

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION AT THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING ON JANUARY 10, 1966, WITH MAYOR HELLMANN PRESIDING, AND COUNCILMEN DROEGE, FEIGHERY, GORMLEY, HOLTMANN, NIEHAUS, AND SORRELL PRESENT.

The minutes of the December 12, 1965 meeting were approved as read by the clerk. A motion was made by Mr. Holtmann and seconded by Mr. Gormley that Russell Clark be appointed as temporary clerk of the meeting. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley, aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

As his first official duty, Mayor Hellmann read copies of letters which he proposed be sent to the City of Lookout Heights and the City of Ft. Wright offering to these cities the cooperation of the City of Park Hills in joint endeavors beneficial to the three cities. A motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Droege that Mayor Hellmann be authorized to mail the letters as prepared and read. Mr. Dorge aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

The Acting Clerk then presented Ordinance No. 1, 1966: AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE TIME AND PLACE OF THE REGULAR MONTHLY MEETINGS OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS FOR THE TWO YEAR TERM OF OFFICE BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1966 AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 1967. A motion was made by Mr. Droege and seconded by Mr. Niehaus that Ordinance No. 1, 1966 be adopted as read. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

Next was presented Ordinance No. 2, 1966: AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES FOR THE CITY ATTORNEY, CITY CLERK AND TREASURER, CITY ASSESSOR, CITY ENGINEER, CHIEF MAINTENANCE MAN, CHIEF OF POLICE AND CITY PATROLMEN, AND AMENDING EXISTING SALARY ORDINANCES TO CONFORM TO THE SALARIES AS ESTABLISHED IN THIS ORDINANCE. A motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Gormley that Ordinance No. 2, 1966 be adopted as read. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

The Acting Clerk presented Resolution No. 1, 1966: A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE UNINCORPORATED TERRITORY KNOWN AS FORT PERRY FOR FIRE PROTECTION FOR A ONE (1) YEAR PERIOD. A motion was made by Mr. Holtmann and seconded by Mr. Droege that Resolution No. 1, 1966 be adopted as read. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

Resolution No. 2, 1966 was then presented: A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY, AUTHORIZING PAUL HELLMANN, MAYOR, TO SIGN CHECKS TOGETHER WITH THE CITY TREASURER AND ALSO AUTHORIZING J. F. HOLTMANN, COUNCILMAN, TO SIGN CHECKS WITH THE CITY TREASURER ON THE BANK ACCOUNTS OF THE CITY. A motion was made by Mr. Droege and seconded by Mr. Gormley that Resolution No. 2, 1966 be adopted as read. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

In compliance with the provisions of the Kentucky Revised Statutes and the Park Hills Planning and Zoning Ordinance, Mayor Hellmann announced the following appointments; to the Park Hills Planning and Zoning Commission: Councilmanic member--

At this time Mayor Hellmann gave council a preliminary report on legislation being considered for the Ky. State Legislature relative to changes in the Planning and Zoning Statute. This information had been gotten from State Representative Kenneth Harper. It was the wish of Council that the Park Hills City Attorney send a letter to our State Representative, Mr. Kenneth Harper, asking that he use his influence to prevent any action being taken in the passage of this legislation until such time that the City Council of Park Hills had had an opportunity to examine in detail the proposed bill to determine its value and possible effect upon the City of Park Hills. A motion to this effect was made by Mr. Droege and seconded by Mr. Sorrell. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

At this point, Mayor Hellmann distributed to council members pamphlets dealing with the possibility of putting the paid employees of the City of Park Hills under the state wide county employees retirement system. No further action was taken on this matter at this time.

Committee reports:

Public Works Dept.

1. The City Clerk-Treasurer announced that in compliance with the directive given him by council at the December meeting, he had written the Northern Ky. Asphalt Co. enclosing a check in the amount of \$6080.02 being payment in full for the major street resurfacing done by this firm for the City of Park Hills and that same had been cashed. Therefore it was presumed that the Company had accepted this amount in full settlement of the bill for this service.
2. In the matter of the Amsterdam sewer installation, in front of the Scott residence, City Attorney Brooking told Council that in order to prove liability on the part of Mr. Scott or others it would be necessary to offer positive proof that the lateral line from Mr. Scott's residence had been installed by some agency other than the City of Park Hills. Lengthy discussion followed and the members of the Public Works Committee were directed to investigate the matter and to report back to the City Council and the City Attorney. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Sorrell that if the findings of the members of the public works committee produced sufficient evidence that the sewer damage was due to negligence of some agency other than the City of Park Hills that the City Attorney be directed to file suit against Mr. Scott for damages on the basis of evidence produced, but that if evidence was inconclusive, the matter be referred back to Council before any further legal action be taken. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.
3. The bill of the Terwort Plumbing Co. in the amount of \$1053.53 for work done in front of the Bresser residence on St. Joseph Lane was again discussed. Following discussion, and feeling that the bill was not commensurate with work done, Mr. Hellmann was asked to have Mr. Terwort appear at the February Council meeting.
4. In the matter of the Terrace Dr. sewer repair, the amount which was to be charged against two abutting property owners had not been determined. Mayor Hellmann was directed to secure this information from former councilman Norman Price for the next meeting.

5. Mayor Hellmann requested that the newly appointed Public Works Committee again take up the matter of the cause of the undermining of Rosemont Ave. and report back to this council.

6. Mayor Hellmann reported to Council that there had been an explosion in the sewer line adjacent to 1260 Audubon Lane. He reported on his investigation of the matter as to probable causes and damage done to the sewer line in that area. Under an emergency clause he had directed Votel Contractors to repair damages done to the City sewer system.

7. Mayor Hellmann reported that the Kenton Campbell Sanitation District in making certain repairs at the former Park Hills Disposal Plant had temporarily blocked the sewer lines leading from Park Hills into the disposal plant, resulting in a flow of sewage into the open. This had since been repaired and that condition no longer existed. He also stated that the Sanitation District had upon several occasions called upon the Park Hills Public Works Dept. to work on sewer lines leading into the disposal plant. Since by agreement with the Sanitation District they had assumed operation of the Park Hills Disposal Plant and the trunk sewer lines entering into same, Mayor Hellmann was directed to contact the Sanitation District informing them that Park Hills City employees would no longer assume any obligation as to the care, maintenance or repair of the disposal plant or its trunk lines.

Police Dept.

1. The monthly report of the Park Hills Police Dept. was presented by Mr. Feighery, received and filed.

2. Mr. Feighery presented the annual report of the Park Hills Police Department for the year 1965, which was received and filed.

3. Mayor Hellmann requested that a joint meeting be held by the members of the City Council and all members paid and volunteer of the Park Hills Police Dept.

Fire Dept.

1. Mr. Holtmann presented the report for December 1965 of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. which was received and filed.

2. Mr. Holtmann presented the annual report for 1965, which was received and filed.

3. The clerk was directed to prepare a letter to the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. in appreciation of its work during the past year.

4. In the matter of the sale of the Chev Fire Truck to the New Burlington Volunteer Fire Dept. Inc., the City Clerk read the Resolution, which had been requested by this City, from the New Burlington Volunteer Fire Dept., Inc., relative to authority to make this purchase and the financial arrangements for payment of the same.

5. Mr. Holtmann announced that in compliance with the request of the City of Park Hills the New Burlington Fire Dept. Inc. had purchased the necessary insurance covering the unpaid balance due on the truck and that a copy of this insurance policy would be delivered to the City of Park Hills at the time possession of said truck was taken by the purchaser.

6. The City Attorney was directed to write a letter to the New Burlington Volunteer Fire Dept. Inc. indicating acceptance by the City of Park Hills of the required resolution.

7. The City Attorney was directed to prepare for presentation all the necessary papers for the transfer, sale of, and delivery of, the Chevrolet Fire Engine Pumper to the New Burlington Volunteer Fire Dept., Inc.

8. Councilman Holtmann told Council that the newly purchased International Fire Engine Pumper had been delivered to the City of Park Hills and that the formal tests necessary for its acceptance had been run by agent of the Dept. of Safety of the State of Ky. on Jan. 9, 1966. The results of the tests had been given to Mr. Holtmann and Mr. Holtmann, along with the testing agency would inform the Ky. Inspection Bureau of these test results, and that formal acceptance of the new pumper by the City of Park Hills could be made only after acceptance by the Kentucky Inspection Bureau of these tests.
9. ~~Mr.~~ Holtmann told Council that some of the equipment which had been ordered with the newly purchased fire engine pumper had not been delivered at this date. Mr. Holtmann and the Park Hills Fire Dept. have a list of the undelivered equipment and they were to check with the City Clerk the specifications and bid to determine if this list was complete.
10. Mr. Holtmann told Council that although the newly purchased fire engine pumper had been delivered as of this date there were no evidences of transfer of title or of general warranty from the International Truck Co., the American Fire Engine Co., or Sutphen & Associates. Payment for the truck and all items was to be withheld pending receipt of these items.
11. Mr. Holtmann announced that a fire hydrant had been installed on Sleepy Hollow Rd. in the Golf Manor Subdivision but that such installation had not as yet been approved by the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Department since this department had been given no official notice of the installation by the subdivision developer.
12. A motion was made by Mr. Holtmann and seconded by Mr. Feighery that the City Council of Park Hills accept the newly purchased fire engine pumper and equipment subject to approval of the apparatus by the Ky. Inspection Bureau, said approval to be in writing, being one 1965 Barton American I.H.C. No. 2809, Model FGV 549 and that further that the sale and conveyance of the 1948 fire engine pumper be made to the New Burlington Volunteer Fire Dept., Inc., subject to receipt by the City of Park Hills of a chattel mortgage securing said vehicle and note in payment and that said vehicle be released at the option of councilman Holtmann when in his opinion the requirements relating to the sale of this truck had been met. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.
13. Councilman Holtmann requested that the City Council hold a joint meeting with the members of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. to discuss mutual problems.

Finance Dept.

1. Mr. Gormley presented the report of the general fund for the month of December, 1965, which was received and filed.
2. The City Clerk-Treasurer presented the semiannual budget report for the fiscal year 1965-66 which was discussed, received and filed.

Old Business

1. Off Street Parking--specifications for preparation of off street parking areas on the City right of way had been prepared by the City Engineer of Park Hills. Discussion of these specifications followed, and their acceptance or rejection was postponed to the February meeting

2. In the matter of the condemnation and demolition of a shed on lower Amsterdam Rd., no report was available. The clerk was directed to make a further study of the building code ordinance to determine if there existed within this ordinance provisions for the removal of such hazards.

Building permits:

1. The clerk announced that no building permits had been issued in the month of December.

Communications

1. The clerk announced the receipt of the certificate from Judge Omer Stubbs duly certifying that he had been elected and sworn as Police Judge of the City of Park Hills for a term of four years.

2. The clerk read a letter from the 1st Church of the Nazarene which had purchased the Meyer property on the Dixie Highway as a building site for a new church requesting that this property in compliance with the provisions of the laws of the State of Ky. be removed from the tax list of the City of Park Hills and that said property be made tax free. Following discussion, the City Clerk was directed to contact the Church of the Nazarene requesting that a plat of the exact area which it had purchased be given to the City of Park Hills and that upon receipt of said plat, that the city council of Park Hills would give the matter further consideration.

City Attorney report.

1. The City Attorney was directed to prepare an agreement between the City of Park Hills and property owners, which agreement would be signed by both parties indicating the financial responsibility to be accepted by each before any sewer work adjacent to the property in question at the time would be started.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION FEBRUARY 14, 1966 WITH MAYOR HELLMANN PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN DROEGE, FEIGHERY, GORMLEY, HOLTMANN, NIEHAUS, AND SORRELL PRESENT.

The minutes of the January 10, 1966 meeting were approved as read.

Delegations: Mr. William Terwort, plumber, appeared before council at its request to discuss the bill for work done on the sewer in front of the Breaser residence on St. Joseph Lane. This bill in the amount of \$1053.53. The amount of the bill had been questioned by council. Mr. Terwort was questioned by the city engineer and by various members of council as to the reason for this amount. Following a discussion, Mr. Terwort agreed to restudy the bill and present a report at the March meeting.

Public Works

1. Mr. Niehaus reported that he had investigated the undermining on Rosemont Ave. and that in his opinion there was some type of leak under the pavement and that when good weather comes this matter will be further investigated in an attempt to make corrective repair.
2. Mayor Hellmann reported that there had been no further trouble at the disposal plant and that this was now back in operation.
3. The clerk reported that to date the cost of snow removal had been \$829.22. Council was dissatisfied with the snow removal job which had been done by a private contractor and Mayor Hellmann appointed a committee of councilmen Niehaus, Sorrell, and Feighery to investigate the purchase of a utility truck with snow removal appurtenance.
4. The bill for the sewer work done by Votel Contractors on Terrace Dr. was apportioned by council as follows: To Tyrrell, \$66.43, to Tibbs, \$66.43, with the City of Park Hills bearing the balance of \$219.33. Mr. Niehaus was to inform Tyrrell and Tibbs of this division after which time they would be Billed by the City Clerk.

City Engineer Report.

1. City Engineer Morlidge reported as follows:
 1. Some progress has been made on the map revision showing plugs and mains but same was as yet incomplete.
 2. Advised the use of crack filler on the streets where the open cracks were not too wide, and the purchase by the City of a type of bituminous fiber to be installed where the cracks were too wide or too deep to be effectively filled with crack filler.

Police Dept.

1. Mr. Feighery presented the report of the police dept. for January which was received and filed.
2. Mr. Feighery informed council that he had been alerted by the police dept. that a Mrs. Thelma Frazier had reported to this dept. that at 5:15 P. M. on January 26, 1966 she had fallen on ice on the sidewalk near the intersection of Amsterdam and Sleepy Hollow Road. The police report indicated that Mrs. Frazier had asked restitution for costs and time off from her employment. From the time of the original report there had been no further contact by Mrs. Frazier with the City of Park Hills. A motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Feighery that if the City received further correspondence relative to this matter that the same be referred to the Park Hills City Attorney. Mr. Droegge, aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Niehaus, aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

3. Mr. Feighery presented a complaint by Hamilton Rd. resident on the operation of a "yarn shop" operated by Mrs. George Stenken. The complainant protested parking problems arising out of the operation of the business. Mr. Feighery and Chief of Police Schaefer gave reports of their investigation, and a sign erected by Mrs. Stenken advertising her business was held to be in violation of the city ordinance and the police requested to have Mrs. Stenken remove same.

4. The police dept. requested the installation of an additional telephone for exclusive police use. The installation cost would be \$211.55 with a monthly charge of \$16.50 following installation, this to be an unlisted number. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Holtmann that the installation be approved. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried. Mr. Holtmann then made a motion, seconded by Mr. Niehaus, that the city assume the monthly charge for the additional telephone in the fire dept. quarters which heretofore had been paid for by the volunteer treasury. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

5. Mr. Feighery submitted a resume of the preliminary study for a proposed 8 year program for the police dept.

Fire Dept.

1. Mr. Holtmann presented the monthly report of the fire dept. for January which was received and filed.

2. Mr. Holtmann presented two letters from the Ky. Inspection Bureau in which they formally acknowledged the results of the tests run on the new fire engine pumper and its acceptance as certified equipment by the Ky. Inspection Bureau.

3. Mr. Holtmann announced that the fire truck, Chev. 1948, which had been purchased by the New Burlington Volunteer Fire Dept., Inc. had been taken by the purchaser which had paid the \$3000.00 balance in cash, thus eliminating the necessity of a chattel mortgage being filed by the City of Park Hills and the City of Park Hills being recognized as having an interest in the insurance policy covering same.

4. Mr. Holtmann announced that all the equipment which had been a part of the new International fire engine pumper had not as yet been delivered. In this matter, he had written to the American Fire Apparatus Co., Sutphen & Associates, and the International Harvester Co. requesting that steps be taken by these suppliers to provide the missing equipment and/or services. He read an answer from Mr. H. A. Bentley of the American Fire Apparatus Co. stating that the material would be supplied as soon as possible. A motion was made by Mr. Holtmann and seconded by Mr. Droege that payment for the truck and undelivered equipment be withheld until all terms of the specifications be met and all equipment supplied. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

5. Mr. Holtmann announced that the required fire plug had been installed by the subdivider in Section 3 of Golf Manor Subdivision, and had been accepted by the fire department. The clerk announced

that with the acceptance of the fire plug by the fire department he would make arrangements to have the plat of this subdivision put on record.

6. Mr. Holtmann announced that an extended 8 year fire program was in process of preparation.

7. Mr. Hellmann announced that although the territory of Fort Perry was in the process of being annexed by Lookout Heights a contract had been signed by the City of Park Hills with the Ft. Perry Civic Assn. providing fire protection for a one year period.

Finance Dept.

1. Mr. Gormley presented the report of the general fund of the City of Park Hills for January 1966, which was received and filed.

2. There was a discussion of the full assessment problem and the 100% valuation of real estate as required by act of the State Legislature. The matter of franchise tax amounts was discussed, since these amounts were certified to the City of Park Hills through an agency at Frankfort, Ky. City Attorney Brooking told council that under the act franchise holders must present to the State of Ky. after March 31, 1966 the full value assessment of the value of real estate and franchise subject to taxation by the State and its municipalities. He advised that tax bills to franchise holders not be made out until after receipt by the City of Park Hills of the 1966 valuations made under the 100% full valuation project.

3. The City Attorney then read Ordinance No. 6, 1966: AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE TAX RATE OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS FOR THE YEAR 1966 AND LEVYING A TAX ON ALL REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY SUBJECT TO TAXATION FOR GENERAL PURPOSES; LEVYING A TAX FOR THE RETIREMENT OF THE BONDED INDEBTEDNESS; FIXING THE DATE OF PAYMENT, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO PAY SAME AT SUCH TIME. A motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Feighery that Ordinance No. 6, 1966 be adopted as read, and that furthermore, the entire Ordinance be printed as a legal advertisement in the Cincinnati Post Times Star as required by law. One insertion only. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

City Attorney report.

And that Councilmen Niehaus and/or Sorrell be designated to sign the agreement in behalf of the City of Park Hills and, that the City Clerk be directed to have copies prepared as per the specimen submitted for use in these instances. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

11. In the matter of the proposed suit against Robert Scott of Amsterdam Rd. re the Amsterdam sewer repairs, Mr. Niehaus reported that the committee of councilmen Sorrell and Niehaus along with the City Clerk had been unable to locate information which would provide a suitable basis for the institution of such suit. The City Attorney was directed to contact the Park Hills City Engineer relative to this matter and a motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Niehaus that if, after discussion with the City Engineer, there seemed to be reasonable grounds for the probable successful prosecution of a suit that the City Attorney be directed to file suit against Mr. Scott at a cost of \$35.00, for filing of the suit. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

12. The City Attorney told council that the preparation of a Comprehensive Traffic Ordinance had been delayed due to the multiplicity of present ordinances governing traffic control, but that he hoped to have the ordinance for presentation at the March meeting.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION ON MARCH 14, 1966, AT THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING WITH MAYOR HELLMANN PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN DROEGE, FEIGHERY, GORMLEY, HOLTMANN, NIEHAUS, AND SORRELL PRESENT.

The minutes of the February 14, 1966 meeting were approved as read by the clerk.

The regular order of business was dispensed with to accept the receipt of bids for the collection of garbage and trash for a two year period beginning April 1, 1966 through March 31, 1968. Only one bid was received. Bid #1--Frank Barth, Florence, Ky. whose bid was as follows: \$1072.04 per month, at a rate of \$.98 per residential unit, a total of 15,264.48 on an annual basis. The clerk pointed out that this represented an increase of \$.18 per unit per month over the present contract, or a monthly increase of \$250.44. Upon being questioned as to the cause of the sharp increase, Mr. Barth stated that it had been determined that he must operate under the federal hour and wage controls bill. Council asked Mr. Barth if it were later determined that he was not subject to this control, if such action could result in a lower contract price. Following discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Niehaus and seconded by Mr. Feighery that the bid of Frank Barth of \$1272.04 per month be accepted, subject to the determination that if the bidder is not subject to federal wage and hour controls that he would agree to make an appropriate reduction in the contract price. Mr. Droegge aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

Committee reports:

Public Works

1. Since Mr. Terwort, the plumber, did not make an appearance to discuss his bill for repairs done on St. Joseph Lane, this matter was laid over for further consideration.
2. The clerk announced that Messrs. Tibbs, and Tyrrell, residents of Terrace Dr., had been billed for their portion of sewer repair adjacent to their homes and had paid same. The clerk announced that Mr. Votel's bill covering this work had been paid.

Police Dept.

1. Mr. Feighery presented the monthly report for February of the Park Hills Police Dept. which was received and filed.
2. Mr. Feighery made a request that an ordinance be adopted by the City of Park Hills which would tend to protect members of the Police Force while making an arrest on private property. This matter was referred to City Attorney Brooking for investigation. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Droegge that the City Attorney be directed to prepare an ordinance as stated above particularly when police make an arrest on private property which is open to the general public. Mr. Droegge aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.
3. The clerk presented council a list of vending machine of all descriptions which were in operation within the City of Park Hills. This information was needed in connection with the new occupation license ordinance recently adopted by council.

Fire Dept.

1. Mr. Holtmann presented the monthly report for the month of February which was received and filed.

2. A motion was made by Mr. Holtmann and seconded by Mr. Feighery that the city attorney prepare an ordinance for presentation at the April meeting advertising for bids for the purchase of 500 feet of 1½" fire hose according to specifications as prepared by the Fire Dept. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.
3. The clerk announced that the fire answering phone service fee in the amount of \$300.00 had been paid to the City of Covington for the twelve month period ending June 30, 1966.
4. Mr. Holtmann told council that there still remained certain items which were not delivered under the specifications and terms of the newly purchased fire engine pumper. The items missing are on file with the fire department. He also announced that as of this date neither the warranty on the truck and chassis nor the title to the equipment had been delivered to the city.
5. A motion was made by Mr. Holtmann and seconded by Mr. Gormley that the clerk be directed that upon receipt by the city of Park Hills of the title to the truck and chassis and upon receipt by the city of Park Hills of the truck warranty from the International Harvester Co. to pay to the American Fire Apparatus Co. the contract price of the equipment purchased less \$1000.00 to be held in escrow pending the receipt of the missing items as set forth in the list maintained by the Park Hills Fire Dept. and as designated to the suppliers in letters addressed to the American Fire Apparatus Co. and the Sutphen Equipment Co. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.
6. All fire hydrants would be checked by the members of the dept. starting in the month of April.
7. Expected that the revised and updated map showing fire plugs and water main installations would be finished for the city in about thirty days.
8. Asked that the City recognize "Cleanup Week" during the month of April. In this connection Mayor Hellmann directed councilman Niehaus to contact the local office of the Ky. State Highway Dept. about cleaning up the area adjacent to the Dixie Highway..
9. The Clerk announced that the contract had been signed by Ft. Perry for fire protection, payment for same received and the contract in full force and effect.

Finance Dept.

1. Mr. Droege presented the monthly report of the general fund for February 1966 which was received and filed.
2. The city clerk announced that to March 11 a total of \$2060.00 had been received from the sale of the 1966-67 automobile stickers.
3. The clerk announced that the unified insurance policy on the city building covering all aspects of insurance had been received and was now in effect. This unified policy had resulted in the securing of additional coverage at a financial savings over the cost of the former "piecemeal" policies.

Old Business

1. The specifications for off street parking were again discussed. Following discussion, Mayor Hellmann appointed a committee consisting of councilmen Sorrell and Niehaus who were to meet with the City Engineer to discuss the contents of the specifications which he had set forth as required by the City for the construction of these off street parking areas.

2. The clerk announced that in conformance with Mayor Hellman's request he had examined the planning and zoning ordinance to determine what steps could be taken under this ordinance to secure the removal of a shed located on the Von Lehman property on lower Amsterdam Rd. He informed council that under this ordinance the city had the power to direct the removal. The clerk was thereupon directed to write Mrs. Von Lehman asking that this shed be removed as presently constituting a hazard.
3. The clerk reported he had not received any further information on the request of the Nazarene Church for tax free status on the property it had purchased on the Dixie Highway for the erection of a new church building.
4. The plat of the Golf Manor Subdivision Section 3 had not been put on record by the Clerk because of the failure of the subdividers to sign same although this request had been made to them.
5. The police dept. was directed to require that Mrs. Helen Stenken, operator of the Yarn Shop on Hamilton Rd. remove a sign from her window advertising this business as being in violation of the planning and zoning ordinance.
6. Lack of interest in putting the employees of the City under the county employee pension plan caused this matter to be deleted from further consideration.

City Assessor report

1. Mrs. Ayres, the City Assessor, told council that she had secured from the county assessor the new county assessments on all Park Hills real estate made in conformance with the 100% valuation law.
2. Mayor Hellmann, as a member of a committee to discuss Park Hills valuation said that he would call this committee into session shortly after April 15.

New Business

1. In the matter of receipt of bids, for leasing of a police cruiser, one bid was received. The bid of the Wellen Ford Co. Following receipt of the bid, Mayor Hellmann appointed Mr. Holtmann and himself as a committee to negotiate the bid and to report back to the City Council.
2. In the matter of the possible suit against Mr. Scott of Amsterdam Rd. re the Amsterdam Sewer repair, the public works dept. committee was directed to contact the contractor who had actually done the excavation necessary for this project for certain information to further determine the possible validity of filing the suit.
3. City Attorney Brooking presented a preliminary study of the comprehensive traffic ordinance. Council discussed these provisions and made certain suggestions for additional items to be included in the proposed plan, which would be presented in an ordinance at the April meeting. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Niehaus that the general plan for this ordinance as devised by the City Attorney be accepted, and that the ordinance be presented at the April meeting. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.
4. Upon council approval, Mayor Hellmann was directed to give signed approval to the request of the Jr. Board for Crippled Children to conduct a fund drive in Park Hills during the month of April, subject to the restrictions laid down by the City of Park Hills for such solicitations. The clerk was directed to notify the applicants of these restrictions.

5. City Attorney Brooking discussed for council a proposed amendment by the Ky. State Legislature to KRS 147 being a revision in the planning and zoning powers granted to municipalities. It appeared from his instruction that this revision would reduce the "home rule authority" of local planning boards. Council then went on record as being opposed to this change and City Attorney Brooking was directed to prepare a letter for Mayor Hellmann's signature, copies of which would be sent to local legislators. A motion to this effect was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Droege. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

6. Mayor Hellmann made a request from a Park Hills citizen asking that the City of Park Hills officially go on record favoring the establishment of an independent council of boy scouts for Northern Kentucky. Pending lack of information on this matter, it was tabled for further study.

7. The clerk was directed that all ordinances enacted by the City Council of Park Hills which contained fine or penalty clauses a copy of the same should be given to Judge Stubbs. This was approved on motion made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Holtmann. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION AT 8:00 P.M. ON APRIL 11, 1966, AT THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING WITH VICE MAYOR HOLTMANN PRESIDING IN THE ABSENCE OF MAYOR HELLMANN, AND COUNCILMEN GORMLEY, DROEGE, FEIGHERY, NIEHAUS, AND SORRELL PRESENT.

The minutes of the March 14, 1966 meeting were approved as read by the clerk.

Delegations and petitions.

Mr. Larry Brennan, of 824 St. James Avenue, asked about permission to pave the area in front of his house lying between the sidewalk and the street. This matter was referred for investigation to councilmen Sorrell and Niehaus.

Mr. Ronald Dermody of 836 Arlington talked with council about a sewage problem at his residence. Mr. Niehaus said that this matter had been investigated by Mayor Hellmann, John Vocke, and himself, and it was determined that the pitch of the sewer line was away from the city sewer. The matter was referred to the public works department who were to make an effort to determine the depth of the city sewer at this point. The committee indicated above would again meet with Mr. Dermody on this matter.

Committee reports

Public works

1. No action was taken on Mr. Terwort's bill since he again failed to show up.
2. The city clerk told council that Mr. Vincent Barth had agreed to act as surety for Frank Barth in the matter of the garbage contract. The City Attorney told council that the surety as proposed by Mr. Vincent Barth did not meet the regulations as per section 7 of the specifications and trash collection contract. The City Attorney was directed to write Mr. Frank Barth detailing the type of surety that would be accepted, and signature by the City to the two year contract to be entered into with Mr. Frank Barth for trash collection was to be withheld pending clarification of the item.
3. The matter of securing the cooperation of the state highway department in cleaning up the area along the Dixie Highway was in the hands of Mr. Niehaus who would take further action during the month.
4. No work had been done on the Rosemont undermining due to weather conditions.
5. Mr. Niehaus reported that in the matter of the Amsterdam sewer vs. Mr. Scott that he had contacted Mr. Robert Butler, who had supplied the name of the subcontractor who did the actual excavation on this project. Mr. Niehaus had had no contact as yet with the subcontractor and any action must be delayed pending this contract.

Police Dept.

1. Mr. Feighery submitted the monthly report for March of the Park Hills Police Dept. which was received and filed.
2. A motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Sorrell that Vice Mayor Holtmann execute the proof of loss claim to the Ohio Casualty Co. for damage done to the Park Hills Police Cruiser covering compensation for the repair of same. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Droegge aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; and the motion carried.

3. The City Attorney discussed with council the terms of the proposed ordinance dealing with the right of members of the Park Hills Police Dept. to go on to and make arrests on private property generally open to the public. Discussion followed, and the ordinance was to be presented at the May meeting.

4. A motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Droege that the bid of the Wellen Ford Co. for the lease of an automobile to be used as a police cruiser at a rate of \$140.00 per month be accepted. Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Dorge aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; and the motion carried. Mr. Feighery an employee of the Wellen Ford Co. abstained from voting because of possible conflicting interests.

Fire Dept.

1. The report of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Department for the month of March was presented by Mr. Holtmann, received and filed.

2. Mr. Holtmann told council that all equipment delivered as a part of the newly purchased fire engine pumper had now been delivered, and a motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Holtmann that the city clerk be directed to pay in full the claim of \$23048.00 as payment in full to the American Fire Apparatus Co., fulfilling the terms of the contract entered into, subject to the receipt of the warranty for the chassis and the title to the apparatus. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; and the motion carried. This motion rescinded a motion made at the March meeting in which the clerk was directed to withhold from full payment the sum of \$1000.00 until the delivery of certain missing equipment.

3. At the request of the fire underwriters, each fire hydrant within the city was to be checked, repairs if any made, and the plugs to be painted.

Finance Dept.

1. Mr. Gormley presented the monthly report for March 1966 for the general fund which was received and filed.

2. The clerk announced that to date 1451 auto stickers had been sold.

Off Street Parking Committee

1. Request was made by Mr. Noel Brinker of Montague Rd. as to the ownership of property at Montague and New Amsterdam Rd. The clerk told council in his opinion this property had been transferred to the State of Ky. as right of way area for the construction of New Amsterdam Rd. The city attorney was directed to investigate to determine if this were true.

2. The committee for construction of off street parking consisting of council men Niehaus and Sorrell were to meet with the Park Hills city engineer to discuss the specifications which he had drawn up for the construction of off street parking areas and to report back at the May meeting.

3. The off street parking committee said that it had on file requests for installation or completion of off street parking areas for the following--Mr. Marshall of Altavia Ave., Mr. Nowland of Breckenridge Rd., Mr. Brinker of Montague Rd., and Mr. Brennan of St. James Ave, and that these would be considered when final specifications were adopted.

Mr. Elkins of Old State Rd. had cancelled his request for permission to construct an off street parking area.

Sidewalk committee

1. Mr. Sorrell, councilman in charge of this committee, had received from Mr. Allen Smith, former councilman and sidewalk committee member, a list of sidewalks in the city of Park Hills which were deemed to be in need of repair.

Old Business

1. The clerk announced that the shed on lower Amsterdam Rd. had been removed.
2. The request for a tax free status of property purchased by the First Church of the Nazarene for construction of a new church building was not acted upon since certain property exchanged had not been completed, and the city attorney recommended that until such time as this matter was cleared up the tax free status not be granted.
3. Chief of Police Schaefer reported that the sign advertising the "Yarn Shop" on Hamilton Rd., a violation of the zoning ordinance, had as council had requested, been removed.
4. The plat of the Section 3 of Golf Manor Subdivision has not as yet been put on record due to failure of the developer to sign same.
5. City Attorney Brooking reported that at council's request he had written to local state legislators expressing opposition of this council to the passage of KRS 147 which would have changed the regulatory powers of local planning and zoning commissions.
6. The City Assessor announced that she had all the necessary figures ready for the committee appointed by Mayor Hellmann to consider re-appraisal of Park Hills property in light of the 100% evaluation law.

New Business

1. The City Attorney read Ordinance No. 11, 1966, AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ADVERTISING AND RECEIPT OF BIDS FOR FIRE HOSE TO BE USED BY THE FIRE DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Gormley that Ordinance No. 11, 1966 be adopted as read. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; and the motion carried.
2. The clerk read the request of the Northern Ky. Electrical Authority to have the city of Park Hills adopt the 1965 edition of the National Electrical Code. Discussion followed, and the matter was referred to Mayor Hellmann for study.
3. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Gormley that the City Attorney prepare for presentation at the May meeting a resolution authorizing the city clerk to advertise for employment of persons as patrolmen for the city of Park Hills. 4. Council voiced agreement that bids for major street resurfacing be delayed until the June meeting.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION ON MONDAY, MAY 9, 1966, AT THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING AT 8:00 P.M. WITH MAYOR HELLMANN PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN FEIGHERY, GORMLEY, HOLTMANN, NIEHAUS, AND SORRELL PRESENT. COUNCILMAN DROEGE WAS ABSENT.

The minutes of the April 11, 1966 meeting were approved as read by the clerk.

Petitions and delegations: Ex-mayor Tabeling was present and was recognized by Mayor Hellmann.

2. Mr. Nehring of St. James Avenue requested that council permit the use of the upstairs council chambers each third Sunday of the month as a meeting place for the Brent Spence Radio Club. Mr. Jack Warner, the president of the club, explained the nature of the organization. Following some discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Niehaus that the council refuse the request, based upon the premise that this was a private organization seeking use of public facilities. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

3. Mr. Dennie Hahn requested that council consider reducing the occupational license fee charged for motels, which under the new ordinance, had been increased from \$25.00 to \$75.00. Following discussion a motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Sorrell that Section 15P of the 1966 occupational ordinance be amended so as to fix the charge on motels at \$30.00 per year and that the city attorney be directed to draft an ordinance so amending the said occupational license. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; and Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

4. Mr. Hahn also spoke about the possibility of an addition being made to the Northern Ky. Community College. He reiterated his oft stated position that the additional traffic would constitute an additional hazard to the residents of Mt. Allen Rd. and suggested that council give consideration to reducing or eliminating Mt. Allen Rd.'s use for college purposes.

5. Mr. Hahn also requested that council go on record as favoring the installation of an additional outlet from I75 into Covington, in the Pike St. area.

The regular order of business was then dispensed with to permit the consideration of bids received for purchase of fire hose, as per ordinance and advertising. Bid #1: The Satchen Fire Equipment Co. A. Deluge, 800 lb. test 100% dacron, \$1.37 per ft., B. Deluge, dacron --wax and gum, \$1.47 per ft., C. Deluge, cotton and dacron, \$1.35 per ft., D. Buckeye, 100% nylon, 1000 lb. test, \$1.60 per ft., E. Buckeye, 100% nylon, wax and gum treated, 1000 lb. test, 1.70 per ft., F. Buckeye, nylon and cotton, 600 lb. test, \$1.55 per ft.

Bid #2: The American LaFrance Co.--Alfron double jacketed 100% dacron, \$1.25 per ft.

Bid #3: FyrFyter Sales--100% polyester fibre, 600 lb. test, \$1.35 per ft.

The bids were referred to Mr. Holtmann and Chief Dreyer for study, who reported as follows: A motion was made by Mr. Holtmann that the bid of Fyr Fyter Sales at \$1.35 per ft. be accepted, seconded by Mr. Gormley, with the understanding that the seller assume payment of the State tax plus the 2% discount allowed. Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Feighery aye; and the motion carried.

At this point Mr. Clem Hellmann, president of the Park Hills Civic Association requested permission for the holding of a memorial day parade on May 30, 1966 at 10:15 A.M. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Gormley that permission be granted. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; and the motion carried.

Committee reports:

Public works: 1. Mr. Niehaus reported that he had again contacted Mr. Terwort relative to the bill rendered for work done on St. Joseph Lane some months ago. He said that Mr. Terwort had agreed to reduce the total bill by the amount of \$72.69. Council felt that before payment should be made further negotiations should be carried on to arrive at a more equitable figure for this work, and Mr. Niehaus was directed to contact Mr. Terwort.

2. In the matter of the Dermody sewer difficulty, on Arlington Rd., Mr. Niehaus stated that in company with the city engineer he had examined this problem and was of the opinion that the condition existent was not a city responsibility. He did suggest that a later date the city consider the installation of a manhole in the sewer line in this area.

3. Mr. Niehaus stated that during the month of June the state highway dept. would clean up the Area of the Dixie Highway.

4. The city engineer and Mr. Niehaus were to meet on Rosemont Ave. on May 10 to further study the matter of the Rosemont undermining. It was suggested by council that they contact Mr. Carl Votel relative to repairs, but that no work be done until a price had been proposed to council.

5. Mr. Niehaus stated that in routine examinations that it was found that a portion of Mt. Allen Rd. was sinking. He checked the area and found a hole under the street of approximately 14 sq. ft. Mr. Votel was to meet with Mr. Niehaus to study this matter and make recommendations.

6. Former Mayor Tabeling addressed council on the possibility of securing federal funds either through grant or loan for major sewer repair. The council directed city attorney Brooking to write to the appropriate federal agencies seeking further information.

7. Mr. Tabeling also requested that in the major street repair for summer 1966 that portions of Lawton Rd. be considered for inclusion.

Police Dept.

1. The monthly report of the Park Hills Police Dept. for the month of April 1966 was received and filed.

2. Mr. Feighery stated that in reply to his advertisement he had received several applications as possible employees as patrolmen, but that he would report further on the matter in June.

3. Council approved the action of Mr. Feighery in so advertising for patrols as of April 1966.

4. It was stated that in the matter of the request sent to all owners of taverns and restaurants seeking permission for the police to enter upon said property for the purpose of investigation and arrest, said permission had been granted to the police dept. by all affected owners except Floyd and Mildred Rosenhahn.

5. The city attorney then read ordinance No. 12, 1966. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Holtmann that Ordinance No. 12, 1966 be adopted as read. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; and the motion carried.

Fire Dept.

1. The monthly report of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. for the month of April, presented by Mr. Holtmann, was received and filed.
2. Mr. Holtmann stated that all equipment guarantees and warranties on the newly purchased fire engine pumper had been received from the American Fire Apparatus Co. and paid for in full.
3. Mr. Holtmann told council that certain miscellaneous portions of equipment from other suppliers which had been deemed necessary to and a part of the newly purchased fire engine pumper had been delivered and payment made from the fire equipment bond fund. Council by voice vote approved the request of Mr. Holtmann that the city treasurer be directed to pay out of the fire equipment fund certain sums for the purchase of miscellaneous items still undelivered.
4. Due to the weather no action had been taken on painting the fire hydrants.
5. Announced that the major map revision showing water plugs, water mains had been completed by Mr. Morlidge and the city accepted said plat, and authorized Mr. Morlidge to have made at city expense three cloth copies and fourteen paper copies of said map revision.
6. Mr. Holtmann reminded council that the city had the obligation of paying the expenses of one member of the fire dept. to the fire school.

Finance Dept.

1. Mr. Gormley presented the monthly report of the general fund for April 1966 which was received and filed.
2. The city clerk then read the following applications for the renewal of liquor licenses: A. Carry out licenses--by Floyd Rosenhahn and Nocero Brothers. A motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Feighery that the request for renewal be granted and the clerk directed to issue licenses. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried. B. Retail liquor licenses--for consumption on the premises, applications of Floyd Rosenhahn, Ben Castleman, Olga Wooten, Helen Flannery, and Marie Sanzere. A motion was made by Mr. Holtmann and seconded by Mr. Niehaus that these be approved and the clerk directed to issue licenses. Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried. Mayor Hellmann stated that officials of VFW Post 1484 had requested an extension of time in securing said license, and recommended that since the deadline for securing of licenses was not until May 31 that some consideration be given by council to this request. Whereupon, a motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Feighery that the clerk be directed to issue such license for retail liquor sales to VFW Post 1484 at such time as payment of the fee was made. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.
3. Upon request by the clerk treasurer the following motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Holtmann, that the clerk treasurer be directed to transfer from the fire equipment fund into the general fund of the city of Park Hills as were spent by the city for the following purposes: Holding the election to provide for passage of bond issue to buy fire engine pumper; such sums of money as were expended from the general fund in equipping said newly purchased fire engine pumper and further directing the clerk treasurer to transfer to the bond retirement fund about July 1 all remaining unexpended funds in the fire equipment fund. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

4. Upon the request of the clerk treasurer the following motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Holtmann: To approve the payment from the bond retirement fund, the payment of the principal and interest on city building bonds in the amount of \$5000 principal and \$75.00 interest at such time as the bonds were presented at the Security bank for payment, also to direct the city clerk treasurer to deposit in a newly established Bond Payment Escrow Account at the Acme Federal Savings and Loan Association the sum of \$1000.00 as payment for City Building Bond #45 which matured May 15, 1965 in the amount of \$1000.00 and which bond as of this date had not been presented for payment, said account to be established at such time as the city clerk treasurer should decide, and provided that said bond was not presented for payment during the months of May or June 1966. 5. The clerk treasurer presented the following report to council relative to payment of the bonds due on the Park Hills City Bldg. addition. That there remained in this fund as of this date \$7519.03, outstanding against this balance \$6000.00 in principal and \$75.00 in interest, and that any balance remaining after payment of \$6075.00 would remain in the bond retirement fund towards to amortization of the fire equipment bond."

6. The City clerk treasurer gave the report of the Park Hills Board of Tax Supervisors which had met May 2, 3, and 4, reporting that no complaints had been received as to property valuations and that no changes had been made in valuations as established by the City Assessor. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Sorrell that the Report of the Park Hills Tax Supervisors be accepted. Off street parking.

1. A motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Niehaus that the City of Park Hills accept as the legal specifications for the creation of off street parking areas the set of specifications which had been prepared by Mr. John Morlidge Jr. City Engineer. Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Feighery aye; and the motion carried.

Old Business

1. The City Clerk announced that in the matter of granting tax free status to the Church of Nazarenes in property purchased for the erection of a church building, that since said church had as yet failed to provide the required plats that such status had not been granted.

2. The clerk announced that the status of Golf Manor Section 3 remained as before, unrecorded because of failure of subdivider to sign plat.

3. Mayor Hellmann announced that in the matter of the full valuation program affecting Park Hills real estate that the assessor had as directed by council increased all values ~~to two and one-half times~~ ^{to fair cash value} and that a committee consisting of himself, councilmen Droege, Gormley, working in conjunction with City Assessor and City Tax Collector, had examined each assessment, found them to be equitable and had made no changes therein.

New Business

1. City Attorney Brooking presented a copy of the newly proposed traffic ordinance. THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION AT 8:00 P.M. AT THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING WITH MAYOR HELLMANN PRESIDING AND COUNCILMAN DROEGE, HOLTMANN, SORRELL, NIEHAUS, PRESENT, AT THE START OF THE MEETING, COUNCILMEN FEIGHERY ATTENDING LATER, AND GORMLEY ABSENT ON VACATION.

The minutes of May 9, 1966 meeting were approved as corrected.

Petitions and delegations. Upon request made by Mr. Clem Hellmann, President of the Park Hills Civic Association, the city council gave its permission for his group to paint sign posts and street signs in an effort toward beautification.

Committee reports:

Public Works

1. There was no response from Mr. Terwort relative to the disputed bill for work done on St. Joseph Lane.
2. In the matter of the Rosemont undermining, councilmen Niehaus and Engineer Morlidge had met with Mr. Votel, contractor, to discuss the matter of repairs. Councilman Sorrell told council that in his contact with Mr. Votel, Mr. Votel was of the opinion that the repairs would not be of too serious a nature. The committee consisting of Messrs. Niehaus, Sorrell and Morlidge were directed to have Mr. Votel repair this street at an approximate cost of \$300.00.
3. In the matter of the undermining of Mt. Allen Rd., the same committee had contacted Mr. Votel and the committee was directed to proceed with this work.
4. The public works committee presented a bill from a plumber, Mr. Gavin, in the amount of \$183.24 against the City of Park Hills for work done on a sewer line in front of the Bilz residence, 1122 Mt. Allen Rd. Since there is no evidence that Mr. Gavin had been directed to proceed with such work on the City's behalf, the city felt no responsibility in the matter. Mr. Niehaus was directed to contact Mr. Gavin, so informing him.
5. The department informed council that there had been a major sewer break on a line in the rear of Rose Circle and that sewage was pouring into the open. Carl Votel had been called to repair same, and the work had been done as an emergency measure on a time and material basis.
6. An investigation of the Amsterdam Rd. sewer, opposite the entrance to the Vocational School, was made but no recommendation was forthcoming since further study was needed.
7. This department was directed to have Mr. Vocke check the Alhambra Ct. steps for needed repairs.
8. It had been necessary for the department to have certain large trees removed from the City rights of way. This work had been done by Mr. Elton. It appeared that one of the trees so removed was within the City of Covington, and the clerk-treasurer was directed to pay Mr. Elkin's bill, withholding that portion charged for the tree in question.
9. Mr. Niehaus and Mr. Sorrell had authorized Carl Votel to do certain sewer work in front of 1136 Old State Rd.

Fire Department

1. Mr. Holtmann read the monthly report of the department for the month of May 1966 which was received and filed.
2. The newly prepared plat showing locations of water mains and fire hydrants was now complete, and copies were available.
3. The clerk treasurer announced that the fire equipment fund was still being carried as an active account pending the receipt of certain items which had been ordered but not delivered.
4. Mr. Holtmann announced that the fire hydrants were now being checked and painted.

Police Department

1. The monthly report of the department for May 1966 was presented by Mr. Holtmann, received and filed.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION ON MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 12, 1966, AT 8:00 P.M. AT THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING WITH MAYOR HELLMANN PRESIDING, AND COUNCILMEN DROEGE, FEIGHERY, HOLTMANN, GORMLEY, NIEHAUS, AND SORRELL PRESENT.

The minutes of the August 8, 1966 meeting were approved as read by the clerk.

There were no petitions presented or delegations present.

Committee reports:

Public Works

1. Mr. Niehaus said that he had not been contacted by Mr. Terwort relative to the bill for work done on St. Joseph Lane near the Bresser residence.
2. Mayor Hellmann reported that the complaint registered by Mr. Martin Mitchell relative to a sewer stoppage at Terrace and Amsterdam that the public works department had secured the aid of the sanitation district and that there had been removed from the sewer line a temporary obstruction and that since the removal there had been no further problem involved.
3. Mayor Hellmann reported that relative to the complaint of Mr. Dale Adams of 1009 Jackson Rd. that it was found that the obstruction causing difficulty in the sewer line was due to a drainpipe from the above address which had fallen into the city sewer line and that he had so informed Mr. Adams requesting that the necessary repairs be made by and paid for by Mr. Adams. Temporary repairs were made by the owner, but these were deemed not satisfactory by the City and Mayor Hellmann had so notified Mr. Adams indicating that his liability for repairs still existed.
4. A letter had been received from Mr. Harry Aurandt, Atty. for Mrs. Bryant, at 844 St. James Ave. asking that the city take steps to prevent the flow of surface water onto Mrs. Bryant's property. The public works department had installed and extended blacktop curbing which would tend to prevent this flow of water.
5. Mayor Hellmann stated that he had been contacted by the fiscal court of Kenton county asking that Park Hills grant the county permission to repair and blacktop Montague Rd. in its entirety. It was requested by the fiscal court that the city of Park Hills temporarily deed to the county the area of Montague Rd. to be paved. Mayor Hellmann stated that following the improvement the street would again be deeded back to the City of Park Hills. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Gormley that the above action be approved and that the city attorney be directed to prepare the necessary formal resolution to carry out this motion. 6. Complaints had been registered with the public works department concerning an open sewer drain extending from Altavia Ave. toward the trunk sewer on Sleepy Hollow Rd. The public works department was directed to investigate and take steps to make appropriate repairs if needed.

7. A similar complaint concerning the flow of raw sewage onto the old street car right-of-way between Amsterdam and the street car right-of-way had been lodged with council. The public works dept. was directed to investigate.

8. Mr. Zweifel was given permission to construct an off street parking area in front of his residence according to city plans and specifications, reported by Mr. Sorrell.

Police Dept.

1. Mr. Feighery presented the monthly report of August for the Park Hills Police Dept. which was received and filed.

2. The resignation of Mr. Frank Smith as a patrolman for the City of Park Hills effective September 4 was read. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Niehaus that the resignation be accepted. This program of providing additional for school pedestrians would be augmented by the painting of additional crosswalks and signs.

4. Chief of Police Schaefer was directed to investigate and prevent dumping on Amsterdam Rd. at a location between the two Amsterdams.

Fire Dept.

1. Mr. Holtmann presented the monthly report for August for the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. which was received and filed.

2. Mr. Holtmann had ordered four lengths of fire hose for the exclusive use of the public works dept. but this had not as yet been delivered.

3. The fire hydrant painting program being continued.

4. The plat showing location of fire hydrants and water mains had been completed and was being prepared for posting in the city building.

5. The fire dept. was to notify the clerk of the number of fire lane signs--no parking signs which would be required to carry out the terms of an ordinance providing the creation of these fire lanes.

6. The city attorney was directed to notify the congregation of the Nazarene Church being constructed off the Dixie Hwy. in the City that the fire plug which had been agreed upon as a part of the construction of this building must be installed, as demanded by the Actuarial Bureau. The City Attorney was directed to so write the congregation indicating that the plug must be installed by the time the roof structure was completed.

7. It was reported that the Hahn Hotel and motels adjacent thereto had been closed. The building inspector was directed to inspect the area and report back to council if in his opinion the frame motels should be removed.

Committee reports:

Public Works

1. Mr. Niehaus reported that he had received another bill from Terwort the plumber relative to the work done some time ago on St. Joseph Lane in front of the Bresser residence. The new total was \$923.21 as against \$1353.03 from the original bill. Upon inspection it revealed that the new bill although lower in total showed increased rates for the labor performed and increased cost for materials furnished. The bill was still deemed unsatisfactory and referred back to Mr. Niehaus for further negotiation.

Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Feighery aye; and Mr. Gormley aye; and the motion carried.
3. The City Clerk-Treasurer made a report on the collection of delinquent personal property taxes.

Sidewalk committee

1. Mr. Sorrell told council that notices had been sent to certain residents concerning the necessity for repairing sidewalks. He had received a number of inquiries from these people wishing to know where the repairs needed to be made. The city clerk was directed to have prepared for Mr. Sorrell mimeographed copies of the ordinance providing for such repairs. Mr. Sorrell would check the complaints.

Police Dept.

1. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Gormley that Mr. Henry Klausner be appointed a full time paid patrolman of the Park Hills Police Dept. at a monthly salary of \$373.32, replacing Patrolman Frank Smith, resigned. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; and the motion carried.
2. Mr. Feighery submitted the monthly report for September of the Park Hills police dept. which was received and filed.
3. Council approved the action of Mr. Feighery in a letter sent to Mr. Glenn Lovern, Safety Commissioner of the State of Kentucky concerning traffic conditions on I75, in and adjacent to the City of Park Hills. In this letter Mr. Feighery had made several suggestions of steps to be taken to reduce the accidents in this area.
4. Council approved the action of Mr. Feighery in appointing Sgt. Edw. Ostendorf of the Park Hills Volunteer Police Dept. khh to act as juvenile officer for the Park Hills Police Dept.
5. Mayor Hellmann reported that in request to many complaints he had checked traffic conditions on Mt. Allen leading to the community college. He had checked various hours when the road was in heavy use by students of the school. He stated that he found a disregard of traffic regulations and following further discussion council agreed to ask the college authorities to block off, on their property, the access to Mt. Allen Rd. Any other action to be taken in this matter was deferred pending a trial at the solution indicated above. A motion to this effect was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Niehaus. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

Old Business

1. Mayor Hellmann reported that the surety bond from Frank Barthe, City Trash Collector, had not been secured, but he would continue further negotiations.
2. Mayor Hellmann announced that there would be a meeting of the new county-wide zoning commission on October 11, 1966 and that the necessary

agreement for Park Hills participation as a member had been received. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Gormley that the mayor of Park Hills be authorized to sign the agreement indicating the cities' willingness to join into the Kenton Co. Planning and Zoning Commission. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

3. The City Clerk announced that the Park Hills Planning and Zoning Commission had accepted for recording a small subdivision to be known as Section 4 of the Golf Manor Subdivision, consisting of one lot on Audubon Rd.

4. Mayor Hellmann was directed to contact the State Highway Commission about its assuming the repair and maintenance of certain heavily traveled roads and streets within the City of Park Hills. These streets were those which generally speaking were used by transient traffic going through the City of Park Hills.

5. Mr. Droege questioned whether the City Council of Park Hills should take some action on the ratification of the proposed new State Constitution to be voted upon by the electorate on November 8. City Atty. Brooking gave a resume of the provisions of the new proposed Constitution but no action was taken.

New Business

1. A letter was received from Miss Mildred Warner of 1137 Mt. Allen Rd. protesting the condition of a vacant lot and/or shed adjacent to her property. The Police Dept. was directed to investigate the complaint and following discussion the city atty. was directed to have for council consideration some information concerning the possibility of the adoption of an anti blight ordinance for the City of Park Hills.

2. A request was made by a girl scout troop to use the council chambers of the city building for a meeting place every other Saturday. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Sorrell that this request be approved. Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Droege aye; and the motion carried.

3. A request by Mr. L. Fassler asking that the city contribute money to help finance a Pee Wee football team within the community was denied on the basis that the City cannot contribute tax money for such an enterprise.

Building Inspector report.

1. The City Clerk in his capacity as building inspector announced that during the month of September 5 permits had been issued, all for repairs or remodeling.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION AT THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING AT 8:00 P.M. MONDAY, NOVEMBER 14, 1966, WITH MAYOR HELLMANN PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN FEIGHERY, GORMLEY, HOLTMANN, NIEHAUS, SORRELL, AND DROEGE PRESENT.

The minutes of the October 10, 1966 meeting were approved as read by the clerk.

Petitions and Delegations:

1. Mrs. Dorothy Osterhage of 1132 Exter Dr. appeared before council to make inquiry as to the ownership of the unimproved passway known as Runge Drive. She requested that the city make some minor repairs to the surface of this road so that it would be available to residents of the area who used it as a means of entrance and egress to garages off Exter Dr. Following discussion, councilmen Niehaus and Mayor Hellmann agreed to look into the matter and make some recommendations to aid in meeting this request. Mrs. Osterhage also asked about the possibility of securing street lights on Exter Dr. Following the usual procedure in such matters the clerk was authorized to prepare a petition to be sent to Mrs. Osterhage who would secure the consent of the Exter Dr. residents for the installation of said requested light, and the matter would be considered by council upon receipt of properly signed petition.

Committee reports:

Public Works -- Mr. Niehaus reporting

1. He had had a phone conversation with Mr. Terwort concerning the bill for work done some time ago on St. Joseph Lane, Mr. Terwort was to have phoned Mr. Niehaus again to further discuss the matter, but had failed to do so, and so no action was taken as of this date.
2. That although Park Hills had given to Kenton Co. all necessary authorizations for the paving of Montague Rd. by the county that no work had been done to date.
3. He had checked the complaint on a possible broken sewer line on Sleepy Hollow Rd. but had been unable to determine any flow in this area, but would continue investigation.
4. No further progress had been made on the possible repair of an Audubon sewer break.
5. That the overhead sewer adjacent to Miller's Lake would be repaired upon receipt of the necessary materials.
6. Reported that due to weather conditions, the Eton Asfalt Co. had not done any work on its contract for major street resurfacing. City Engineer Worlidge had contacted the company who had informed him that they still hope to do the work this year, but that should weather so prevent, the contract price as bid would hold good for work done this coming spring of 1967.
7. Miss Ruth Creighton of Alhambra Ct. had sent the city \$5.00 requesting that it be used to replace windows in the Park Dr. car stop. It was agreed that the public works department would install a piece of sheet metal at this area and Miss Creighton's donation be returned.
8. The matter of the purchase of a snow plow to be used on presently owned city equipment was discussed, and Mr. Feighery was directed to determine the feasibility of using this type of snow plow on the International Dump Truck. A motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Sorrell that if in the opinion of Mr. Feighery and the Chairman of the Public Works Dept. this purchase would prove to be feasible, that they be directed to make the necessary purchase. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Droegge aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; and the motion carried.

9. The City was in receipt of a letter from Mr. M. L. Reynolds of 1224 Amsterdam complaining about the vibration of the paving in front of and/or adjacent to his property. As this is one of the areas scheduled for resurfacing, under the City Major Street Resurfacing Plan, it was felt that this problem would be eliminated upon the completion of this project and Mayor Hellmann was directed to so notify Mr. Reynolds.

10. It developed that there was a need for additional sewer rods for the sewer cleaning equipment. A motion was made by Mr. Droege and seconded by Mr. Holtmann that this matter be investigated by the Public Works Dept. and that it be authorized to purchase such equipment as was deemed necessary at this time. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; and the motion carried.

11. The department was in process of sealing cracks in the city streets and this work would be continued.

12. The police dept. was directed to prohibit the dumping of any materials in that area between the two Amsterdam Rds. and further directed to cite to court all offenders.

13. The sidewalk repair program reported progress.

Fire Department

1. Mr. Holtmann presented the monthly report for October of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. which was received and filed.

2. That the location of the fire hydrant adjacent to the new Nazarene Church on the Dixie Hwy. had been approved by the department, but that due to the difficulty in locating the water main it had as yet not been connected. The Kenton Co. Water Commission had as of this date been unable to locate the exact location of the main.

3. That the condition of the Hahn Hotel--Motel had been reported to the State Fire Inspector.

4. Mayor Hellmann appointed Council man Holtmann to be the Civil Defense Coordinator from the City of Park Hills, holding membership in the Kenton Co. Civil Defense Organization.

Police Department

1. Mr. Feighery presented the monthly report of the Park Hills Police Department for the month of October 1966 which was received and filed.

2. Mr. Feighery presented to council the contents of two letters and the answers thereto from and to Mr. Glen Lovern, Safety Director of the State of Kentucky relative to suggestions made by Park Hills to decrease the hazards on I75.

3. Mr. Feighery presented a letter from Mr. Hankins, Director of the Northern Community College of the University of Kentucky in which Mr. Hankins stated that the University authorities had refused the request made by the City that it, the University, block off Mt. Allen Rd. at the point where it enters the ground of the community college.

Finance Department

1. Mr. Gormley presented the monthly report of the general fund for the month of October 1966 which was received and filed.

2. A motion was made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Droege that Mr. Clifford Kohlhepp again be employed to audit the accounts of the City for the fiscal years 1964-65 and 1965-66, being a twenty seven month period. Old Business

A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Gormley that Resolution No. 6, 1966 be adopted as read. 3. City Attorney Brooking reported that in the matter of providing some type of anti-blight ordinance for the city of Park Hills he felt that additional information would be needed and suggested that Mr. Dickman of the Kenton Co. Planning and Zoning Commission and other officials of the Urban Housing Commission be invited to attend a meeting of the Park Hills Council to discuss this matter, in an attempt to determine suitability of such an ordinance for this city. THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION ON MONDAY, DECEMBER 12, 1966, WITH MAYOR HELLMANN PRESIDING, AND COUNCILMEN GORMLEY, DROEGE, HOLTMANN, NIEHAUS, AND SORRELL PRESENT. MR. FEIGHERY WAS ABSENT DUE TO ILLNESS.

The minutes of the November 14, 1966 meeting were approved as read by the clerk.

Petitions and Delegations:

1. The clerk read a petition containing 16 single or double signatures asking for installation of street lights on Exter Drive. Mr. Holtmann informed council that with Mayor Hellmann he had met with a representative of the Union Light, Heat, and Power Co. about the possibility of installing lights on this street as well as in other selected areas. Under this proposal, many of the present incandescent lights would be replaced by the new type mercury vapor lamps, and lights installed in certain areas where it was deemed necessary.

A survey from the Union Light, Heat, and Power Co. making certain recommendations in this matter had not yet been received. Consideration of the proposal was delayed to a later meeting.

2. Mrs. Osterhage and Mr. Vagades asked council about the possibility of certain streets repairs on the unimproved and undedicated Runge Lane. Mr. Niehaus reported that since the street was not dedicated, no major improvement could be made, but that some consideration might be given to doing something on the S. Arlington Rd. right of way into which Runge Lane exited. This work would be done by the Park Hills Public Works Dept. when weather permits.

3. City Attorney John P. Brooking had contacted the Dept. of Commerce of the State of Kentucky about information concerning the establishment of an anti-blight ordinance for the City of Park Hills. The representative of this dept. who had been invited to appear at this meeting was unable to do so. Mr. Brooking had copies of a model anti-blight ordinance which had been prepared by the department of Commerce and suggested that the Mayor appoint a committee to read the model and report back at a later meeting, whereupon Mayor Hellmann appointed the council as a committee of the whole to investigate the matter and if possible have a report at the January 1967 meeting. Mr. Brooking was directed to request the Commerce Dept. to send a representative to the January meeting to implement council's apparent interest.

Committee reports:

Public Works, Mr. Niehaus reporting

1. No report concerning Mr. Terwort's bill for work done on St. Joseph Lane.

2. The complaint voiced last month concerning the condition of the bus waiting station at Park Dr. had been taken care of.

3. That a snow plow to be attached to the International Harvester truck had been purchased at a cost of \$348.33 from the Hummel Truck Equipment Co. as authorized at the November meeting.

4. A motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Niehaus that 50 3 ft. lengths of sewer cleaning rods and other miscellaneous equipment to be used in connection with sewer cleaning be purchased from the Flexible Pipe Tool Co. of Lima, Ohio, and that the clerk be directed to place the order. Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Droegge aye; and the motion carried.

5. That the Eston Asphalt Co. had informed the dept. that the major street resurfacing which had been contracted for by the city would be done in the spring of 1967, the contract price to hold.

A motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Droege that the time for completion of the street resurfacing project be extended, at the contract price received from the Eton Asphalt Paving Co. and that if possible the 1967 program of street resurfacing be included by the addition of areas at the same unit price of the previous bid. Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; and the motion carried.

6. The following projects had been delayed due to weather conditions: (a) Montague Rd. paving by Kenton Co. (b) Sleery Hollow sewer survey (c) Repairs to Audubon Rd. sewer (d) repairs to the Miller Lake sewer (e) repairs to Arlington Rd. sewer.

7. The clerk read a letter from Zion Lutheran Church indicating that the sidewalk repairs deemed necessary by the Public Works Dept. would be made weather permitting.

Fire Department, Mr. Holtmann reporting

1. Presented the report for the month of November 1966 of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. which was received and filed.

2. Presented a copy of a letter to the Covington Trust and Banking Co. as executors of the estate of Johanna Hahn, in which it was notified of the inspection made of the Hahn Hotel and cottages. It informed the executor that in the opinion of the Fire Dept. the present condition of this property constituted a fire hazard and asked that necessary steps be taken to make repairs to correct the situation. No answer had been received to date from the executor, and the city attorney was authorized to send copies of the letter to all the heirs of the Johanna Hahn estate.

3. Due to the inability to locate the water main, the required fire hydrant at the Nazarene Church under construction on the Dixie Highway, although installed, had not been connected. Exploration to determine the location of the main was being carried out.

4. Discussed for council the lack of water pressure at certain fire hydrants within the city. The Kenton Co. Water Co. is to install a new 12" main on Amsterdam Rd. but it was the opinion of the Ky. Inspection Bureau that this installation would not materially increase pressure at places where deficiency existed. Mr. Holtmann said that it may be necessary to clean the water mains or install new mains to provide proper service. A letter had been sent to the Ky. Inspection advising it of discussions being held with the Kenton Co. Water Commission for the purpose of devising means of improving the water supply and particularly to the areas where pressure was insufficient. The letter further indicated that the request made for the installation of additional fire hydrants on the Dixie Highway in the City was not specific as to the locations where the bureau suggested additional installations, since it appeared to this dept. that the area was adequately covered.

Finance Dept.

1. The finance committee submitted the report of the general fund for the month of November 1966 as prepared by the Treasurer, which was received and filed.

Police Dept.

1. In Commissioner Feighery's absence, Chief of Police Schaefer presented the November 1966 report of the Park Hills Police Dept. which was received and filed.

2. In an effort to improve traffic conditions on Mt. Allen Rd. an electric timing device, borrowed from the City of Ft. Wright, had been in operation with moderate success.
