ORDINANCE NO. 20, 2016 (VERSION 1)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, IN KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AMENDING CHAPTER 112 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES PURSUANT TO SENATE BILL 11

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 11, signed into effect in 2016, made numerous changes to Kentucky's alcohol statutes;

WHEREAS, under KRS 243,090, all licenses issued after January 1, 2017 by a city shall be valid for a period of no more than a year and shall be renewable upon the date established by the Kentucky Department of Alcoholic Beverages for the expiration of state licenses issued for a premises located in that city;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1

§ 112.09 APPLICATIONS FOR LICENSES; TIME FOR FILING; APPROVAL BY CITY COUNCIL, shall be amended as follows:

All applications for licenses provided for under this chapter shall be upon forms as prescribed and approved by the City Clerk/Treasurer, and such applications shall be filed with the City Clerk/Treasurer [annually, on or before April 30 of each year, except in the case of the original application for license, and shall be accompanied by the proper fee as provided for herein]. The City Council shall review and approve transfers of licenses. [All licenses shall be approved upon such applications either in the case of an original license or a renewal thereof, and in the case of a transfer, by the City Council, and such license shall be for a period of one year beginning June 1 and ending May 31 of the succeeding year. Provided, however, that applications made after September 1 of any year may be issued upon the payment of a proportionate part of said license fee relating to the remaining portion of the year dating from June 1 preceding such application.] After January 1, 2017, all licenses shall be valid for a period of no more than one year and shall be renewable upon the date established by the Kentucky Department of Alcohol Beverage Control for the expiration of state licenses for premises located in Kenton County.

SECTION 2

Any and all ordinances in conflict with this ordinance shall be, and hereby are, repealed to the extent of said conflict.

SECTION 3

If any part of this ordinance or its application is deemed invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the city council intends that such invalidity will not affect the effectiveness of the remaining provisions or applications and, to this end, the provisions of this ordinance are severable.

SECTION 4

That this ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and shall be published under KRS 83A.060(9) and other applicable law.
