3. In the matter of drainage and street crack problems on Jackson Rd. near the Harry Hamilton residence Mr. Price stated that the area had been examined by Eaton Asphalt Paving Co. who had done major street resurfacing in this area. The company denied responsibility for any condition existent here, saying that the nature of the soil was responsible for cracks and that these should be frequently filled to maintain the street and prevent damage to nearby residences.
4. Mr. Price stated that his department was in process of filling all cracks in paved surfaces of the city.
5. In the matter of the sewer odor on lower Amsterdam Rd. he stated that both himself and Mr. Vocke had examined the sanitary sewers in this area and could detect no opening. It was felt that any odor that still existed remained from before this job had been completed and that sufficient rainfall was needed for flushing purposes.
6. That a sewer break on Montague Rd. had been repaired by his department.
7. A complaint of the condition of a sidewalk at 1008 Rose Circle was referred to Mr. Price who was to inform the owner of the necessity of making proper repairs. In this matter the police dept. was directed, while cruising the City, to note any further sidewalk breaks and report same to Mr. Price.
8. In the matter of the State maintenance of New Amsterdam Rd., which involved the repair of the guard rail, Mr. Price read a letter from Mr. Ward of the Ky. State Highway Dept. in which the state again denied liability for maintenance of this road. Mr. Price's request for permission to continue the matter with the Highway Dept. was granted by council.
9. City Attorney Burke was requested by council to investigate the Ordinances of the City of Park Hills concerning the various liabilities of the City and the property owner where sidewalk needed repair.

Police Dept.,

1. Mr. Feighery presented the report of the Park Hills Police Dept. for the month of October 1964 which was received and filed.
2. Mr. Feighery told council that he had no further report on the proposed intercity police project.
3. Mr. Feighery thanked members of council for their presence at a recent meeting of the Park Hills Police Dept.

Fire Department, Mr. Holtmann reporting.

1. Mr. Holtmann first thanked members of council for their confidence in him shown by his appointment as a member of City Council.
2. A report of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. for the month of October 1964 was received and filed.
3. At council's request, City Attorney Burke outlined the procedure



now to be followed by the City, since the passage of the fire equipment bond issue, to implement the purchase of this equipment; (1) an additional ordinance must be prepared; (2) a suit must be filed by the City to check the validity of the bond issue and the right of the City to make such purchase; (3) the fiscal agent must then advertise the bonds for sale. He stated that it would take several months to accomplish these three items and that no action of a legal nature in securing bids for a fire truck could be taken until the preliminary steps had been performed. He stated that it would be likely that the bids for the bonds would not be made until April of 1965. Mr. Holtmann then inquired of the City Attorney about the specifications upon which bids for the fire truck could be made. Mr. Burke informed Council that the specifications should be so drawn as to permit bidding by several companies, and that bids could be entered either for the fire truck completely equipped as per specifications or individual items of the specifications could be bid separately. For this reason, he stated, that the specifications must necessarily be in detail, itemizing separately each item upon which bids were to be sought.

#### Finance Dept.

1. Mr. Gormley presented the report of the general fund for the month of October which was received and filed.
2. Mr. Hellmann presented the report prepared by the clerk-treasurer of a detailed 7 month report of the present 15 month fiscal year, showing actual receipts and expenditures. The treasurer pointed out that before the end of the fiscal year there would be several items including the auto sticker license fee and the occupational license fee which would bring in considerable revenue, which revenue had been estimated in the budget prepared for this fiscal period.
3. The City Attorney read a request from the First Church of the Nazarene, Covington, seeking exemption from municipal real estate taxes upon a building being erected by the Church to be used as a parsonage for its pastor. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Gormley that in keeping with the policy established by Park Hills in such matters that the City Assessor be directed to delete from the tax duplicate this property at such time as the Assessor should determine that the title to property was vested in the name of the First Church of the Nazarene. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Price aye; and the motion carried.
5. The Clerk-Treasurer told Council that after a research into the ordinance providing the levying of occupational licenses by the City of Park Hills, it was evident that the right to levy such tax against agents and companies doing business within the City of Park Hills, but having offices elsewhere, was contained within the provisions of said ordinance and that it was only necessary for council to establish fees and means of collection from such person. It was decided following this report that the finance committee consisting of Messrs. Gormley and Hellmann should meet with the City Clerk-Treasurer in an effort to provide the necessary information. Mr. Hellmann agreed to act as chairman and to call a meeting at a convenient time.

#### Old Business

1. The City Attorney read Ordinance No. 16, 1964: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 5, 1950 BY REPEALING SECTIONS 1, 5 and 6 THEREOF AND SUBSTITUTING THEREFOR THE FOLLOWING SECTIONS. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Hellmann that Ordinance No. 16, 1964 be

adopted as read. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Price aye; and the motion carried.

2. The City attorney then read Ordinance No. 17, 1964: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 18, 1942 BY REPEALING SECTION 1 AND SUBSTITUTING THEREFOR THE FOLLOWING. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Gormley that Ordinance No. 17, 1964 be adopted as read. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Price aye; and the motion carried.

3. The City Attorney read Ordinance No. 18, 1964: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1, 1947, KNOWN AS THE "BUILDING CODE" AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 9, 1950 AND ORDINANCE NO. 3, 1951, BY ADOPTING AS PART OF SAID BUILDING CODE THE STANDARDS OF SAFETY OF THE STATE OF KENTUCKY, AS MADE AND ADOPTED BY THE COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC SAFETY OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY, AS REVISED AND AMENDED FOR THE YEAR 1964. A motion was made by Mr. Holtmann and seconded by Mr. Gormley that Ordinance No. 18, 1964 be adopted as read. Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Price aye; and the motion carried.

4. The City Attorney then read Resolution No. 9, 1964: A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY, AUTHORIZING RICHARD TABELING, MAYOR, TO SIGN CHECKS TOGETHER WITH THE CITY TREASURER AND ALSO AUTHORIZING JOSEPH GORMLEY, COUNCILMAN, TO SIGN CHECKS WITH THE CITY TREASURER ON THE BANK ACCOUNTS OF THE CITY. A motion was made by Mr. Price and seconded by Mr. Feighery that Resolution No. 9, 1964 be adopted as read. Mr. Price aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Gormley aye; and the motion carried.

5. City Attorney Burke stated that in response to request of council he had investigated the legality of action in the City of Park Hills in requiring bonds for liability from contractors seeking building permits within the City of Park Hills. He said that neither Covington nor Newport required such bonds but that any City has the right so to do. Council instructed the City Attorney to prepare an ordinance for presentation at the December meeting which would provide that any person or firm seeking a building permit within the City of Park Hills should file with the City Clerk in his capacity as building inspector a liability bond in a minimum amount of \$5000.00 before the clerk issue said building permit, and that furthermore, in this newly prepared ordinance, that the work "knowingly" be deleted from the building ordinance in that section which deals with the failure of a person or firm to secure the necessary building permit. A motion to this effect was made by Mr. Feighery, seconded by Mr. Gormley, Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Price aye; and the motion carried.

#### New Business

1. A request read by the clerk from letter sent to council by the Seventh Day Adventist Church of Covington seeking the right to collect funds within the City of Park Hills for charitable church purposes, was discussed. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Holtmann that this permission be granted and the clerk directed to inform the church under the following circumstances. (a) all collection to be done between the hours of 8 A.M. and 6 P.M., (b) that before solicitation begins the head of the drive should inform the Park Hills Chief of Police of the date set for collection. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Price aye; and the motion carried.



2. The Clerk-Treasurer introduced a request of the Ladies Auxiliary of VFW 1484, Park Hills, for permission to hold a memorial service for the late President John F. Kennedy on Sunday, November 22, 1964, at the Kennedy Memorial in the Park on Park Drive. A motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Feighery that council grant said permission, that the clerk be directed to notify the petitioner, and to direct that to prevent any possible traffic hazard that the Park Hills Chief of Police be notified of the plan of arrangement and the time. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Price aye; and the motion carried.

3. Mayor Tabeling told council that by invitation he had attended a meeting of the Campbell-Kenton area planning commission. He gave a report on the meeting and suggested that he be empowered to invite a member of this commission to address the City Council of Park Hills. Council concurred with Mr. Tabeling being directed to make the necessary arrangements.

4. Councilman Feighery made a motion, seconded by Mr. Gormley, that the following roster of both paid and volunteer members of the Park Hills Police Deptl be accepted as the legal roster of said department.

5. Mr. Feighery stated that in cooperation with the City Clerk-Treasurer, the additional bond required for Chief Schaefer had been secured.
6. City Attorney Burke stated that the suit involving the City of Park Hills re Harry Evans was to be heard in the Circuit Court at 9:00 A.M. November 19.
7. Upon motion by Mr. Feighery, seconded by Mr. Hellmann, the City Attorney was directed to prepare an ordinance for the December meeting setting the speed limit on Mt. Allen Rd. at 15 miles per hour. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Hellmann aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Price aye; and the motion carried.

In the matter of the guard rail on New Amsterdam Rd. and the land adjacent thereto it was revealed that further water damage had been done and that the road needed immediate repair in this area to prevent serious damage. City Engineer Morlidge reported that he had visited the site with Mr. Price and were convinced that the satisfactory repair of this project would require the services of an outside contractor. Mr. Morlidge told Council that Mr. Carl Votel had been contracted and had agreed to make the necessary repairs under Mr. Morlidge's specification on a time and material basis but that at a cost not to exceed \$505.00. A motion was made by Mr. Price and seconded by Mr. Holtmann that this project be declared an emergency and that Mr. Carl Votel, Contractor, be directed to make the repairs as outlined by Mr. Morlidge on a time and material basis at a cost not to exceed \$505.00. Mr. Price aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Smith aye; and the motion carried.

##### Police Department

1. Mr. Feighery presented the November report of the Park Hills Police Dept. which was received and filed.
2. Mr. Feighery had no further report on the intercity police project.

##### Fire Department

1. Mr. Holtmann presented the report for November of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. which was received and filed.

##### Finance Department

1. The Clerk Treasurer presented the report of the general fund for the month of November 1964 which was received and filed.
2. Vice Mayor Gormley announced that no progress had been made on discussions by the finance committee on the occupational license revision.

##### Park Committee

1. Upon request of Mr. Smith the Park Hills Girl Scouts were given permission to erect a Christmas tree in the public park along Hamilton Road.
2. Mr. Smith was also directed to use funds from the Decoursey Memorial in feeding the pin oak trees in the park on Park Drive.

## Old Business

1. Mr. Price stated that the survey on the condition of Park Hills' sewers was being carried out and that a major report would be submitted within 30 to 60 days
2. The City Attorney read Ordinance No. 19, 1964: AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$27,000.00 FIRE TRUCK AND FIRE EQUIPMENT BONDS OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY. A motion was made by Mr. Holtmann and seconded by Mr. Smith that Ordinance No. 19, 1964 be adopted as read. Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Price aye; and the motion carried.
3. The City Attorney then read Ordinance No. 20, 1964: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 8, 1935, DATED OCTOBER 14, 1935, DATED MAY 9, 1955, PROVIDING A MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT OF 15 MILES PER HOUR VEHICULAR OR MOTOR TRAFFIC UPON MOUNT ALLEN ROAD AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Holtmann that Ordinance No. 20, 1964 be adopted as read. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Price aye; Mr. Smith aye; and the motion carried.
4. The City Attorney then read Ordinance No. 21, 1964: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1, 1947, KNOWN AS THE "BUILDING CODE" AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 9, 1950, ORDINANCE NO. 3, 1951, AND ORDINANCE NO. 18, 1964 BY REVOKING SECTION 32 PARAGRAPH F. AND SECTION 33 PARAGRAPH A. AND SUBSTITUTING THEREFOR THE FOLLOWING SECTIONS. A motion was made by Mr. Holtmann and seconded by Mr. Feighery that Ordinance No. 21, 1964 be adopted as read. Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Price aye; Mr. Smith aye; and the motion carried.
5. The City Attorney read Ordinance No. 22, 1964: AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE TAX RATE OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS FOR THE YEAR 1965 AND LEVYING A TAX ON ALL REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY SUBJECT TO TAXATION FOR GENERAL PURPOSES; LEVYING A TAX FOR THE RETIREMENT OF THE BONDED INDEBTEDNESS; FIXING THE DATE OF PAYMENT, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO PAY SAME AT SUCH TIME. A motion was made by Mr. Holtmann and seconded by Mr. Smith that Ordinance No. 22, 1964 be adopted as read. Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Smith aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Price aye; and the motion carried.
6. It was announced that the suit of Harry Evans in which the City is one of the defendants had been postponed until January 5, 1965. City Attorney Burke discussed the progress and possible outcome of the suit with members of council.
7. The Police Dept. upon inquiry said that there had been no additional complaints from the residents of Mt. Allen Rd. re the use of that street by the University students.

## New Business

1. Mr. Feighery upon the clerk's request agreed to contact the Automotive Leasing Co. about payment for oil by the firm used by the Park Hills police cruiser and which was to be paid by the Leasing Co.
2. The clerk read a letter from the Sister Superior of Notre Dame Academy thanking Council for the signs and their erections, regulating traffic installed on Hillton Drive. The clerk had already replied to this letter.
3. The clerk read a letter from the Ky. State Highway Dept. stating that it had received from an insurance company a check to cover in full the cost of repair of the traffic signal at Dixie Highway and St. James and that the obligation was fulfilled.
4. Mr. Feighery brought up the question of giving consideration to Park Hills annexation of unincorporated areas adjacent to Park Hills noticeably that along Sleepy Hollow Rd. In the discussion there



existed some differences of opinion as to the exact boundaries of the adjoining city of Lookout Heights. The City Engineer suggested that a plat of the City of Lookout Heights be examined to determine the exact boundaries of this City and the possibility of giving consideration to annexation of the property along Sleepy Hollow Rd. Mr. Feighery also mentioned that he had been given information that an unincorporated buffer strip lay between the City of Park Hills and the City of Lookout Heights including the property at the rear of the St. James lots and that section of property on the Dixie Highway on which is located the Stop and Go Grocery and a laundromat. City Engineer Morlidge felt that all of this area was in Lookout Heights but he was instructed to investigate and report back at the next meeting.

#### Engineer Report

1. Mr. Morlidge told Council that he had investigated the corporation line of the City of Park Hills on Mt. Allen Rd. and found that Mt. Allen Rd. as paved was a dedicated city street abutting the entrance to the University of Ky. Northern Center, and that no buffer strip here existed.
