First and foremost in these trying times – To inform our residents of some positive news.

Our Budget is currently being worked on as well as a Capital Improvement plan for the next 5 years. Income has grown with our new growth and property values improving and expenses have been kept in line as to not exceed income and to continue setting aside reserve revenue. The reserve is to maintain our city's needs for over 6 months in the event of a downturn in the economy and thus ongoing revenue. We also have a healthy balance in our restricted funds to do some Mill and Overlay and sidewalks this year. (Weather permitting)

We continue to provide the resources necessary to our Fire and Police to properly perform their jobs of keeping all of us safe. Much gratitude goes out to them for their efforts, especially during this challenging time of "war on a disease". Our city clerk's office has been closed, but Julie will take care of you by phone. Call for an appointment if necessary. Public works, Dan, has been out working on needed maintenance projects. Thank you to all of our staff.

MOVING FORWARD, Our business meetings are being worked out with TBNK to be done Virtually via live streaming and Recorded as necessary. When one is set up, on the usual 2nd Monday at 7pm, We will send a notice out to all to know how to access and see the meeting.

I would also like to Thank all our Residents and Businesses in cooperation with the Governor's. rulings of closings and distancing. This is hard but necessary. When the War is over I hope all can return to getting out and supporting business and neighbors in the warm weather ahead.

Infrastructure Updates

Work continues on in the city concerning construction.

Lower Jackson with the Sewer, Water and Cincinnati Bell infrastructure being finalized. When all utilities are completed, the Road can finally be done.

Park Pointe Update: As for Amsterdam Road, delays from weather and permitting initially slowed water and sewer line progress but is now moving along as seen by the numerous new manholes having been installed.

Wald Court is complete except for one lot so the truck traffic will calm down and I would like to get Audubon pavement worked on.

NKU's old site is under contract with Arlington Properties of Alabama. You can see a rendering on-line at parkhillsky.net. The project is called Tapestry and will consist of high-end apartments. We are negotiating an Easement agreement for our residents and some good news for Mt. Allen as the entrance to the development will be gated allowing emergency only access.

Covid-19 Directive - 3/30/20

Kentucky Governor Andy Beshear

In an effort to curb the spread of the coronavirus, Kentuckians are being told to not cross state lines. Governor Andy Beshear issued an order Monday that limits out-of-state travel. The governor is asking residents to remain healthy at home. He stressed that any travel should be limited to essential needs.

Governor Andy Beshear asked that mayors and city governments closely monitor their parks and other public spaces where people are failing to comply with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Kentucky Department for Public Health guidelines on social distancing and public gatherings.

The governor is calling for city leaders to close and ban public access to those public areas where violations are occurring during the COVID-19 state of emergency.



Spring Fire Safety

As many of you are stuck at home this year practicing Social Distancing, annual spring cleaning duties are a good way to pass the time. Many of your yards are probably littered with sticks, limbs, and whatever else may have blown there during the last few months. While it may be tempting to just pile these up and burn them, you must first consider a few regulations. First, try and minimize the burning of any material in the environment. Consider placing items in the trash or other disposal method. Limited Open Burning is permissible in the City of Park Hills only between the months of October and April and must follow these guidelines:

- Only sticks, twigs or limbs may be burned- (NO construction debris, trash, or treated lumber).
- All burning must be at least 50ft. from any structure, and have a water hose readily available.
- Burning is not permitted during high winds or declared Fire Emergency.
- NO leaves may be burned at any time.
- Fires creating a nuisance or producing excessive amounts of smoke will not be permitted.
- Any fire shall not be in excess of 3' x 3'.
- Open burning other than commercially made fire places shall cease by 6 PM.
- Fires must never be left unattended.

Notify the Park Hills Fire Department prior to Any Open burning other than Outdoor fireplaces

The KY Division of Air Quality restricts ALL open burning between the months of May and September in the State of Kentucky. For additional information please see www.air.ky.gov.

Recreational fires in commercially made outdoor metal fireplaces and chimeras are permitted within the city throughout the year. However, please remember they are subject to the above guidelines.

ANY fire will be subject to extinguishment if found to be causing an unnecessary disturbance to the neighborhood. PLEASE be courteous to your neighbors.

Also, as we have already sprung forward, please remember to test your smoke detectors and change the batteries. If you require assistance or have any questions concerning open burning regulations or smoke detectors please contact the Park Hills Fire Department at 431-4333.

News from your Park Hills Tree Board

Spring and Fall offer residents the best time to plant trees. Your Tree Board is providing you with an opportunity to capitalize on these two planting seasons. This Spring the Tree Board has ordered 200 seedlings selected from the Kentucky Department of Forestry. These trees are native to Kentucky. They are: River Birch, Loblolly Pine, Black Locust, and Shagbark Hickory.

The trees will be distributed in Trolley Park. The free tree seedlings are expected to be available Saturday, April 11 between 10:00 and 11:00 which would have matched the now cancelled Easter egg hunt. You can pre-request your seedlings by emailing how many of each tree you would like along with your address and phone number to jdaugherty@fuse.net.

In addition to the free seedlings, Park Hills is now accepting applications for our Plant-A-Tree program. Applications are accepted now and the plantings will be done in the Fall. The Tree Board will coordinate the planting of a tree in your yard, a \$350.00 value, for a small tax deductible donation of \$100.00.
