ORDINANCE NO. 1, 2021

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY, AMENDING §32.36 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES AS IT RELATES TO THE SCHEDULE OF COMMITTEE MEETINGS

WHEREAS, KRS §61.820 requires all meetings of all public agencies to be held at specified times and places which are convenient to the public; and,

WHEREAS, KRS §61.820(2) permits public agencies to provide for a schedule of regular meetings by ordinance, order, resolution, bylaws, or by whatever other means may be required for the conduct of business of that public agency; and,

WHEREAS, the irregularity of committee meetings has required the City Council to amend §32.36 of the Code of Ordinances a number of times over the last few years, which it desires to prevent in the future; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Park Hills desires to establish the schedule of its regular committee meetings so as to not require an ordinance every time a meeting schedule is changed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I

- (A) The City Council shall meet for its regular Council meeting on the second Monday of each month, beginning at 7:00 p.m. prevailing time, at the <u>a</u> facility located at 1601 Hilton Drive, in Park Hills, Kentucky.
- (B) <u>Pursuant to KRS §61.820</u>, <u>Committee</u> meetings <u>of the following Committees</u> shall <u>occur pursuant to a list of dates</u>, <u>times and locations on file in the Office of the City Clerk which shall also be posted on the City's calendar and website within one (1) week <u>prior thereto as follows</u>:</u>
 - (1) The Economic Development Committee shall meet on the Wednesday following the regularly scheduled caucus meeting. The meeting will begin at 6:30 p.m. and be held at the Park Hills City Building, 1106 Amsterdam Road, Park Hills, Kentucky.
 - (2) The Financial Oversight Committee shall meet on the first Monday of each month. The meeting will begin at 7:00 p.m. and be held at the Park Hills City Building, 1106 Amsterdam Road, Park Hills, Kentucky.
 - (3) The Historic Preservation Committee shall meet on the Tuesday following the regularly scheduled Council meeting. The meeting will begin at

7:00 p.m. and be held at the Park Hills City Building, 1106 Amsterdam Road, Park Hills, Kentucky.

- (4) The Infrastructure and Public Works Committee shall meet on the Thursday following the regularly scheduled caucus meeting. The meeting will begin at 4:30 p.m. and be held at the offices of Bayer Becker, Inc., 209 Grandview Drive, Fort Mitchell, Kentucky.
- (5) The Parks, Beautification and Recreation Committee shall meet on the Thursday following the regularly scheduled Council meeting. The meeting will begin at 7:00 p.m. and be held at the Park Hills City Building, 1106 Amsterdam Road, Park Hills, Kentucky.
- (6) The Personnel Committee shall meet on the Monday before the regularly scheduled caucus meeting. The meeting will begin at 6:00 p.m. and be held at the facility located at 1601 Hilton Drive, Park Hills, Kentucky.
- (7) The Communications Committee shall meet on the Wednesday following the regularly scheduled Council meeting. The meeting will begin at 7:00 p.m. and be held at the Park Hills City Building, 1106 Amsterdam Road, Park Hills, Kentucky.
- (C) The City Council shall meet for its regular caucus meeting on the fourth Monday of each month, beginning at 7:00 p.m. prevailing time, at the facility located at in 1601 Hilton Drive, Park Hills, Kentucky.
- (D) Special meetings of the <u>City Council</u> may be called by the Mayor or upon written request of a majority of the <u>City Council</u>. In the call, the Mayor or <u>City Council</u> shall designate the purpose, time, and place of the special meeting with sufficient notice for the attendance of <u>City Council</u> members and for compliance with KRS Ch. 61.
- (E) At a special meeting, no business may be considered other than that set forth in the designation of purpose.
- (F) The minutes of every meeting shall be signed by the person responsible for maintaining city records provided under §32.56 and by the officer presiding at the meeting.
 - (G) All meetings shall be open to the public.

SECTION II

Any and all Ordinances in conflict herewith shall be, and hereby are, repealed to the extent of said conflict.

SECTION III

That this Ordinance shall be signed by the Mayor, attested to by the City Clerk, published and be effective upon publication.

ORDINANCE NO. 2, 2021

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY AMENDING SECTIONS 110.21, 110.22 AND 110.23(B) OF CHAPTER 110, GENERAL LICENSING AND TAXES, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES REGARDING CITY PAYROLL FEES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY:

SECTION I

That Sections 110.21, 110.22 and 110.23(B) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Park Hills, Kentucky shall be and are hereby amended to read, as follows:

CHAPTER 110 GENERAL LICENSING AND TAXES

CITY PAYROLL FEES

Section 110.21 AMOUNT OF LICENSE FEE.

On or after July 1, 2010 2021, every individual, person, association, corporation, company or other entity engaged in any occupation, business, trade, profession, or other activity within the City of Park Hills shall pay to the City of Park Hills a license fee for the privilege of engaging in said activities, which license fee shall be measured by 1.5% of the (first) \$50,000 of all salaries, wages, commissions, tips, gratuities, bonuses, gross receipts, or other compensation earned by every person in the City of Park Hills for work done or services performed or rendered in the City.

Section 110.22 ALTERNATE COMPUTATION OF FEE WORK OUTSIDE THE CITY

(A)In cases where salaries, wages, commissions, tips gratuities, bonuses, gross receipts, or other compensation is earned as a result of work done or servicers performed within and without the city, the license fee required under this subchapter shall be computed by determining upon the oath of the employer, or if required by the License Inspector, upon the oath of the employee, that percentage of the salaries, wages, commissions, tips, gratuities, bonuses, gross receipts, or other compensation earned from the proportion of the work which was done or performed within the city.

(B) Provided, however, that the amount of salaries, wages, commissions, tips, gratuities, bonuses, gross receipts, or other compensation used to calculate the license fee shall not exceed \$50,000.

Section 110.23(B) EMPLOYERS TO OBTAIN LICENSE AND TO WITHHOLD LICENSE FEE AND FILE RETURNS.

(B) Each employer who employs one or more persons within the City of Park Hills shall deduct from the pay due any employee the amount of the license fee measured by the first \$50,000 of all of the salaries, wages, commissions, tips, gratuities, bonuses, gross receipts, or other compensation due each employee by the employer at the time of payment thereof, or any such sums earned due and accrued after July 1, 2006 2021. The payment required to be made on account of such deductions by employers shall be made quarterly to the License Inspector, for the quarterly periods beginning March 31, June 30, September 30 and December 31 of each year, on or before the last day of the month next following the end of each quarterly period.

ORDINANCE NO. 3, 2021

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY CLOSING AND VACATING PART OF OLD STATE ROAD IN THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY.

Whereas, pursuant to KRS 82.405 the City of Park Hills has determined to close part of Old State Road as described in Section I hereof; and,

Whereas, pursuant to KRS 82.405 the City of Park Hills has identified all property owners in or abutting the public way to be closed; and,

Whereas, pursuant to KRS 82.405 the City of Park Hills has provided written Notice of the proposed closings to all property owners identified as in or abutting the portion of the public rights-of-way to be closed; and,

Whereas, pursuant to KRS 82.405 the City of Park Hills has received written notarized Consent to the proposed closing from all property owners in or abutting the portion of the public rights-of-way to be closed and has attached the Consent to vacate notification hereto as Exhibit "C".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY, as follows:

That a portion of Old State Road is hereby closed and vacated without any further action, said public rights-of-way to be closed and vacated being more specifically described as follows:

SECTION 5 – Vacation Leave

(C) <u>Rate of Leave Accrual</u>—Full time employees in the City's service accrue annual leave at the following rate (a week is defined as 40 hours):

After six (6) months of service	One (1) week of vacation

Vacation leave is based on the City's fiscal year. Vacation Leave accrues at a biweekly rate.
