THE CITY C OUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION ON AP RIL 10, 1967, WITH VICE MAYOR HOLTMANN PRESIDING, AND COUNCILMEN DROEGE, GORMLEY, NIEHAUS, AND SORRELL AND FEIGHERY PRESENT.

The minutes of the March 13 meeting and March 17 meetings were approved as read by the clerk.

Petitions and delegations

1. Mr. Ray Finke apeared before Council relative to a city storm drain running theough his property. He told Council that the drain is not satisfactory and that holes are appearing lin his yard. Mr. Finke stated that he had previously informed Council of this matter, nothing having been done to date, and that he wished to deny all responsibility for any injury or damage that might occur on his praperty as a result of this condition. Councilman Niehaus agreed to investigate the matter and take necessary steps to make repairs.
2. Mr. Frank Barth through Mr. Vincent Barth who holds the trash collection contract for the City of Park Hills appeared to discuss the matter of trash collection within the City. He told Council that the unsatisfactory services being rendered had been largely due to labor difficulties. Discussion followed, about this lack of labor, and the complaints that had been issued against Mr. Barth by the Kenton Co. Health Dept. due to what they said was lack of proper coverage at the right time in the landfill operation. Mr. Barth suggested the possibility of the City releasing him from his contract and either assigning or making a new contract with another contractor, Mr. Foltz, who had been aiding Mr. Barth by making certain of the biweekly collections. Mr. Feighery suggested that a committee be appointed to explore the possibility of securing satisfactory trash collection. Vice Mayor Holtmann appointed a committee consisting of himself, Mr. Feighery, Mr. Niehaus, and Mr. Sorrell to attempt to work out a solution. It was agreed that for the time being that the trash collection dates be set as follows: On Tuesdays and Fridays--all of that portion of the City South or East of the Dixie Hwy. plus the Dixie Hwy, and in the rest of the town collections being made on Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Committee reports:
l. Public Works, Mr. Niehaus reporting.

1. Temporary patching repairs had been made on Montague Rd. pending resurfacing of this street by Kenton Co.
2. Discussed the question of the possibility of maintenance of the new and old Amsterdam Rds. by the State.
3. That the St. Joseph Lane sewers and those in the Dickman apartment area had been cleaned by the joint effort of the owners of the subdeivision and the City.
4. It was pointed out that the City had no plan of sewer lines in the St. Joseph Lane, Dickman Subdivision section. The subdividers had promised to provide same.
5. That the condition of the sewer on Audubon Rd. near 1208 Audubon had been checked and the necessary repairs being beyond the capacity of city employees would be referred to Mr. Carl Votel, Contractor for
investigation and repair.

Fire Dept., Mr. Holtmann reporting.
l. Presented the monthly report of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. which was read and approved.
2. That the fire plug installed adjacent to the new Nazarene Church was deemed to be satisfactory although not yet checked by the fire authorities. 3. Progress was reported on the fire hydrant maintainence program. 4. That the Kenton Co. WaterCommission had completed its check for a possible solution of water flow to fire hydrants in various sections of the City. A flow test which was indicated had as yet not been received. 5. Mr. Holtmann also reported that the petition for street lights on Emerson Rd. and Montague Rd. had not been received. In the discussion, it was revealed that the request made by Mr. Kwozolla of Montague Rd. had been dropped. Any action on light installations on Emerson Rd. would be held up pending receipt of the necessary petition.
6. That he had been unable as yet to secure the number of fire lane signs which would be required in connection with this ordinance establishing fire lanes but that the clerk would be provided with a number of signs to be ordered.
7. That the 25th anniversary of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. and the Volunteer Division of the Park Hills Police Dept, would be made a part of the annual memorial day services held by the City and the Park Hills Civic Assn.
8. That he was checkingthe request made by the state for the installation of an additional fire hydrant on the Dixie Hwy attempting to establish location and price. .

Police Dept. Mr. Feighery repopting:

1. Presented the monthly report for March, 1967 of the Park Hills Police Dept. which was received and filed.
2. Reported damage to the Police Cruiser due to an accident by one of the patrolmen.
3. Presented letters of thanks to the Police Dept. for services rendered to various organizations and schools within the City.

Finance Dept.

1. Mr. Gormley presented the report of the general fund of March 1967 which was received and filed.
2. The Clerk-Treasurer reported that for the present fiscal year the sale of automobile stickers had amounted to \$8056.00.
3. Council directed the Police Dept. to begin to impose a penalty br the non-purchase of automobile stickers beginning April 17.
4. Resolution \# 3, 1967 was presented: A RESOLUTION APPOKNTING THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION (SUPERVISOR OF TAXES) FOR THE CIITY OF PARK HILLS FOR THE YEAR 1967; SETTING THE DATE AND TIME OF THE MEETING OF SAI D BOARD AND PROVIDING FOR NOTICE TO ALL TAXPAYERS OF SAME. A motionwas made by Mr. Gormley and seconded by Mr. Sorrell that Resolution \#3, 1967 be adopted as read. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr.Soprell aye; Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; and the motion carried. Mr. Feighery being absent at this time.

## Old Business

1. The possibility of putting the merger question on the ballot for the May 23, 1967 primary was discussed. Due to the inaction of the cities of Lookout Heights and Ft. Wright, the merger program was delayed.

New Business

1. Mr.Holtmann announced that the annual fire school conducted by the State would be held June 5,6, and 7, and that the City, following its usual procedure would pay the expenses of one man to this school. 2. Resolution \#4 was adopted: A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING DAYLIGHT EASTERN SAVINGS TIME AS THE OFFICIAL TIME FOR THE CITY OF PARK HILLS. A motion was made by Mr . Feighery and seconded by Mr. Gormley that Resolution \#4, 1967 be adopted as read. Mr. Gormley aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

City Engineer report

1. Stated that Mr. Robert Butler wished to sell a portion of his property for the construction of a residence. It appeared that since the description would be by meets and bounds and was not a subdivision development that permission for this development could be made given without action of the City Planning Board or the City Council. Council concurred.

Building Permits

1. The clerk announced that during the month of March 2 permits had been issued for aluminum siding jobs.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET INREGULAR SESSION ON June 12,1967 at 8:00 P.M. IN THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING WITH MAYOR HELLMANN PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN DR^EGE, FEIGHERY, HOLTMANN, NIEHAUS, AND SORRELL PRESENT. MR. GORMLEY ABSENT ON VACATION.

The minutes of the May 8, 1967 meeting were approved as read by the clerk.
Committee reports:
Public Works, Mr. Niehaus reporting.

1. The major street resurfacing program had been completed.
2. Report of needed street and sewer repairs. Mr.Niehaus in company with Mayor Hellmann had checked various locations needing street repairs, including damage in front of 1428 and 1430 Amsterdam due to the Green Line buses. City Atty. Brooking suggested that the City Engineer prepare an estimate of the costof repairs and that same be sent to the Green Line before the work is started. Also that jncluded in this estimate, be the repair for sewer damage resultant from the same cause. It also developed that a sewer in back of Audubon and Lawton Rds. needed ropair. Mr. Niehaus told Council that Mr. Carl Votel was to sheck and make the repairs here. Other sewers needing repair are: near 1208 Audubon, at Audubon and Park Dr. It was suggested that an open drain in the Park area along Hamilton Rd. be closed. Council received a complaint that damage was being done to a lawn at 1310 Old State Rd. due to street resurfacing. Other locations needing minor repairs to sewer and surface drain were given to the public works dept. Mr. Vocke of the public works dept. had been asked by Dr. Jolson to remove several dead trees along the Coram St. right-of-way. The City Atty. informed Council that this was the responsibility of Dr. Jolson. The Police Dept. Was directed to notify owners having trees and other foliage hanging over various roads that they must trim these trees. Mr. Sorrell was to check with the City Clerk to secure the names of property owners so affected.
3. Mr.Sorrell was to look into the matter of replacing one of the trees in the park area along Hamilton Rd., cost to be defrayed fromthe Decoursey fund.
4. Mr. Sorrell presented the request of Mr. Billiter at 1023 Lawton Rd. for permission to construct on the city right-of-way an off street parking area approsimately $5 \frac{1}{2}$ by 17 feet. Dis cussion followed and Council asked that Mr. Sorrell and Mr. Niehaus further investigate the request and report back to the next Council meeting.
5. The matter of repair of Alhambra Ct. steps was brought up and Mr.Niehaus and Mr. Sorrell were directed to contact a contractor to discuss the possibility of partial replacement.
6. The request for the erection of a stop sign coming up the hill on $S$. Arlington Rd. in front of 601 was introduced. Council felt that the installation of a sign at this spot would constitute a traffic hazard during the winter weather, and Chief Schaefer was directed to so notify the petitioner.
7. The replacement of the pickup truck of the public works dept. was discussed. The cost of maintaining this truck has become prohibitive and it was felt that a new truck should be secured having a minimum 81 bed $\frac{1}{2}$ ton capacity. A motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Mr. Feighery that the City Atty be directed to prepare an ordinance for presentation at the July meeting advertising for bids for a truck, specifications to be provided by the Council members of the public works dept. Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; and the motion carried.
8. Mr. Stanley Foltz, refuse collector, who had been carrying out Vincent Barth's contract for trash collection within the Cityof Park Hills, asked about having the contract made with him instead of Mr. Barth. It developed that Mr . Barth had been contacted relative to an assignment of contract but had failed to contact Mr. Foltz. Mr. Foltz agreed that if the contract were assigned to hi m, he would carry it out at the same contract price as per Mr. Barth's contrect. The City Atty. recommended that the City of Park Hills accept Mr. Foltz as Trash Collector in lieu of Mr. Barth and that the City hereby go on record as permitting the assignment of Mr . Barth's contrsct to Mr. Foltz at the Barth contract price. The City Atty. to make the necessary arrangements in drawing up papers for the contract assignment. A motion that this sug estion be adopted was made by Mr. Niehaus and seconded by Mr. Sorrell, Mik with the understanding that the assignment continue at its present price, until the expiration of the present contract on March 31,1968, and that furthermore the City Clerk be directed that beginning July 1, 1967, that the check for payment for trash collection be made payable to Mr. Stanley Foltz of 2515 Swan Rd., Crescent Springs, Ky., phone No. 34l-9945. Mr.Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; and the motion carried. 9. Mr. Suetzholz of 1007 Jackson inquired as to the installation of a street light near his property. He aaid that he wasopposed to said installation, but Mr. Holtmann in charge of the new street lighting program, informed Mr. Suetholz that at the present time no light installation was contemplated.

Fire Dept., Mr. Holtmann reporting.
l. The monthly report of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Dept. for the month of May 1967 was received and filed.
2. The fire hydrant maintenance and painting program was still in progress. 3. That flow tests of pressure and volume of fire hydrants at specific locations in the City conducted by the Kenton Co. Water Commission sin ce the installation of certain new water mains showed three improvements and one loss. Mr. Holtmann was to meet later with the Kenton Co. WaterCommission to further discuss this problem.
4. That the request made by the State for the installation of additional fire hydrants at certain locations within the city was being studied by the dept. in cooperation with the Kenton Co. WaterCommission.
5. That the street lighting program, partially completed had been delayed due to a strike by the employees of the Union Light Heat and Power Co. 6. That in company with Mr. Droege Mr.Holtmann had designated the locations for the installations of the no-parking fire lane signs and the clerk was directed to order 100 such signs along with 50 metal signposts for this use. 7. Mr. Holtmann had turned o区w to the Mayor a list of fire dept. property which had been damaged as a result of the recent city building fire.

Police Dept., Mr. Feighery reporting.
l. Presented the monthly report for May of the Park Hills Police Dept., which was received and filed.
2. The clerk brought up the matter of the $\$ 1500$ due Wellen Ford as payment for the present Police Cruiser which had been secured on a lease-purphase agreement. The clerk was directed to hold this matter over until a review of the finances could be made by Mayor Hellmann and the City Clerk.
3. Mr. Feighery questioned the probable use of the Hahn Hotel-Motel property. The City Atty, informed Council that this property had been secured by one of the heirs, Mr. Elmer Hahn and that it was his information that the property wo uld be developed into a business or office development, with efficiency
apartments renting on a monthly basis, which would involve extensive remodeling of the hotel proper. The use of the frame motel units not being involved. Mr.Holtmann asked that the building be inspected by the Fire Dept. and that any building permit be delayed pending approval by Council of the plans for remodeling and the usage to be made thereof. The minutes of the November 13 meeting were approved as read by the clerk.

Petitions and delegations:

1. Mr. Edward Schmidt representing GOLDEN RULE LODGE F \& A M \# 345 appeared before council requesting permission of the Council to permit the erection of a masonic lodge building on property fronting on the Dixie Highway, known as the Brophy property, which has a restriction limiting business construction to an area not more than 200 ft. from the highway., this being in that area zoned as Highway Business District. Following discussion, Council agreed to permit the possible construction of said building in an area more than 200 ft. from the highway, since it was deemed that a masonic lodge hall would be in the category of buildings permitted under Residence Zone $C$ and Mr. Brooking upon motion by Mr. Holtmann seconded by Mr. Nienkowe was directed to prepare a resolution for presentation at the January 1968 meeting granting Golden Rule Lodge \#345 permission to erect a
 Niehaus, Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried; Mr. Gormley absent from this vote.
2. Mr. Larry Marshall of 1048 Altavia who had been granted permission to install an offstreet parking a rea on the city right-of-way asked permission to temporarily instally a crushed rock parking area until weather permitted construction of the permanent one. A motionwas made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Holtmann that permission be so granted. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

Bid \#l: The Sutphen Co., of Columbus, Ohio, lla ${ }^{11}$ hose $\$ 1.75$ per ft., $2 \frac{1}{2} "$ hose, $\$ 2.45$ per ft. Bid \#2: The Fyr Fyter Sales of Cincinnati, $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " hose $\$ 1.33$ per ft., $2 \frac{1}{2}$ hose $\$ 1.79$ per ft., with a $2 \%$ discount for payment within 10 days. A motion was made by Mr. Holtmann and seconded by Mr. Sorrell that the bid of the Fyr Fyter Sales be accepted and that the clerk-treasurer be authorized to sign purchase order as indicated above. Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Niemeyer aye; Mr. Feighery absent at this vote and the motion carried.

Committee Reports:
l. Public Works Dept., Mr. Niehaus reporting.
l. The holes in Mr. Finke's yard at the end of Altavia had been filled.
2. A manhole cover had been put on the old concrete water tank at the rear of the Ammon and Macklin residences.
3. The new catch basin had been installed between the two Amsterdam Rds.
4. That the consbactor had been directed wíx to proceed with the Audubon Rd. sewer repairs and had agreed to so do, weather permitting 5. Mr. Sorrell asked that the Public Works Dept. investigate the condition s of $S$. Arlington and Rosemont as repairs on the roadway were needed there.

Fire Dept., Mr. Holtmann reporting.
l. The monthly report of the Park Hills Fire Dept.for the month
of November was received and filed.
2. Hydrant maintenance and painting deferred to next spring, due to weather conditions.
3. Submitted a report of his meeting with Supt. Vic Fender of the Kenton County Water Commission on the 24 th of November relative to water supply and hydrant installation. Summarized these were as follows: A. Hydrant installation--recommended that consideration be given in budget appropriation or other means of financing one hydrant on the Dixie Highway, 260 ft. North of Cov. Catholic High School driveway; a 2nd hydrant on the Dixie Hwy between the existing hydrants at the White Horse Tavern and the one North of said hydrant, there being approximately 578 feet between these two hydrants. The hydrants to be located on that side of the highway on which is located the $12^{\prime \prime}$ water main. Mr. Fender said that the Water Commission would install said hydrants on a participating basis with the City bearing a cost of $\$ 500$ for each fire hydrant.
B. Improving water supplies to hydrants and residences: Recommendid arrangement for financing a water connection between the end of the 6" line at Breckenridge and a $6^{\prime \prime}$ line on Park Drive, a distance of approximately 550 ft . as per the water commissions plans. For this installation it wouldbe necessary that the City of Park Hills secure an easement through a portion of Devou Park from the City of Covinton, and that the installation would be made by the Water Commission on a participating basis at a cost of $\$ 2.50$ per ft. to the City of Park Hills. The construction of another line between the line at the end of Fmerson Rd. down the hill to 1037 Montague a distance of about 400 ft . or in lieu of this connection a connection made between the end of the $6^{\prime \prime}$ line at 1037 Montague and a line in Amsterdam Rd. which comes up Amsterdam to the end of Rose Circle. This extension would be approximately 700 feet and might involve further negotiation with the City of Covington since a portion of this line might be in that municipality. He asked that this latter facet of the question be investigated by the City Engineer and the City Attorney. Suggested that in an effort to improve the water supply at the end of Scenic and Cecelia that it might be neccessary to continue the line from Far Hills to the end of Scenic, a distance of about a thousand feet to fprovide additional water for Exter Drive Two solutions were offered: extending aline of about 1000 feet from the end of Far Hills or replacing the present $6^{\prime \prime}$ line in S. Arlindton between the Dixie Highway and Cecelia Avenue with an $8^{\prime \prime}$ line, a distance of $800 f$ eet. He also reported that he had suggested to Mr. Fender that in order to give the northern section of Park Hills a better water supply that the Kenton Co. Water Commission should at its expense consider the installation of a new transmission water line through Park Hills from therecently completed line into Lookout Hgts. He also told Council that Mr. Fender would have the people of his department check all valves on the lines supplying the City of Park Hills to determine that they were open.
4. Told Council that all streets lights recently ordered had been installed except the one at 835 Arlington which was delayed gending the granting of an easement or right of way by one property owner. 5. Indicated that he had made a check with the ULH\&P Co. about the installation of additional street lighting units on the Dixie Highway, and that the supplier had recommended the installation of 6 additional lights in this area. Any action on this matter was deferred. 6. New flourescent tubes had been installed in the fire dept. area of the City Building.
7. Upon Mr. Holtmann's inquiries relative to the status of the condemnation suit directed against the Hahn Hotel-Motel property, a long discussionfollowed. To date, Judge Stubbs who had heard the case had not rendered a decision. Mayor Hellmann was directed to contact Judge Stubbs to ask when such decision would be given.

Police Dept., Mr. Feighery reporting:

1. Presented the report for the police dept. for the month of November 1967, which was received and filed.
2. Read a letter from the Greater Cinti. Airport thanking the City for the aid given by the Police Dept. at the site of the Plane crash on November 20.
3. Introduced the question as to the authority under wich all police would operate when aiding at an emergency situation at the Greater Cinti. Airport. City Atty. Brooking informed Council that the authority of the Park Hills Police, was by statute, limited to Kenton County and that no arrests could be made by Park Hills policemen $女$ while in Boone Co. and acting only under the authority of the Park Hills Police Chief. Following discussion, upon request the City Atty. was directed to write the Office of the Ky. Attorney General for a further delineation of authority of the Park Hills Police under this and similar situations.
4. Mr. Feighery informed Council that he would find it necessary, due to the force of personal business, to resign as a Park Hills City Councilman after January l, 1968 . He asked that Council give consideration to the appointment of Mr. Jack Ehrman a Volunteer member of the Park Hills Police Dept. as his replacement following his proposed resignation. Councill agreed to take under consideration Mr. Feighery's request but would take no action until such time as Mr. Feighery's resignation had been presented and accepted.
5. There was a discussion of the use of the Park Hills Police cruiser for ambulance service into the City of Bookout Heights, which in the recent November election had foted to merge with the City of Ft. Wright. Pending clarification on an atty general ruling as to the exact status of the City of Ft. Wright following its merger vote, Mr. Feighery indicated that the Park Hills ambulance would make runs into this area on a temporary basis.

Finance Dept.

1. Mr. Droege presented the monthly report of the general fund for the month of November was peceived and filed.
2. The City-Clerk-Treasurer presented to the City Atty. the names of several persons doing business within the City of Park Hills who had failed to secure occupational licenses although several requests for said payments had been sent them by the clerk. Council directed the City Atty. to pursue such steps as were deemed necessary to enforce the terms of the occupational license ordinance including citations to the Park Hills Police Court.
3. The Clerk-Treasurer indicated that he was in receipt of a bill in the amount of $\$ 125.00$ being the balance due to the general contractor for the restoration of the City Bldg. after the fire. He was directed by Council tot ake no action in paying this bill but to ask the contractor to contact the building repair committee concerning certain items deemed unacceptable at this time.

City Engineer's report.

1. Brought up the matter of the question of the responsibility of the Sanitation District for the maintenance of certain sewer lines and a disposal plant formerly operated by the City of Park Hills. A
letter to Mayor Hellman was presented in which a line servicing Lookout Heights and which had been installed by the Sanitation District was deemed by the Sanitation District to be the responsibility of the City of Park Hills for maintenance and repair, there being at this time a break in that line. In view of arrangements made with the Sanitation District at the time it took over operation of the Park Hills disposal plant, this directive se日med in vidation of said original agreement, and the City of Park Hills maintains that it will continue to look to the Sanitation District for maintenance and repair of this and certain other trunk lines leading into the disposal plant.
2. Mr. Morlidge, City Engineer, stated that he had checked a so-called areaway extending from upper Jackson toward lower Jackson, and that this was a city right of way although used as a private driveway for the garaging of automobiles at the rear of a residence located on Cleveland Avenue.

City Attorney's report.
l. The City Attorney presented Ordinance No. 14, 1967: AMENDMENT OF ORDINANCE 17, 1966 PERTAINNING TO TRAFFIC AND PARKING IN THE CITY OF PARK HILLS. A motion was made by Mr. Droege and seconded by Mr. Holtmann that Ordinance No. 17, 1967 be adopted as read. Mr. Droege \&ye, Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.
2. The City Atty, presented Ordinance No. 15: AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING MEASURES TO BE TAKEN WHEN CONDITIONSINDICATE CERTA IN AREAS, PLACES OR DWELLINGS OR STRUCTURES ARE IN NEED OF REPAIR, CLOSING OR DEMOLITION OF UNFIT DWELLINGS OR STRUCTURES WITH DEFINED STANDARDS, NOTICE, HEARING AND MACHINERY FOR RECTIFYING ANY OF SUCH CONDITIONS. A motion was made by Mr. Niehaus and seconded by Mr. Droege that Ordinance No. 15, 1967 be adopted as read. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr . Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.
3. The City Attorney then presented Ordiance No. 16, 1967: AN ORDINANCE APPOINTING AHOUSING COMMISSION FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROTECTING THE HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE OF THE RESIDENTS OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY: A motion was made by Mr. Feighery ani seconded by Mr. Sorrell that Ordinance No. 16 be adopted as read. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; and the motion carried. 4. The City Atty, then presented Ordinance No。17,1967: AN ORDINANCE APPOINTING THE POLICE CHIEF AND FIRE CHIEF OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY, THE PUBLIC OFFICER THEREOF. A motion was made by Mr. Holtmann and seconded by Mr. Sorrell that Ordinance No. 17,1967 be adopted as read. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

A motion was made by Mr. Droege and seconded by Mr. Holtmann that Mayor Hellmann be directed to write the Ky. State Representative and the Ky. State Senator from the District representing Park Hills in the Ky legislature requesting that he introduce a bill into the 1968 session of the legislature asking that Section 424 of KRS, requiring newspaper publication of ordinances be repealed for cities of the 4 th, 5 th, and 6 th classes, as being an unnecessary burden upon the local taxpayer. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

## Old Business:

1. As a reinforcement, of the decision reached by this council, concerning the rendering of a judgment in the case of the City of Park Hills vs. Elmer Hahn, amotion was made by Mr. Holtmann and seconded by Mr. Niehaus that Judge Stubbs be requested by letter to render an immediate decision in this case. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Holtmann aye;

Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.
New Buainess:

1. The Chief of the Park Hills Fire Dept. was authorized to attend at City expense a meeting at Frankfort relative to legislation concerning appropriations by the State Legislature for volunteer fire departments.
2. The clerk presented a petition signed by residents of Mt. Allen Rd., requesting installation of so-called traffic "bumps" across the street in an effort to reduce hazardous traffic. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded b Mr. Sorrell that 2 speed reduction "bumps" be installed at locations to be designated by the saf'ety dept. on Mt. Allen Rd . with the work to be done by an outside contractor, weather permitting. The clerk to secure the necessary traffic signs to be installed indicating the presence of said "bumps." Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery a;e Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motion carried.

Building Permits:

1. The clerk announced that during the month of November one building permit for construction of a one-family dwelling on Sleepy Hollow Road had been issued.

Communications:

1. An acknowledgement for the floral offering sent to Mr. \&c Mrs. Andrew W. Clark's funeral. Mr. Clark had served for a number of years as the City Atty. of the City of Park Hills, and he and Mrs. Clark had lost their lives in the plane crash at the local airport onNov. 20.
2. A request from the local Chamberof Commerce that the City of Park Hills go on record as being in favor of the establishment of a 4 year college or university as a branch of the University of Ky. to be located in Noxthern Ky. A motion was made by Mr. Feighery and seconded by Mr. Droege that the mayor of the City of Park Hills be directed to write a letter to be sent to the local Chamber of Commerce favoring the establishment of a 4 year college in the local area. Mr. Droege aye; Mr. Feighery aye; Mr. Holtmann aye; Mr. Niehaus aye; Mr. Sorrell aye; and the motioncarried.
3. A letter from Mr. Malcolm MaDonell of Breckenridge Rd., Park Hills, expressing his appreciation to the City for the installation of a street lighting unit near the end of Breckenridge Rd.
4. A letter from Mrs. Richard Wachs expressing acknowledgement of the receipt of a resolution passed by the City of Park Hills upon the services rendered the city by her recently deceased husband, Lt. Richard Wachs, a member of the Volunteer Fire Dept.

This is in response to your inquiry of December 18, 1967, regarding the recent disaster in Boone County, Kentuck, when a commercial airliner crashed near the Boone County Airport.

Park Hills is a fourth class city in Kenton County which is adjacent to Boone County. As the City Attorney of Park Hills, you request the extent of the authority of the Park Hills Police who were dispatched to the scene of the disaster upon the request of Boone County officers. Apparently, your officers exercised the general authority of peace officers at the scene. We think your questions can be answered on the basis of previous opinions of this office which we are enclosing.

Authority for actions by police of a city in one county at the scene of a disaster in an adjacent county may be found in Chapter 39 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, the chapter governing National and State Defense. See KRS 39.400 through KRS 39.432; OAG 67-354 (pages five and six)

and OAG 63-224. In KRS 39.401 "Civil Defense" (the subject matter of KRS 39.400 to KRS 39.432), is broadly defined as including not only emergency functions for disasters caused from enemy attack, sabotage, or other hostile action, but also for disasters resulting from fire, flood or other causes. There is no question that the crash of a commercial airliner resulting in death of many persons and injury to many others comes within the ambit of KRS 39.400 to KRS 39.432. KRS 39.415 and KRS 39.416 provide for the interchange of services and facilities between counties and cities, and KRS 39.417 provides that when employees of any county or city are rendering outside aid pursuant to KRS 39.415, they have the same powers and privileges which apply to them when they are acting within their own territorial jurisdiction. There can be no doubt that police officers of the City of Park Hills may be utilized at air disasters in Boone County pursuant to KRS Chapter 39. When they do so, under KRS 39.417 they have the powers of peace officers in Boone County.

The second question concerns the validity of arrests by Park Hills officers under the above circumstances. They having authority under KRS Chapter 39 to act in the premises, it follows that the arrests they make under state law in Boone County are lawful if they would be lawful in Park Hills. That is, they are authorized to arrest for misdemeanors committed in their presence and for felonies upon probable cause. KRS 431.005; OAG 63-448; OAG 62-981; OAG 60-595.

Your third question relating to acts of the Park Hills Police beyond their jurisdiction without authority is rendered moot by the disposition of the first two. Suffice

it to say that, assuming they are properly acting under KRS Chapter 39, their liability under the circumstances would generally be governed by the same principles as if they were acting within their own jurisdiction.

You also ask for the Kentucky law as to aid from various policemen from foreign cities and counties in the event of a disaster. This law is contained in the provisions of KRS Chapter 39 previously referred to. There is additional authority for more formal agreements in KRS 65.210 to KRS 65.300, the Interlocal Cooperation Act.

The next question is what Park Hills Police must do in order to obtain authority to enforce state law outside of Park Hills, but within Kenton County in which it is located. The answer is they need do nothing because KRS 95.740 vests fourth class city police officers with the powers of peace officers in enforcing the laws of the state throughout the county in which they are located. See OAG 63-448, OAG 62-981, and OAG 60-595.

When such officers are called upon to assist in the event of a disaster outside of Kenton County, they must act pursuant to the provisions of KRS Chapter 39 referred to above. It may also be observed that the Governor has authority to order them out under such circumstances. KRS 39.408 .

Finally, you wish to know what such officers must do in order to be able to enforce Kentucky law when called to Ohio. The answer is that generally speaking, peace officers of this state, whether they be state, county, or city, have no authority as peace officers beyond the territorial limits of Kentucky in the absence of reciprocal legislation or an

interstate agreement. See OAG 65-762. There is no reciprocal legislation or interstate agreement between Ohio and Kentucky concerning such a disaster as the Boone County air crash. It follows that any officers of this state acting in Ohio under similar circumstances would be acting under Ohio law as private citizens, and not under Kentucky law. If you desire authoritative information on the extent of their powers in Ohio in the event of an emergency, we suggest that you contact the Attorney General of Ohio. Of course, Ohio officers coming to Kentucky in similar circumstances would have no greater authority than other private citizens in this state. See OAG 65-762. They may not generally be brought in as peace officers. See Kentucky Constitution § 225.

You also ask from whom the authority comes when Park Hills Police are acting outside the City of Park Hills, but within Kenton County and also when they are acting outside Kenton County. So long as they are acting within Kenton County the authority to enforce state laws is vested in them by KRS 95.740 as previously mentioned. When they are acting outside Kenton County the authority must come from the Governor under KRS 39.408, and from the chief executives and legislative bodies of cities and counties under KRS 39.414, KRS 39.415 and KRS 39.416. In your letter, you do not outline the exact procedure by which the request for aid emanated from Boone County and was fulfilled by Park Hills. We gather that because of the exigencies of the emergency situation, action in the county and city, respectively, was rather informal, but that neither the chief executive nor the legislative body of the county or the city has questioned it. We deem the exact details to be immaterial so long as an official with authority in each jurisdiction made the decision at the time. As we have previously pointed out, the request

for aid and the fulfillment of it were both expressly authorized by the provisions of KRS Chapter 39 referred to above. Thus, the police officers of Park Hills were at least de facto peace officers under the applicable provisions of KRS Chapter 39, and this was sufficient to vest in them the powers of peace officers in enforcing state laws in Boone County. See Layne v. Commonwealth, Ky., 254 S.W. 2d 724 (1953).

We trust that the information you requested concerning the Federal Bureau of Investigation is rendered unnecessary by the above.

To summarize, the police of Park Hills, Kentucky in Kenton County may on request of Boone County officials pursuant to applicable provisions of KRS Chapter 39 assist at the scene of an air disaster in Boone County; and, when they do so, they have the powers of a peace officer in enforcing the laws of this state.

We trust that the enclosed opinions sufficiently dispose of your questions.
