THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION AT THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING ON MONDAY, JANUARY 21, 1985, AT 8:00 P.M., WITH VICE-MAYOR FANGMAN PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN HELLMANN, OSTERHAGE, SORG, SORRELL AND WEHRMEYER PRESENT. ABSENT: MAYOR NIEHAUS

Vice-Mayor Fangman informed Council that a selection must be made by the members of a person to preside over the meeting, as necessary by law. Thereupon, a motion was made by Councilman Osterhage and seconded by Councilman Sorg that Vice-Mayor Fangman be appointed as Acting Mayor to preside over this meeting. Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Sorg, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; and the motion carried.

A motion was made by Mr. Wehrmeyer and seconded by Mr. Sorg that the minutes of the December 10, 1984, meeting be approved as submitted. Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Sorg, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; and the motion carried.

PETITIONS & DELEGATIONS

1. Mr. Gofton Ware, Attorney for the Kenton County & Municipal Planning & Zoning Commission, appeared before Council and explained in detail the voting procedure of the Commission. Mr. Ware informed Council that a majority of Commission members must pass the vote. With the proposed membership to be increased to 19, a majority vote would be 10.

Mr. Ware also noted that member cities do not contribute to the Commission. The Kenton Co. Fiscal Ct. underwrites the expenses of this Commission, starting out with \$500.00, which has never increased. The Commission operates on fees received from applicants for zone changes, plats, etc. The KC&MP&ZC is not supported by any tax money.

Mr. Ware requested the City of Park Hills to pass the proposed amendment for increasing membership to the Commission to 19 to allow growing cities to join the organization. The object is to have all cities of 5th class or greater be represented. This will be taken under advisement by City Council.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Park Hills Housing Authority - nothing further.

2. Dixie Hwy. Survey (Toebben property) - Mr. Wehrmeyer, in reading the Police Dept. monthly report, told Council that Chief Ostendorf reported he had contacted John Toebben; tires have been removed, and 70% of the junked cars are gone. Mr. Wehrmeyer noted the Dixie Hwy. cleanup has been in effect for the past 4 years, and just recently information has been received that Police permission has to be given to remove such junked cars where no title is in effect. Progress has been made by Mr. Toebben in cleaning up his property, but Council feels a close watch should be kept on the cleanup procedure.

Mr. Wehrmeyer requested the Clerk to advise the Police Chief of Council's feeling regarding this cleanup.

3. Ordinance Codification - Mr. Carey, the City Attorney, announced that a law clerk has been selected, who will be starting next week on chapter headings to codify the ordinances into. The clerk will be in the City approximately three or four weeks, pulling together Park Hills ordinances for completion. This work will be done in the law offices of Mr. Carey. Minutes - 1/21/85 - Page 2

4. Proposed traffic/parking ordinance - Mr. Wehrmeyer, Chariman of this committee, informed Council of the progress made in preparing changes of the traffic ordinance. Copies of the proposed snow emergency ordinance, which includes several streets within the City to which the ordinance would be applicable, together with a report submitted by the City Attorney, were given to each councilman. Mr. Carey will submit the proposed ordinance for its first meeting at the February 11th meeting.

Vice-Mayor Fangman requested Mr. Wehrmeyer hold another committee meeting within the next two weeks and instruct the Council that if any questions arise please submit them to such committee, who, in turn, will make recommendations on same to the City Attorney for inclusion in the proposed ordinance. Mr. Carey announced that copies of the 1966 traffic ordinance are available to any Council member for study. The proposed traffic ordinance will be amending the original 1966 ordinance. This ordinance will remain in effect and proposed changes will be made to same. When questioned by Mr. Osterhage, Mr. Carey informed Council that the 2:00 am to 6:00 am restricted parking section of the ordinance will remain the same.

5. Proposed occupational license ordinance - Mr. Carey announced that two ordinances have been prepared on this subject; one making general contractors responsible for payroll taxes, and the second making such contractor responsible for occupational licenses for subcontractors. Vice-Mayor Fangman suggested Council study both ordinances and submit any suggestions to the finance committee, who will be handling same.

Mr. Carey also brought before Council the subject of charging occupational license fees for outside salesmen employed within the City. This matter is covered in the proposed ordinance re payroll tax and he sought Council's attention to this particular section of the ordinance.

6. Application for home businesses in Park Hills relating to the City's zoning ordinance - It has been brought to the attention of the City that several residents are conducting businesses out of their homes, in violation of City ordinance prohibiting businesses in residential areas. Vice-Mayor Fangman suggested that Council consider a change of the Park Hills ordinance to permit such businesses in the area by a zone change through the Kenton County Municipal Planning & Zoning Commission or other possible avenue of change. This would bring an increase in revenue through issuance of occupational licenses, payroll tax, etc.

Discussion followed concerning several occupations and/or professions which would fall in this category. Mr. Carey suggested guidelines be laid out concerning which type of businesses would be permitted. The City Attorney will check further into this matter, with suggestions submitted by Council regarding which businesses would be approved.

7. Mr. Wehrmeyer requested that department heads submit their monthly reports on time for inclusion in Council's monthly packets which are received prior to meeting night. The Clerk was directed to send a memo to all department heads, requesting this be done.

Mark Dreyer, Chief of the Rescue Squad, requested that committee reports be advanced on the Agenda, following Petitions & Delegations. Council's approval was given, and Mayor Niehaus will be contacted regarding this request. The Vice-Mayor asked that this request be in writing from all three department heads.

8. Councilman Sorg requested information on possible steps that could be taken concerning a resident having construction done to his property without issuance of a building permit by the Park Hills Bldg. Insp. Mr. Carey told Council that the building inspector should be informed that a permit had not been issued. He would then check the premises and, if possible, a permit could be issued "after the fact", with fines and penalties attached, if necessary. The Bldg. Insp. is the enforcement officer for building and zoning matters in the City. Any questions concerning additions, structual deficiencies, etc. can be submitted directly to the Bldg. Insp., who would handle the matter, up to and including removal of additons, etc., if necessary.

NEW BUSINESS

1. The Clerk presented Resolution No. 11, 1984, "A RESOLUTION PROMOTING JAMES DECKER TO SENIOR PATROLMAN". A motion was made by Mr. Sorg and seconded by Mr. Sorrell that Resolution No. 11, 1984, be accepted as read. Mr. Sorg, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; and the motion carried.

2. Council's approval was given for authorization of a Volunteerism Award to be given by the Police Dept. to Officers Decker and Averdick. A motion was made by Mr. Wehrmeyer and seconded by Mr. Sorg that this authorization be given. Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Sorg aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; and the motion carried.

3. Mr. Wehrmeyer brought before Council, for its consideration, a change in pay for Mayor and Council, which could be included in the projected budget for the Fiscal Year 1985-86. Following discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Wehrmeyer and seconded by Mr. Sorrell that the Mayor's fee be raised to \$1,000.00 per year and Council's fee to \$500.00 per year, for the ensuing two-year term, with this proposed increase referred to the Finance Committee for consideration. Before roll call on the motion, Councilman Hellmann went on record as opposing a raise in pay for Council and Mayor. The roll call was then called with the following vote: Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Sorg, aye; Mr. Hellmann, no; and the motion carried.

4. Mr. Wehrmeyer informed Council that the County Clerk's office is now collecting taxes assessed by the City of Park Hills on motor vehicles. The Clerk was directed to contact Mr. Mark Vogt of the PVA office for a printout of all motor vehicles licensed in the City of Park Hills. This will be used as a crosscheck with the amount of City stickers issued by the Clerk's office.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Public Works Department

1. Mr. Wehrmeyer informed Council that the new truck is in; Mr. Budde is very pleased with it. The truck has been lettered with the City's name, plus the logo followed that is used on the Park Hills City stickers.

Fifty unused bags of salt have been sold for \$3.00 a bag, now that the City is using bulk tonnage. The Public Works employees have been instructed to wash the truck after each load of salt has been used. The salting of City streets has been successful.

2. Mr. Wehrmeyer brought before Council the proposed closing of I-75 for the rerouting project. Mr. Wehrmeyer was concerned with traffic flow on Dixie Hwy. when the expressway is closed. Vice-Mayor Fangman will check into this.

Police Department

1. A motion was made by Mr. Sorg and seconded by Mr. Sorrell that the report of the Park Hills Police Dept. for the month of December, 1984, be accepted as submitted. Mr. Sorg, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; and the motion carried.

2. Mr. Sorrell requested information on purchase of a new police cruiser. A new State price contract will have to be issued before purchase of the vehicle. It was noted the 1982 Ford has crested 100,000 miles.

Fire Department

1. A motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Wehrmeyer that the report of the Park Hills Vol. Fire Dept. for the month of December, 1984, be accepted as submitted. Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Sorg, aye; and the motion carried.

Rescue_Squad_

1. A motion was made by Mr. Osterhage and seconded by Mr. Wehrmeyer that the report of the Park Hills Rescue ²quad for the month of December, 1984, be accepted as submitted. Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Sorg, aye; and the motion carried.

2. Chief Dreyer explained to Council the future requirements for monthly in-service training for Rescue Squad personnel. Training programs will be handled, not only by Park Hills Rescue Squad, but also other departments in the No. Ky. area.

3. The heating system in the Rescue Squad quarters is still inadequate. Chief Dreyer informed Council that the entire area round the furnace has been insulated and it has helped somewhat. Mr. Wehrmeyer suggested Council check into a new unit for the squad area - 125 BTU unit would cost approximately \$500.00 -\$600.00, without installation charge. The Finance Committee will consider cost of a new heating unit to be included in the budget for the 1985-86 Fiscal Year.

4. Mr. Carey wished to express his thanks to the members of the Rescue Squad who responded to the accident involving his son. The response time and squad personnel attitude was greatly appreciated. The response time of the Police Chief and Officer Hellmann, together with the squad, was under 5 minutes.

Finance Department

1. A motion was made by Mr. Hellmann and seconded by Mr. Osterhage that the financial reports for the sixth month of the Fiscal Year 1984-85 be accepted as submitted. Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Sorg, aye; and the motion carried.

2. The Clerk informed Council of the amounts already spent for salt, indicating the amount of bagged salt received from Ken Bldrs., as compared to the 50 tons received through the County contract price for approximately the same amount of money. She then read a letter from Mr. John Neinaber of the Fiscal Court, confirming agreement between Park Hills and Ft. Wright for salt purchase, and from the City of Ft. Wright acknowledging this agreement. 3. Mr. Hellmann requested that the 1985-86 budget be handled in the same way it was done last year - meeting with department heads for input. Mr. Hellmann would like figures available for the March meeting.

The Clerk announced that figures received from the PVA show a marked difference in the assessed valuation of real estate in Park Hills as compared to the County valuation. Information from the No. Ky. Area Development District indicates that real estate valuations must be assessed by cities every two years. Park Hills has done no reassessing since 1979. The Clerk has been in contact with the PVA office concerning this reassessment.

Following discussion Vice-Mayor Fangman announced that the Clerk will get all figures available for the Finance Committee for presentation at the next Council meeting, with a recommendation as to what course will be followed.

4. The Clerk informed Council that personal property tax on autos is being collected by the County Clerk at a rate of \$2.97 per thousand, with the bond redemption tax being deleted for this year. The City has not received a ruling on the question of the bond redemption tax being assessed on motor vehicles at this time.

When questioned by Mr. Hellmann, the Clerk informed Council that tax money assessed on the motor vehicles will be received monthly from the County Clerk's office. Discussion followed concerning the use of monies coming in from the personal property tax six months prior to the beginning of the City's fiscal year. Mr. Hellmann suggested a replacement fund be set up for future equipment needed for the various departments. This will be taken under advisement.

BUILDING & ZONING MATTERS

1. The Clerk announced that four building permits had been issued during the month of December.

2. Mr. Sorg asked if a building permit had been issued to Mrs. Kluemper, 821 St. James. It has not been issued, and the Clerk was directed to notify the Bldg. Insp. concerning this property.

3. The application for a Board of Adjustment hearing has been obtained by Votel Contractors for property at the end of Morgan Ct. The Clerk's office has not received word from the Bd. of Adjustment concerning variance on this property.

COMMUNICATIONS

1. From Mr. Albert Kuehn, commending the Park Hills Rescue Squad on their response to his home on a squad call.

2. From Mr. Leroy Page acknowledging a job "well done" by the Public Works Dept. on snow removal.

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Council that a certain amount of such tires must be amassed before any party will remove them, for a fee. Mr. Fangman suggested that Council consider putting an order into effect concerning fences being erected around blight areas in the City. It was noted the Park Hills zoning code calls for such fencing, with Mayor Niehaus informing Council he felt it was a state hwy. regulation requiring such fences. Several businesses on the highway would fall into this category.

3. Ordinance Codification - Mr. Carey, City Attorney, informed Council that all ordinance books are now in order, with chapter headings prepared. Codification should be completed, with a new ordinance prepared by the April or May Council meeting.

4. Traffic-parking ordinance - Mr. Carey announced that suggested changes had been received from Councilman Hellmann and Chief Ostendorf in connection with the snow emergency ordinance. Copies of Mr. Hellmann's suggestions were given to each Council member. Mr. Carey explained, in detail, the suggestions submitted by the Chief.

Lengthy discussion followed, during which explanation was given for the necessity of listing certain streets in the City as snow emergency areas. Pro and con statements were made by several Council members concerning the content of this ordinance. Mr. Wehrmeyer then made a motion that Terrace Dr. and Cecelia Ave., per request of Mr. Hellmann and Chief Ostendorf, be placed on the list of streets affected by this ordinance. Before a second on this motion was made, Vice-Mayor Fangman suggested that Terrace Dr. have parking one one side only during the snow emergency, rather than eliminate cars from both sides of this street. More discussion followed. Mr. Wehrmeyer then made a motion that Council accept the first reading of the snow ordinance, in tact, as submitted by the City Attorney, with the following amendment in the title and sections 3, 4, and 5: "declared by the Mayor, and in his absence, the Vice-Mayor". This motion seconded by Mr. Fangman. Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Sorg, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; and the motion carried.

City Attorney Marc Carey then presented for its first reading, Ordinance No. 1, 1985, "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS IN KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, PROHIBITING THE LOCATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES ON CERTAIN STREETS AT ANY TIME DURING WHICH THERE IS A SNOW EMERGENCY DECLARED BY THE MATOR OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS; AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYRO OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS TO DECLARE A SNOW EMERGENCY AT ANY TIME WHICH HE DETERMINES THAT SNOW, SLEET, FREEZING RAIN OR OTHER WEATHER CONDITIONS HAVE CREATED A RISK OF COLLISION BY MOTOR VEHICLES BEING OPERATED ON SUCH STREETS WITH MOTOR VEHICLES PARKED ON SUCH STREETS; AND DIRECTING THE MATOR OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS TO POST SIGNS ON SUCH STREETS INDICATING THAT PARKING THEREON IS PROHIBITED DURING A DECLARED SNOW EMERGENCY: AND AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING ALL PEACE OFFICERS OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS TO CAUSE ALL MOTOR VEHICLES LOCATED UPON SUCH STREETS IN VIOLATION OF THE TERMS OF THIS ORDINANCE TO BE REMOVED THEREFROM; AND PROVIDING THAT THE CITY HAS A LIEN UPON MOTOR VEHICLES SO REMOVED FOR THE COST OF THE REMOVAL THEREOF; AND PROVIDING FOR A PRESUMPTION OF THE LOCATION OF SAID MOTOR VEHICLE BY THE OWNER THEREOF; AND PRO-VIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE TERMS AND PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE".

5. A motion was made by Mr. Fangman and seconded by Mr. Wehrmeyer that Ordinance No. 2, 1985, be adopted for its first reading. Being on discussion on the motion, Mr. Carey then presented Ordinance No. 2, 1985, "AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE PAYMENT OF LICENSE FEES FOR THE PRIVILEGE OF ENGAGIN IN OCCUPA-TIONS, TRADES, PROFESSIONS, BUSINESSES AND OTHER ACTIVITIES IN THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AND PROVIDING FOR THE IDENTIFICATION OF THE RESPONSIBLE PERSON TO ASSURE PAYMENT OF SAID LICENSE FEE IN THE GENERAL CONTRACTOR -SUBCONTRACTOR SETTING", for its first reading. Roll call on the above motion as (4) - 2/11/85

follows: Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Sorg, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; and the motion carried.

6. Mr. Carey presented Ordinance No. 3, 1985, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 8, 1984, WHICH IS AN ORDINANCE LEVYING AND IMPOSING AN ANNUAL OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE TAX UPON ALL PERSONS, FIRMS AND CORPORATIONS CARRYING ON CERTAIN TRADES, PROFESSIONS, OCCUPATIONS AND BUSINESSES IN THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY; FIXING THE AMOUNT OF SUCH LICENSE; SPECIFYING THE PURPOSE FOR WHICH SAME IS LEVIED; APPORTIONING THE REVENUE DERIVED THEREFROM AND REQUIRING SAID PERSONS, FIRMS AND CORPORATIONS TO PROCURE A LICENSE THEREFOR AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO DO SO." Mr. Carey felt that one more committee meeting should be held to complete discussions on same. The parking ordinance will be included in the codification process which should be completed and ready for the first reading in March or April.

8. Conditional Uses, Zoning Ord. - Home businesses within the City. Mr. Carey reminded Council their consideration was requested concerning what conditional uses they want to include in the residential zone of Park Hills zoning ordinance. The definition section of the ordinance does not cover conditional uses. Upon recommendation of the City Attorney, Mayor Niehaus appointed a committee including Jack Osterhage, Steven Hellmann and Paul Sorg, to study such conditional uses and report back at next Council meeting. Mr. Carey will contact this committee and set up a meeting for such study and recommendation for amendment to the zoning ordinance, if necessary.

9. The Clerk brought before Council the question of further progress regarding the property at 1019 Rose Circle, owned by Ms. Sharon Sullivan. Mr. Carey replied the information he received advised that the mortgage company brought a motion before the court for possession of the property. Mr. Carey will check further into this matter.

10. Proposed amendment to KC&MP&ZC agreement - Mayor Niehaus concurred with the proposed increase in membership from 15 to 19. Thereupon, a motion was made by Mr. Fangman and seconded by Mr. Osterhage that City Council of the City of Park Hills approve the proposed expansion of KC&MP&ZC membership to 19. Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Sorg, aye; and the motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

1. The Clerk informed Council that a printout of all auto licenses purchased by Park Hills residents will be received from the PVA office sometime during the month of March. She also announced that receipts totaling \$1155.87 collected for auto taxes for the month of January had been received from the County Clerk's office.

1. Mayor Niehaus announced that he had been in contact with Mr. Brinker of Covington Catholic H.S. re construction of sidewalks along Dixie Hwy. by the high school. The Mayor received an agreement for his signature (5) - 2/11/85

allowing such installation. When questioned, City Attorney Carey gave the opinion that the agreement seemed to be in order. He explained the agreement indicates the City of Park Hills would take charge of the construction of the sidewalk, including acquiring any easements that are necessary and would agree to basically hold the state harmless from any claims that might be made. The State of Kentucky would pay up to a maximum of \$40,000.00 for such construction. Discussion followed concerning specifications to be followed, bids to be received from contractors, and build-up of the area. Vice-Mayor Fangman suggested that each Councilman, the City Attorney and engineer be given a copy of this agreement and on-site appraisal of the area be made by Mr. Jenkins, City Engineer, before approval is given on this project. Mayor Niehaus and Mr. Jenkins will check the area.

BUILDING & ZONING MATTERS

Public Works Department

Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; and the motion carried.

7. Conditional Use/Residential Zones - The committee handling this study has not yet had a chance to meet. They will meet within the month and have a report for next Council meeting.

Mr. Wehrmeyer questioned the City Attorney if approval for certain businesses in such zones could be obtained from Council. Mr. Carey felt it would Minutes 3/11/85 - Page 4

leave too much discretion to Council. The Attorney suggested drafting an ordinance, incorporating home occupations as a conditional use, under the zoning section. Under the present zoning ordinance the term "customary use" is included and Mr. Carey suggested we define customary use as home occupation, with certain exclusions.

8. Sharon Sullivan property - No further information on this property. Foreclosure on same not completed. If a complaint is received by the Housing Authority officer, he, in turn, may contact the City Attorney who will give him the name of the lending institutions's attorney.

9. Dixie Hwy. sidewalk - Mayor Niehaus informed Council that he and the City Engineer examined the area. The study shows the cost of the project would be much greater than the \$40,000 appropriated for same. Paul Michels Co. will be contacted for suggestions as to construction procedure, costs, etc. Mr. Kerns of the State Hwy. Dept. feels more funds could be appropriated.

10. Vice-Mayor Fangman wondered if any repair work will be done on the 12" sewer located at Amsterdam, Short Arlington & Rose Circle. Mayor Niehaus will contact Paul Michels Co. rethis problem.

11. It was noted that the parking lot of the Utotem store is sinking. This will checked by the Mayor.

12. Vice-Mayor Fangman asked the Mayor if a curb will be installed in the area near the church and Appel property, continuing north on Hamilton Road. Mr. Fangman informed Council that the Civic Assn. would like to put railroad ties in the area to contain the mulch in the play area of Trolley Park. A permit will have to be otained to do this work. The flooding problem concerning the Appel property is partially caused by the blacktopping of the church parking lot which decreased the entrance to the catch basin. The catch basin must be kept free of leaves and debris.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Mayor Niehaus informed Council that street patching and/or blacktopping will begin within the week. Amsterdam Road between Terrace and Sleepy Hollow will be a number one priority.

2. Vice-Mayor Fangman brought before Council the use of a bulk mail rate for all large mailings out of the Clerk's office. The Clerk will check into this.

3. Council once again discussed permanent signs to be installed at several entrances into the City. This has been delayed because all regulatory traffic signs have not been installed throughout the City and a question raised regarding the 20 m.p.h. signs. If this speed limit was posted on all permanent signs at entrances to the City, would it be possible to remove all posted 20 m.p.h. signs erected within the City. The State authority to be contacted re this question.

BUILDING & ZONING MATTERS

1. The Clerk announced that two permits were issued during the month of February.

2. Mr. Jenkins, the Bldg, Insp., informed Council that renovation/ remodeling work is being done at 1200 Breckinridge. Permit has been obtained. Mr. Jenkins told Council that the property owners would also like to extend a wall and off-street parking area on the property. This may encroach on city right-of-way. Mr. Jenkins will research this further. No permit will be issued at this tiem.

3. When questioned by Mr. Fangman re the drain on Parkcrest, Mr. Jenkins replied that no changes have been made; the drain has just been cleaned out. It was noted that the new owners informed Council, when applying for application to continue building of these condominiums, they will repair this drain.

4. Covington Catholic High School was not issued a permit to construct cinder block dugouts. Mr. Jenkins will check into this.

COMMUNICATIONS

2. From Paul Michels Co. re sales tax for sewer project - the tax exemption refund cannot be given since the purchases were not made directly by the City.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION AT THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING ON MONDAY, APRIL 8, 1985, AT 8:00 P.M., WITH MAYOR NIEHAUS PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN FANGMAN, HELLMANN, OSTERHAGE, SORG, SORRELL AND WEHRMEYER PRESENT.

A motion was made by Mr. Fangman and seconded by Mr. Wehrmeyer that the minutes of the March 11, 1985, meeting be approved as submitted. Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Sorg, aye; and the motion carried.

PETITIONS & DELEGATIONS

1. Mr. Ted Schroder, 1035 Hamilton Road, appeared before Council asking if anything further is to be done concerning the hillside slippage. During disucssion Mayor Niehaus informed Mr. Schroder that dirt was packed into the area to seal all cracks to prevent the water from accumulating. The Mayor has been checking the area and cannot find any cracks opening within the last two months. Mr. Schroder agreed with that, but stated there is no shoulder on the road. Mayor Niehaus stated that the City may install a curb along the area to divert the water from the hillside. Following discussion it was stated the City Engineer and Mayor will inspect the area and render a decision.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Public Works Dept.

1. Mr. Wehrmeyer informed Council he had received a call concerning a sewer problem on Dixie Hwy. Mayor Niehaus will meet with Paul Michels Co. pertaining to the installation of a sidewalk along the Dixie Hwy. near Covington Catholic H.S. and also discuss the condition of the sewer in the 1500 area of the highway. It was suggested a catch basin be installed between the restaurant at 1504 Dixie and U Totem at 1501, to catch the flow of water. Portions of this sewer have been patched, but other areas keep disintergrating.

When questioned by Mr. Sorrell concerning the cave-in on the U Totem lot, Mayor Nighaus replied this was not caused by the sewer problem. He stated an obsolete sewer is located in that area and is breaking up. This will probably be removed.

2. Mr. Sorrell informed Council all catch basins, which are the responsibility of the State, are full of debris, etc., and cannot handle the flow of water. Mayor Niehaus will check into this.

3. Councilman Wehrmeyer submitted a two-page list for Mr. Budde re Public Works maintenance. The Clerk was directed to make a copy of this list for theffile, plus one to be returned to Mr. Wehrmeyer. The work should be completed by next Council meeting.

Copy of letter from Veronica Mitchell, 1100 Amsterdam Road, concerning unsightly condition of rear of the City Bldg., was also discussed. This should be taken care of.

OLD BUSINESS

2. Dixie Hwy. Survey - City Attorney Carey checked into the zoning ordinance concerning problems along the Dixie Hwy. Several areas were identified where action can be taken to clean up unsightly conditions created by illegal junk yards along the highway, as well as storage of certain materials, plus abandoned cards, in violation of city ordinance. Interpretation of statute will allow issuance of citation by the Zoning Administrator stating that such nuisances must be abated.

Mr. Sorrell also asked the Zoning Administrator to check out the possibility of an illegal fence and temporary sign on the highway, both of which may be in violation of city ordinance.

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3. Mr. Jenkins informed Council that steps had been taken by the Szechuan Gardens restaurant to alleviate hazardous conditions that had existed in the rear of the building. The work was done without obtaining a permit, but it is an improvement.

4. Ordinance Codification - Mr. Carey informed Council that a typed copy of the City's new codified ordinances will be available before next Council meeting. He expects it to be in sufficient form by the next meeting so an ordinance may be prepared for adoption of this code as official ordinance of the City. The Clerk informed Council that a possibility exists that a grant may be obtained to offset the cost of this codification program through the Kentucky Dept. of Libraries & Archives.

5. Dixie Hwy. Sidewalk - Mayor Niehaus will meet with Paul Michels Co. concerning the above proposed project on April 9th.

Mr. Jenkins, the City Engineer, expressed the opinion that any monies received from the State would be better used to repair the City's ongoing sewer problems along the highway. Discussion concerning pros and cons on this project followed, with other suggestions made to alleviate the problems for pedestrians and/or students. Wright, asking if the City of Park Hills would be interested in joining the above authority. She reminded Council the SPCA will be ceasing operations 7/1/85. The cost of joining this authority would be approximately 1600 to 1800 dollars. 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4. PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE PRESENTATION OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1985-86, INCLUDING THE GENERAL FUND, FEDERAL REVENUE SHARING FUND, PARK HILLS SANITATION MAINTENANCE AND REPLACEMENT FUND, AND THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE FUND, WAS HELD ON MONDAY, JUNE 10, 1985, AT 7:00 P.M., WITH VICE-MAYOR FANGMAN PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN OSTERHAGE, SORRELL AND WEHRMEYER PRESENT.

ABSENT: MAYOR NEIHAUS, COUNCILMEN HELLMANN AND SORG.

A motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Osterhage that Vice-Mayor Fangman be appointed Acting Mayor in the absence of Mayor Joseph Niehaus to preside over this public hearing. Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; and the motion carried.

Vice-Mayor Fangman opened the hearing, indicating that the Order of Business would be the discussion of the Budget for the Fiscal Year 1985-86. A copy of Ordinance No. 5, 1985, and the Budget for the Fiscal Year 1985-86 were supplied to each member of Council.

Vice-Mayor Fangman stated the purpose of the public hearing is to establish the financial accountability of the City of Park Hills, including expenditures and income for the Fiscal Year 1985-86. Copies of the budget are available for anyone in the audience who cares to follow along with Council. A copy of such budget was given to Mr. Stanely Simmons, only person present at this hearing.

Mr. Fangman presented in detail estimated receipts of the General Fund and estimated expenditures for each department.

The Federal Revenue Sharing Fund was then presented concerning estimated revenue, plus detailed expenditures for each department in the City.

Park Hills Sanitation Fund presented with estimated receipts. Expenditures not preplanned, but used when needed.

LGEA Fund presented with an estimated income of \$56.00 for the Fiscal Year.

Discussion followed with questions raised concerning engineering fees, trash, f fees and the amount needed for the Dog Warden Authority. All questions were answered to the satisfaction of Council members. There were no questions or statements from the audience.

Mr. Fangman then explained for Council the individual salary increase for members of the Police Dept., including fulltime and parttime personnel. Discussion on cruiser maintenance followed.

There being no further questions, or objections raised, by any member of Council or the public, the Public Hearing was closed by Acting Mayor Fangman at 7:30 PM.

Requirements for this Public Hearing had been met by advertising in the public press, advising interested parties that this public hearing would be held upon the terms of the Budget.

PETITIONS & DELEGATIONS

1. Mr. Ron Ziegler, 1009 Rose Circle, appeared before Council requesting Council's permission to install a parking pad at his residence. Mr. Fangman informed Mr. Ziegler that the procedure to follow would be filing of an application for same with the Park Hills Building Inspector. Mr. Ziegler was told that certain restrictions can be levied by Council after such plans are approved or disapproved by the building inspector. Such request was referred to the building inspector for the initial step.

Mr. Allen Nageleisen, new Bldg. Insp., arrived at the meeting and was introduced to Mr. Ziegler and members of Council.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Public Works Department

1. Mr. Wehrmeyer informed Council that interior painting of the building is now in process. Exterior painting of the front of the building has been completed, with the balance of such painting still to be done.

Police Deparment

2.

1. A motion was made by Mr. Osterhage and seconded by Mr. Sorrell that the report of the Park Hills Police Dept. for the month of May, 1985, be accepted as submitted. Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; and the motion carried.

2. Chief Ostendorf informed Council that one of the Park Hills Police Department's cases was used at the FBI seminar during a training session on laundering money.

3. The Chief told Council that several training session will be taken by department personnel.

4. Councilman Wehrmeyer commended Officers Decker and Jansing on contributing their time, for security purposes, at fund-raising dances.

5. Councilman Osterhage requested Chief Ostendorf keep in close contact with the City Clerk concerning further insurance information.

Fire Department

2. Chief Kaelin requested further information on smoke alarm ordinances covering one and two-family houses. City Attorney Carey informed Chief Kaelin that an ordinance has been drafted for the City. He is awaiting a sample copy of a smoke alarm ordinance that is to be drafted by the Municipal League. The Clerk is to check further into this.

Rescue Squad

1. A motion was made by Mr. Osterhage and seconded by Mr. Wehrmeyer that the report of the Park Hills Rescue Squad for the month of May, 1985, be accepted as submitted. Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; and the motion carried.

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2. When questioned by Mr. Wehrmeyer, Vice-Mayor Fangman replied that the bill accompanying the Rescue Squad report is a budget item asked for in the 85-86 budget. Chief Dreyer anticipated several repairs to the vehicle. Such bill is an estimated amount needed for such maintenance.

Finance Department

1. A motion was made by Mr. Wehrmeyer and seconded by Mr. Sorrell that the financial reports for the month of May, 1985, be accepted as submitted. Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; and the motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Park Hills Housing Authority - Nothing further.

2. Mr. Osterhage requested progress report on the Sullivan property at 1019 Rose Circle. Chief Ostendorf told Council that he spoke with Ms. Sullivan and she anticipates having siding put on the house and as soon as funds are available more repair work will be done.

Mr. Carey informed Council that he appeared as a witness at the Master Commissioner hearing in Kenton County. At the hearing foreclosure action was recommended to the bank to regain possession of the property and secure it. It is likely insurance on the property will be cancelled.

3. Dixie Highway Survey - Mr. Carey has been contacted by the attorney for John Toebben. Nothing further since that time. Executive session may be called if further developments occur.

It was noted repair work at Dixie Hwy. and Arlington Road was done by the Dept. of Transportation.

Councilman Hellmann arrived at 8:26 P.M.

4. Ordinance Codification - Mr. Carey informed Council that ordinance titles 1 through 13 have been prepared. Information has been received that several ordinances will have to be amended. Mr. Carey requested the Public Works committee and the Ad Hoc committee on the parking ordinance meet again prior to the June 28th special meeting for final preparation on the code before adoption.

Funding regulations concerning codification have been changed by state regulations. The City and Department of Archives and Libraries are still trying to negotiate for grant money for this project.

5. Dixie Hwy. Sidewalk/Sewer Project - Vice-Mayor Fangman informed Council that no progress on the sidewalk can be reported until a release is received from Bishop Hughes, who owns Covington Catholic H.S., for a permanent easement on the property because of the necessary fill needed to put the sidewalk in. A contract from KZF is on file in the Clerk's office regarding the initial engineering on the project. As soon as the clearance is received this prject should proceed.

Mr. Fangman told Council no funding is available at present from the Ky. Dept. of Transportation for the Dixie Hwy. sewer line, but the department did indicate they will repair it if it is their responsibility. Nothing further on the line near Szechuan Gardens restaurant.

The Sanitation District is advertising for bids for a completion and/or continuation of the sewer from their new trunk line down the Dixie Hwy. near the Park Hills/Covington line. Approximately 400 ft. of line (near Kelley Plumbing) is the responsibility of this department and will be repaired by the Sanitation District. Both the Mayor and Vice-Mayor contacted the sanitation district, requesting a 30" pipe be installed to match the 30" line already installed by the City. The City of Park Hills offered to pay the difference between the 24" line proposed by the Sanitation District and the 30" line requested by the City. The approximate amount would be between \$3.00 and \$5.00 per foot. During discussion it was noted approximately 400' to 500' of line will still have to be repaired by the City.

6. Hamilton Road hillside - nothing further. Several engineers will be contacted for ideas on how to proceed with this project. It was noted a portion of the 85-86 State Aid Road budget funds has been allocated for such work.

7. Home businesses - nothing further.

8. Dog Warden Authority - The interlocal agreement received from the Dog Warden Authority was submitted to the City Attorney for study. The Clerk informed Council that several amendments to the dog ordinance will have to be made concerning price of dog tags and pick-up authority. A sample copy of such ordinance from the City of Ft. Wright will be submitted to the attorney.

NEW BUSINESS

1. A motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Wehrmeyer that Ordinance No. 5, 1985, concerning budget for the City of Park Hills, be introduced for its first reading. Thereupon City Attorney Carey presented Ordinance No. 5, 1985, "AN APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY, ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 1985, THROUGH JUNE 30, 1986, BY ESTIMATING REVENUES AND RESOURCES AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT". A motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Wehrmeyer that Ordinance No. 5, 1985, be adopted for its first reading. Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; and the motion carried.

2. Mr. Carey informed Council that the ordinance concerning sewer-tap fee would have to be amended to increase such fee. Mr. Carey told Council all ordinance amendments should take place before the final codification is com-

pleted. Mr. Nageleisen, P.H. Bldg. Insp., suggested all fees concerning building permits and/or zoning fees be reestablished. He further suggested a committee be formed to review such fees. Discussion followed on the wording of such amended ordinances and any changes that may be necessary. Committee meetings will be held prior to the special meeting to be held on June 28th.

3. Mrs. Jean Brann, 811-813 St. James Ave., appeared before Council requesting Council look into a water flow problem from the Dixie Hwy. onto her property. This flow has been eroding the sidewalk in front of her property, which has been replaced on two occasions. Her second problem concerns a storm sewer line which runs between her property and St. Agnes Church. The ground is continually wet, amking it extremely difficult to keep the grass cut in that area. Mr. Fangman assured Mrs. Brann he would contact Mayor Niehaus on his return to the City and have the problem looked into as soon as possible.

Mr. Wehrmeyer requested permission from Mrs. Brann for several members of Council to view the property. This permission was granted.

4. Mr. Jack Reyer, 1216 Audubon Road, advised Council he also is having the same problem with a storm drain to the rear of his property. The backyard is always marshy, making it impossible to mow the grass. This property will also be checked by Council members.

BUILDING & ZONING MATTERS

1. Mr. Allen Nageleisen once again introduced as the new Bldg. Insp./ Zoning Admin. Mr. Nageleisen explained in detail the procedure he follows in handling building permit applications, issuance of permits, contact with residents, and inspections.

2. The Clerk informed Council that three building permits were issued during the month of May.

During discussion several suggestions were made, and Council assured Mrs. Brann that steps would be taken to remedy the situation.

2. The following residents appeared before Council concerning the unkempt condition of Ms. Sharon Sullivan's property at 1019 Rose Circle: Mr. & Mrs. Dave Diekman, Mr. Robert Ruh, Mrs. Marjorie Hurley and Mrs. Marcia Hester. Pictures of the house and property were shown to Council, and a request made to Council for action in having this property cleaned up and the premises made habitable. City Attorney Carey informed the petitioners that word had been received by the City that foreclosure proceedings had been reinstituted, and the City could not condemn the property if it is in foreclosure. He sumbitted to the above residents the name and number of the lending instition's attorney, who should be able to give them more information. Mr. Carey requested contact from the residents if any word is received from such attorney indicating that the property is now in the hands of the lending institution.

3. Mr. Ron Ziegler, 1009 Rose Circle, appeared before Council requesting further information on progress of his application for installation of a parking pad at the above address. Mr. Nageleisen, the Bldg. Insp., explained in detail the problem Mr. Ziegler has with parking under present conditions. Mr. Carey, the City Attorney, then presented for its second reading Ordinance No. 6, 1985, "AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PARKING WITHIN THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, PROHIBITING MOTOR VEHICLES TO PARK AT CERTAIN TIMES ON CERTAIN STREETS WHILE SCHOOL IS IN SESSION, REGULATING PARKING ON UNIMPROVED RIGHT-OF-WAYS IN THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, PROHIBITING PARKING OF AUTOMOBILES WITHIN THE CITY OF PARK HILLS IN SUCH A MANNER AS TO BLOCK SIDEWALKS, AND ESTABLISHING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF PARKING REGULATIONS AND ORDINANCES WITHIN THE CITY OF PARK HILLS AND ENFORCING SAID PARKING ORDINANCES THROUGH THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A HEARING BOARD PROCEDURE, ESTABLISHING BURDEN OF PROOF, DEFENSES, RIGHTS TO APPEAL AND OTHER RIGHTS REGARDING THE HEARING PROCEDURE, AND PROVIDING FOR THE RIGHT OF THE CITY POLICE TO IMPOUND VEHICLES AND CHARGE FOR TOWING, HANDLING AND STORAGE AND THE

RIGHT OF THE OWNER OF AN IMPOUNDED VEHICLE TO APPEAL THOSE CHARGES." A motion was made by Mr. Wehrmeyer and seconded by Mr. Fangman that Ordinance No. 6, 1985, be adopted and passed. Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; and the motion carried.

A motion was made by Mr. Wehrmeyer and seconded by Mr. Osterhage that this meeting adjourn. Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; and the motion carried.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS MET IN REGULAR SESSION AT THE PARK HILLS CITY BUILDING ON MONDAY, AUGUST 12, 1985, WITH MAYOR NIEHAUS PRESIDING AND COUNCILMEN FANGMAN, HELLMANN, OSTERHAGE, SORG, AND WEHRMEYER PRESENT. ABSENT: COUNCILMAN SORRELL.

A motion was made by Mr. Fangman and seconded by Mr. Osterhage that minutes of the July 8, 1985, meeting be approved as submitted. Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Sorg, aye; and the motion carried. Mr. Hellmann not present at this time; arriving at approximately 8:15 pm.

PETITIONS & DELEGATIONS

1. Mr. James Ware, attorney handling the Castleman estate, appeared before Council concerning a zone change covering the property located at the corner of Dixie Hwy. and So. Arlington Road, block 2, Rosemont sub. Mr. Ware noted that application for zone change must go through the No. Ky. Area Planning Commission, as the first step, but final permission would have to be granted by the Park Hills City Council in having this area changed from residential to Neighborhood Commercial zoning. He wished to know if there were any objections to this zone change.

Lengthy discussion followed during which Mr. Ware indicated that deed restrictions on the property would end within the year. Also noted by Council were several objectionable permitted uses in the NC zone. Mr. Ware informed Council an interested buyer proposes to build a professional office building at this location. Council would concur with this type of building. It was noted for the record Council would be in favor of Professional Office zoning.

2. Mrs. Sue Wiesemann, 600 Rosemont Avenue, appeared before Council re landlord-tenant problems. She had been informed by the City Clerk that Park Hills does not have a landlord-tenant act in the City. Vice-Mayor Fangman told Mrs. Wiesemann that due to a legality problem, the act could not be adopted when first brought before Council two years ago. Mrs. Wiesemann was informed by Councilman Osterhage that Kentucky statutes do include tenant protection provisions. Copies of the statute can be obtained from the public library.

3. Mr. Harold McKinley, 1331 Old State Road, appeared before Council with several questions concerning parking pads. He had been furnished with the most recent parking ordinance, plus a copy of the parking pad specifications issued by the City to property owners wishing to install same. Mr. Carey, the City Attorney, once again noted that any parking pad installed on City right-ofway belongs to residents of the City and can be used by any resident of the City. Mr. McKinley informed Council hepplans to remove the pad in front of his home, which he had installed, and put in a circular driveway. He was told by Mr. Carey that installation of, and materials used, would be defined in the Park Hills Zoning Ordinance. He was further informed of the process to be followed concerning the driveway project. Mr. McKinley then requested a definition of the marked walkway along Old State Road. He was told it is designated a "sidwwalk".

4. Mr. Ron Ziegler, 1009 Rose Circle, requested progress report from Council on his previous request for permission to install a parking pad in front of his property. During discussion use of his rear area was suggested. Mr. Ziegler replied the rear driveway leading to Amsterdam Road was quite steep. Concerning a pad in front of the property, Council would concur in the installation of same, with restrictions, which would satisfy concerns of the neighbors on Rose Circle. Both Mayor Niehaus and Mr. Nageleisen, the Bldg. Insp., will meet with Mr. Ziegler and check further into this matter so a final conclusion can be reached.

5. Mr. Jack Ehrman asked for the footage of the right-of-way on the east side of Old State Road. Mayor Niehaus replied that it would be approximately 20 - 22' from the center of the road, or $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft. beyond the edge of the road would be City right-of-way. Mr. Ehrman than asked if the owner of the property had the right to put obstacles on the parking pad. The obstacles can be put on the property, but not on the City right-of-way.

6. There was discussion among Council and the Police Chief re marking of regulatory signs for identification purposes in case of the ft. Several of these signs have been removed shortly after being erected.

Once again the subject of State approval on regulatory signs was discussed, plus removal of 20 mph signs throughout the City, with such information being listed on the permanent entrance signs. The Clerk was again directed to contact Mr. Caldwell of the Ky. State Police and set up a definite appointment for approval of the regulatory signs.

Police Department

When an affirmative reply was received, he indicated such information would be published in "The Hub" fund drive edition.

3. Chief Kaelin requested submission of truck bids on a new pickup for Fire Dept. use be advanced on the agenda to be opened at this time. Thereupon, a motion was made by Mr. Fangman and seconded by Mr. Osterhage that the following bids be opened. Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Sorg, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; and the motion carried.

When the purchase price is established the committee will request a Purchase Order from the City Clerk to the vehicle may be ordered. 4. Replacement of concrete apron in front of City Bldg. - nothing further.

Rescue Squad

OLD BUSINESS

1. Park Hills Housing Authority - nothing further.

At this point Councilman Hellmann asked to be excused due to a previous commitment.

2. Dixie Hwy. Survey (Toebben property) - Mr. Carey, the City Attorney, informed Council he has been in contact with Mr. Toebben's attorney. He was told that steps are being taken to clean up the problem. Various violations were discussed and several legitimate concerns and complaints would be discussed with Mr. Toebben, with advice given that these problems be cleared up.

3. Dixie Hwy. sidewalk - Mayor Niehaus informed Council that he will be in contact with Mr. George Hoffman of the State Hwy. Dept. concerning this project. The drawings are finished by the KZF Corp.

4. Hamilton Road slippage - Letter from Ky. Dept. of Education re 50% payment of this project has been given to the contractor. The Mayor is awaiting a bid estimate from Paul Michels Co.

5. Home businesses - nothing further.

6. Mr. Fangman informed Council he received a call from Mrs. Jean Brann, 811-813 St. James. During conversation he was told by Mrs. Brann she is having the sidewalk repaired. Mayor Niehaus will contact Mrs. Brann, indicating City plans for installing a curb to eliminate the water flow problem.

7. Mr. Wehrmeyer informed Council that information had been received from Mr. Jack Reyer, 1216 Audubon Road, concerning water run=off onto his property from a parking pad on property, above and to the rear of his residence. Mr. Reyer also felt part of the water problem is from a storm drain to the rear of his property. During discussion, it was noted that problem from the parking pad is not the responsibility of the City. Further study will be made of the area to see if a storm drain can be located.

8. Dickman apt. tax - Mr. Carey informed Council a \$50.00 check was received from Mr. Dickman pertaining to a miscellaneous portion of the Occupational License Ordinance. Also, because of the Erlanger apt. tax suit decision, Mr. Carey was informed they take the position all apt. taxes in all cities are now unconstitutional.

During discussion, Mr. Carey indicated, in his opinion, the Park Hills apt. tax ordinance is still good, but was significantly weakened by the Erlanger decision. Mr. Carey would like an opinion from the Municipal League and, if necessary, consider modifying the City's present ordinance. The attorney feels if the Court of Appeals' decision re Erlanger is accepted for review by the Supreme Court, the City should wait, take no action on enforcing the present ordinance until a decision is reached by such court. If no review allowed, or Court of Appeals' decision stands, the City should review its ordinance.

When questioned by Mr. Fangman, the attorney replied the City could go with a gross profits tax. Pursuance of such new tax was indicated to Mr. Dickman's attorney, who replied he informed the property owner the apt. tax fee might be lower than a gross profits tax. Mr. Dickman still feels he won the case on the apt. tax ordinance and, therefore, will not pay the fee. Mr. Carey repeated that no action be taken on enforcing this ordinance.

PETITIONS & DELEGATIONS

1. Mr. Charles Caldwell, Ky. State Police, appeared before Council, at their request, to discuss final disposition of replaced street signs. During the discussion that followed, Mr. Caldwell did mention several inconsistencies he noticed while driving through the city: Two rectangular signs which say caution, school entrance, and a sign on Arlington Road; these are non-standard signs. He did find some inconsistencies concerning the height of several of the signs. He also noted that several signs were on telephone poles. All should be corrected. These corrections will be given to the Mayor by the Police Chief. When questioned by Mr. Fangman concerning the city's compliance with state requirements Mr. Caldwell replied that definite approval could not be given at this time. He would have to return at a later date, check the inventory of signs received, do another check of sign placement, item by item. Placement of speed limit signs would be at local discretion.

2. Dixie Highway Survey - Once again the unsightly condition of the John Toebben property was discussed. Many ordinance violations were noted by Mr. Sorrell. Mr. Carey reminded Council that three different approaches had been taken: (1) conversation with Mr. Toebben, (2) contacted the property owner by mail, (3) contact with his attorney. A meeting was suggested by Chief Ostendorf with the Building Inspector/Zoning Administrator, City Attorney, and Chief of Police, concerning enforcement procedures to follow on the above property. Mr. Nageleisen, the Building Inspector/Zoning Administrator, requested information on this property, which he will handle. The meeting, noted above, will take place in the near future.

Mr. Sorrell informed Council that a large hole is in the pavement on Dixie Highway, near the Szechaun Gardens Restaurant. Mayor Niehaus told Council he will have the hole filled with blacktop temporarily.

3. Dixie Highway Sidewalk - Mayor Niehaus informed Council that advertisement for bids will be inserted in the Recorder and Kentucky Post on September 11th, with bids being returned by September 23rd, calling for a special meeting for acceptance of such bids.

Mr. Wehrmeyer asked to be excused from the meeting due to illness. (9:15 pm)

4. Hamilton Road Slippage - Nothing further at this time. A meeting will be held with Mayor Niehaus and Vice-Mayor Fangman concerning future progress, including partial financial help from the State Department of Education.

5. Home Businesses - There will be further study by the committee and Police Chief. Mr. Carey informed Council there is an inconsistency in the zoning ordinance, concerning home businesses. There are some permissible uses, which defines customary use, but "customary use" is not defined. Also home occupations are defined, but in no residential zone as an "accessory use" is listed a home business. The future committee meeting will include the Zoning Administrator.

6. Apartment Tax - The city attorney informed Council the Supreme Ct. has accepted the Erlanger case for review - no ruling as yet. Mr. Carey told Council there is a difference of opinion in various courts of appeal throughout Kentucky. To reconcile such differences the cases would be reviewed by the Supreme Ct. He also mentioned the Kentucky Municipal League may be interested in these cases.

7. Mr. Carey informed Council that ordinance codification is nearing the completed stage. When questioned, the attorney explained in detail the reason why the city is not eligible for a grant from the Kentucky Department Libraries and Archives. Many complaints have been received by the department from various cities throughout the state re unfair regulations concerning grant money. Mr. Carey lodged a complaint, requesting at the next board meeting Park Hills' Grant Application be reconsidered.

8. Mayor Niehaus informed Council that a curb has been installed from Dixie Highway past 811-813 St. James Avenue. Mr. Niehaus will check this area during the next rain.

9. The Mayor told Council that he and Mr. Nageleisen had inspected the area at 1009 Rose Circle, where installation of a parking pad was requested. Permission had been given, with several restrictions, but installation has not been started.

10. Mayor Niehaus informed Council that the apron in front of the Fire Department was checked by Cincinnati Blacktop Company. The contractor suggested a felt pad be laid, covered with two grades of blacktop. A price for such work will be submitted. Chief Kaelin asked the department be notified before the work is done and the equipment will be removed. The contractor is to be reminded that a payroll tax will be due the city.

NEW BUSINESS

1. A motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Fangman that Ordinance No. 9, 1985, concerning installation of smoke alarms in all residences in the city be introduced for discussion before its first reading. Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Sorg, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; and the motion carried.

During discussion several changes were made to the body of the ordinance. It was noted that an informational brochure, together with certifying compliance form, be sent to all owners of property within the City of Park Hills. Following discussion, City Attorney Carey presented for its first reading Ordinance No. 9, 1985, "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS IN KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY REQUIRING THE INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF SMOKE DETECTORS IN CERTAIN DWELLING UNITS IN THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY; AND PROVIDING SPECIFICATIONS AND STANDARDS FOR THE LOCATION, INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE THEREOF; AND INCOR-PORATING THE PROVISIONS OF THE NATIONAL FIRE PROTECTION ASSOCIATION THEREIN; AND

PROVIDING PROCEDURES FOR THE ENFORCEMENT THEREOF AND PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF". A motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Fangman that Ordinance No. 9, 1985, be accepted for its first reading. Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Sorg, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; and the motion carried.

2. Mr. Carey, Park Hills City Attorney, presented MUNICIPAL ORDER NO. 1, 1985, appointing Police Chief Ostendorf, Jr. as Property Officer, Manager and Custodian of the City of Park Hills. A motion was made by Mr. Sorg and seconded by Mr. Fangman that Municipal Order No. 1, 1985, be accepted as read. Mr. Sorg, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; and the motion carried.

BUILDING & ZONING MATTERS

1. Mr. Nageleisen, Park Hills Building Inspector, informed Council of a violation on Lot 777, Mr. Allen Sub., in connection with overgrown grass and weeds, and a shed located on this lot in structual decay. The owner of the property was informed the shed would have to be condemned and demolished.

Because of financial difficulties of the owner of the property, Mr. Nageleisen asked if the city could help in any way in removing this hazard. Following discussion the Fire Department will examine the location and come up with a feasible solution to this problem.

2. Building permits issued by the building inspector will be submitted to the clerk's office.

COMMUNICATIONS

1. From Ft. Mitchell Mayor Goetz thanking Council for expression of sympathy in memory of his father.

2. From Blessed Sacrament Athletic Boosters for memorial gift in memory of Wm. Goetz.

The Clerk informed Concil that complaint was received from the trash collector concerning a health hazard created at the Woodside Apt. complex. Trash is deposited in a small building on the property. Many bags are open, plastic bags ripped, with contents falling out. Rats have been seen inside the building. It was noted this is in violation of our trash ordinance which states garbage should be contained in air-tight containers.

No official action will be taken on Ordinance No. 10, 1985, at this time.

Public_Works_Department

1. Mr. Wehrmeyer informed Council the rear area of the City Building has been cleaned up and in good condition.

2. The Clerk told Council, John Nienaber, Kenton County Fiscal Court, had been contacted and salt will be purchased for the city through the county price.

Police Department

1. A motion was made by Mr. Sorg and seconded by Mr. Osterhage that the report of the Park Hills Police Department for the month of September, be accepted as submitted. Mr. Sorg, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; and the motion carried.

2. In the absence of Chief Ostendorf, Councilman Sorg presented his request for a fifth full-time officer on the force. Several questions were raised. 2. Mayor Niehaus informed Council the apron in front of the Fire Department should be repaired by October 18, 1985 by Cincinnati Blacktop Company. The department will be notified in advance of the work being done so all fire equipment can be removed in case of emergency. The Mayor will insist that a payroll tax be submitted to the city. This company has never replied to the forms sent out.

3. Mayor Niehaus set Halloween hours for trick or treating between 6:00 and 8:00 p.m. The Fire Department will have refreshments available between 7:00 and 9:00 p.m.

4. Chief Kaelin informed Council the agent representing the Volunteer Firemen's Insurance Company would like to submit a quote on the city's liability insurance when it is due for renewal. The Clerk was directed to check on the expiration date of such policies.

5. Chief Kaelin submitted his letter of resignation as Fire Chief of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Department, effective December 31, 1985, or as soon thereafter as possible. Chief Kaelin recommended that Dennis Finke be appointed Chief.

6. The Chief told Council that a letter will be sent to all property owners in the City of Park Hills, informing them of the city's new Smoke Detector Ordinance.

They will check into other ways of demolishing it though Fire Department drills.

2. Purchase of a new furnace for the Rescue Squad quarters was once again discussed by Council. Mr. Fangman, explained in detail the difference between standard efficiency and high efficiency units. Mayor Niehaus and Mr. Fangman had drawings availabe for installation of the new furnace, plus recommendation that new ducts be installed in a portion of the building.

Chief Dreyer informed Council that Rescue Squad personnel have insulated all walls of the building except the front.

2. Dixie Highway Survey - Toebben Property - No change has been made in the unsightly condition of this property. Mr. Carey, City Attorney, once again informed Council that citations issued for violations of city ordinances must come from the Police Department or the Park Hills Bldg. Insp./Zoning Admin. The attorney stated it was more appropriate for the Bldg. Insp./Zoning Admin. to issue the citation. A meeting between the City Attorney, Police Chief, and the Bldg. Insp./Zoning Admin. has not yet materialized. It was suggested that if no clean-up work has been done on the property by the time occupational license are renewed - that such license be denied to the owner of such business. The attorney can cite chapter and verse of the zoning ordinance which covers the Toebben violations - no question about it. Mayor Niehaus will contact Mr. Nageleisen, the Bldg. Insp./Zoning Admin., directing him to give top priority in having this situation cleared up as soon as possible.

The problem of Mr. Gene Connell, 601 So. Arlington, doing business as, in a residential zone, was also discussed. Chief Ostendorf had informed Council that court citations for this violation would be issued. A motion made by Mr. Fangman and seconded by Mr. Sorrell, directing the Clerk to write Mr. Nageleisen concerning this problem was rescinded.

3. Dixie Highway Sidewalk/Storm Piping - Council was informed that its recommendation of Paul Michels & Sons, Inc. as contractor on this project was accepted by the State Transporation Department. A contract is to be signed by the city and contractor. Mr. Michels will be out of town until Monday; after which work should proceed.

4. Hamilton Road Slippage - Vice-Mayor Fangman has been in contact with the Department of Education. Engineering drawings have been obtained, and a price quote received. This information will be forwarded to the Ky. Dept. of Education. Council was informed the State will pay 50% of expenses.

5. Home Businesses - Several meetings have taken place. The committee is having trouble defining home businesses. They have come up with several suggestions and clearly defined certain areas. Mr. Carey told Council he feels this study is worth pursuing.

6. All old street signs have been disposed of. One non-standard sign has yet to be removed. A letter of release from Mr. Caldwell, Ky. State Police, has not yet been received by the Clerk's office. It was noted a street sign at St. James and Dixie is on a telephone pole. Three of the four signs on one pole on Arlington are to be removed. Also, a crosswalk sign is to be placed on Old State Road near the pathway. Signs indicating restricted hours on Old State, Arlington and Amsterdam Roads are to be ordered.

7. City Attorney Carey informed Council the property at 1019 Rose Circle, (former owner-Sharon Sullivan) has been sold to a Mr. William Menkhaus. An appeal had been filed by the former owner, preventing this sale. Mr. Carey received information the appeal may be dismissed and there probably will be no change in transfer of this property to a new owner.

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8. The Clerk informed Council a sewage charge had been placed on the drinking fountain in Trolley Park. The Sanitation District had been contacted and a refund check in the amount of \$10.07 had been received by the city. A definite date for shutting off the fountain for the winter has not been decided.

NEW BUSINESS of the second sec

1. Trash collection contract - New specifications and stipulations were submitted to Council by Mr. Carey, the City Attorney. He informed Council that an ordinance is not required to advertise for bids - a resolution would be sufficient.

Several apartment complexes have been exempt from trash fees since they contract individually with a trash collector. Mr. Fangman questioned the attorney re inserting in the stipulations the information "if a property owner of multi-family buildings does not contract with a trash collector, individually, they will be covered under the city contract." Mr. Carey replied the stipulations, etc. concern the trash collection contract between the city and the company making the bid. Paragraph 14 in such stipulations informs the contractor that certain pieces of property are exempt.

Pickup times were discussed by Council. The hours, 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., included in the stipulations, will not be changed. Partial wording in paragraph 20 of the Stipulations & Specifications will read as follows: "the City shall be notified by the Contractor prior to the next scheduled collection time or within 24 hours, whichever occurs first".

Lease of dumpsters by the city was discussed. It was decided not to include such lease in the specifications and stipulations.

Paragraph 12 of the stipulations will have the words "up to" inserted between "units and" and "108 multiple".

The Clerk was directed to inform Woodside Apartments that bids for a new trash contract will be received by Council at the November meeting. Advertisement for such bids will be inserted for publication on October 23rd. They must notify the city by that time if they wish to contract on their own. If no word received they will be included as a multiple-family dwelling under the city contract.

A motion was made by Mr. Wehrmeyer and seconded by Mr. Fangman that Resolution No. 6, 1985, Advertising for Bids for Trash Collection, be introduced. Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Sorg, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; and motion carried. Resolution No. 6, 1985, had been submitted to each councilman, read by them, in its entirety, voted and accepted by unanimous vote of Council.

2. Replacement of Tom Duffey and Carl Votel as members of the Park Hills Board of Adjustment tabled by Council until a future date.

3. Dixie Highway Sewer Project (Phase II) - When questioned by Councilman Sorrell, Mayor Niehaus replied he is hopeful Phase II of this project will be completed by the end of 1985. (The Mayor hopes to get some State Aid for payment of this work.)

BUILDING AND ZONING MATTERS

1. The Clerk informed Council that Mr. Nageleisen, the Bldg. Insp./ Zoning Admin., is keeping close watch on construction of a new residence at 833 Arlington Road. The Clerk will contact Mr. Nageleisen concerning condition of property at 835 Arlington Road.

COMMUNICATIONS

1. Letter from Joan Collins requesting replacement of window at bus stop at Hamilton and Amsterdam Roads. This will be taken care of.

2. Thank you note from Tony Otte for \$25.00 gift on his leaving NKADD for city manager in Florida.

Police Department

1. A motion was made by Mr. Sorg and seconded by Mr. Osterhage that report of the Park Hills Police Dept. for the month of October 1985, be accepted as submitted. Mr. Sorg, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Wehrmeyer, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye;; and the motion carried.

2. Council departmental regulations concerning outside employment by Police Dept. personnel. A portion of such regulations was read to Council. Mr. Carey, Park Hills City Attorney, was of the opinion the outside employment Chief Ostendorf would be engaged in would cause no problem concerning conflict of interest. Because of the Chief's absense at the Council meeting, this will be discussed further with him personally, at a later date.

3. The department was commended by Mr. Wehrmeyer on the excellent patrol work during Halloween "Trick or Treating" hours.

4. Lt. Heideman informed Council the new cruisers have arrived and are awaiting installation of the radio equipment before they can be used by the department. He informed Council if the possibility arises that Mr. Toebben does not accept the certified letter sent by the Building Inspector, it will be turned over to the Sheriff's Office for hand delivery. 3. Dixie Highway Sidewalk/Sewer - Mayor Niehaus informed Council that the sewer underneath Dixie Highway has been replaced; header not installed as yet. The Mayor will check with the contractor concerning steady progress of this project.

4. Hamilton Road Slippage - The Clerk read a letter to Council from the Kentucky Department of Education informing Vice-Mayor Fangman of their willingness to reimburse the city up to 50% of the total cost of this project.

5. Home businesses - nothing further.

6. Mayor Niehaus informed Council the curb installed at St. James & Dixie Highway has directed the water flow away from the property at 811-13 St. James. A space between the street and sidewalk at this address will be filled in with blacktop, at the owner's expense.

7. Council was informed the property at 1019 Rose Circle has once again been sold by Mr. Wm. Menkhaus to Mr. Matt Tallarigo, attorney representing Sharon Sullivan. Mr. George Neumann, Councilman elect, was introduced by Mayor Niehaus to all Council members and the audience.

A motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Osterhage to approve the minutes of the November 11th meeting with the following correction: Page 4, Item No. 6, OLD BUSINESS - "A space between the street and sidewalk at 811-813 St. James will be filled in with blacktop, at the owner's expense." This is in error, it should read, "A space between the street and sidewalk at 811-813 St. James will be filled in with blacktop, at the city's expense and the portion of sidewalk to be repaired by blacktopping will be at the owner's expense." Following note of this correction the vote on approval of the minutes was as follows: Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye and the motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS Public_Works_Department

1. Mayor Niehaus informed council that several sewer problems will be cleared up within a week's time. One problem is located behind the property located on Morgan Court. The broken pipe located at 1220 Audubon has been reported to the property owner.

2. Councilman Sorrell informed Council that a pole located at Hamilton and Arlington is without a sign. "Restricted Hour" signs are to be posted on such poles within the city. A "No Parking" sign will be installed on the pole located at Rosemont and So. Arlington. This information will be given to Mr. Budde of the Public Works Department.

Police Department

1. A motion was made by Mr. Osterhage and seconded by Mr. Fangman that the report of the Park Hills Police Department for the month of November, 1985, be accepted as submitted. Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; and the motion carried.

2. Vice Mayor Fangman questioned Chief Ostendorf concerning the two new cruisers. The Chief indicated one car will be on the road within three days, with both cruisers being on the road within two weeks.

3. The Chief requested the city advertise for invitations to bid on the 1980 and 1982 cruisers. Following discussion, the Clerk was directed to advertise for bids for receipt by Council at the January 13th meeting.

4. Chief Ostendorf told Council a closed circuit network will be installed by Storer Cable Communications, under their responsibility, which will make it possible for the Northern Kentucky Police Departments to exchange information concerning criminal investigations, etc. Thirty police departments must commit to join such network. The cost would be \$7.50 per month for scrambler rental Minutes 12/9/85 Page 2

and maintenance, a \$25.00 installation charge, and a \$15.00 service fee, which payment the police department will assume. This will cover a three to five county area. The network will probably be open at 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. (which is normal shift change for the Park Hills Police Department). This is a two-year program.

Fire Department

1. A motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Osterhage that the report of the Park Hills Volunteer Fire Department for the month of November, 1985, be accepted as submitted. Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; and the motion carried.

2. Chief Kaelin thanked Council for their support and help during his term as Chief of the Park Hills Fire Department, with thanks also to the City Attorney, City Clerk and Police Chief. Mayor Niehaus thanked Mr. Kaelin, with commendation for a job well done.

Rescue_Squad_

1. Due to the absence of Chief Dreyer, no report was given this month.

Finance Department

1. A motion was made by Mr. Hellmann and seconded by Mr. Osterhage that the reports of the Finance Department be accepted as submitted. Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; and the motion carried.

2. Council discussed advertising expenditures, payroll tax and interest income. Mr. Fangman told Council information was received from Mr. Ron Cooney, President of Citizens National Bank (city's banking institution) that possibly a new program will be instituted by their bank in 1986 which will allow the city to invest its funds for six months or longer at a higher rate of guaranteed interest, without early withdrawal penalty.

3. Once again, the delinquency of the Cincinnati Blacktop Company in paying payroll tax to the city was discussed. The company has been informed and has indicated this tax will be paid.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Park Hills Housing Authority - nothing further.

2. Dixie Highway Survey - Mayor Niehaus informed Council a complaint had been received from Mrs. Freckman concerning the unsightly condition of the rear area of the Szechuan Gardens Restaurant. The Building Inspector was directed to view this property for structural deficiencies and unsightly conditions. 3. Dixie Highway Sidewalk Project - Mayor Niehaus told Council the storm sewer is in; not the header. Weather permitting work will continue by the con-tractor.

The Mayor informed Council of his meeting with George Hoffman of the Kentucky Department of Highways, concerning excess money appropriated for Park Hills from State funds. Mr. Hoffman confirmed this fact and a meeting will be scheduled with Mayor Niehaus regarding use of this money in other areas of Park Hills.

4. Hamilton Road Slippage - Paul Michels Company was requested by the Mayor to install a drain along Hamilton Road as a priority project.

Mr. Fangman reported that a 12 inch storm sewer had been located along the length of Hamilton Road, with three manholes and one lamp hole. The contractor suggested installing a perforated drain tile along the road, with a metal grate installed in front of 1035 Hamilton driveway and banking the road to throw the water into the street, with use of the existing 12 inch storm sewer. The side of the road with the perforated drain tile will be sealed to prevent the water going under the road. Further meetings will be scheduled with Mayor Niehaus, Mr. Fangman and Paul Michels Company.

5. Home Businesses - nothing further. Because a new Council will be coming in the first of the year, future meetings will be postponed until the next meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

1. The City Clerk presented Resolution No. 7, 1985, concerning an increase of membership on the Kenton County & Municipal Planning and Zoning Commission, from 15 to 20.

Council discussed the above resolution, with questions being raised concerning appointment of a delegate by the County Judge Executive, who must reside in a sixth class city. If such city is raised to 5th class, would a new appointment be made, or would such city then have two appointees? Also, a question was raised concerning increased delegates in Kenton County from two to three, and in Covington from three to four, (paragraph B (1) of the resolution).

Passage of this resolution will be tabled until such questions are answered to council's satisfaction.

2. Finance Committee Report - Mr. Fangman informed Council that a meeting of the Finance Committee was held November 25, 1985, at 7:30 p.m. at the Mayor's house. Those in attendance were Mayor Niehaus, Councilman Jack Osterhage, Vice-Mayor Skip Fangman.

The first issue resolved was Blue Cross/Blue Shield costs paid by the city for its employees. The committee decided not to change from present coverage, which is the best plan available from Blue Cross/Blue Shield.

The second issued resolved was the implementation of a fifth full-time person in the Police Department. The committee agreed to the following in order to effect a 5th full-time person in the Police Department. The following stipulations must be implemented and will become the official policy of the City of

Park Hills.

(1) There will be no overtime worked by any employees except in emergencies, court required appearances, or part of the regularly scheduled holiday work shift.

(2) There will be no "comp time" allowed by the city.

(3) All overtime, not mentioned above, must be approved by the Mayor or his designated representative.

For the purposes of reported emergencies, such conditions would affect the safety and security of the City of Park Hills.

Mr. Fangman requested Council's approval of the above recommendations, indicating their acceptance of each separately. Thereupon, a motion was made by Mr. Sorrell and seconded by Mr. Hellmann that Council accept the Finance Committee's recommendation that the city keep the present Blue Cross/Blue Shield coverage now in effect. Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; and the motion carried.

Mr. Fangman than introduced for discussion Municipal Order No. 2, 1985, re addition of a 5th full-time employee to the Park Hills Police Department. During discussion it was decided the authorization for a 5th full-time employee would cover the period January 1, 1985 through June 30, 1986.

Following discussion in which certain additions were added to the Municipal Order at the request of Council, Vice-Mayor Fangman presented Municipal Order No 2, 1985. A motion was then made by Mr. Fangman and seconded by Mr. Sorrell that Municipal Order No. 2, 1985, be adopted by Council. Mr. Fangman, aye; Mr. Sorrell, aye; Mr. Osterhage, aye; Mr. Hellmann, aye; and the motion carried.

3. Adoption of BOCA Basic Property Maintenance Code - Mr. Fangman requested Mayor Niehaus to appoint a committee to meet with the City Attorney in regard to adoption of this code. Several questions on contents of the code have to be answered. The City Attorney would then prepare an ordinance or resolution adopting same. Mayor Niehaus then appointed the following to such committee: Councilman Jack Osterhage, Alan Nageleisen, Building Inspector/Zoning Administrator, Vice-Mayor Skip Fangman, City Attorney Marcus Carey. This committee will report its findings at the January council meeting.

BUILDING & ZONING MATTERS

1. Mr. Nageleisen, the Building Inspector/Zoning Administrator reported to Council that the letter to Mr. Toebben had been corrected to contain violations relating to property on both sides of Dixie Highway. The certified letter had been returned by the Post Office. It was then turned over to the Kenton County Sheriff for serving. This was done, giving Mr. Toebben until December 25, 1985, for reply. Pictures have been taken of the property and documented, if court appearances are necessary. Address change was also taken care of.

A letter of violations was served to the Small Animal Hospital, by certified mail. Documented pictures also taken of this property.

2. Mrs. Luken was contacted and informed Mr. Nageleisen she was willing to have the shack and its contents removed; however, she requested additional time to do so. The fire department will remove the building in the spring. The clerk was directed to write Ms. Harper, original complainant, informing her of the status of this property. 3. Mr. Nageleisen requested stationery for the Building Inspector/Zoning Administrator's office. He was informed new city stationery was being printed and will be received in January. No decision was made concerning special stationery for the building inspector.
