ORDINANCE NO. 6, 2022

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, IN KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AMENDING § 51.09 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO SET THE TRASH COLLECTION CHARGE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR [2021-2022] 2022-2023

WHEREAS, in 2016, the City entered into a new contract with Rumpke of Kentucky, Inc. for the purposes of waste and recycling collection in the City;

WHEREAS, based on the terms of its contract with Rumpke of Kentucky, Inc., the City desires to amend its Garbage Collection ordinance to reflect the new charge for trash collection for the fiscal year [2021-2022] <u>2022-2023</u>

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1

Section 51.09 of the Park Hills Code of Ordinances is amended as follows:

§ 51.09 Cost

- (A) Effective July 1, [2021] 2022 all residents of the city shall pay [\$206.88] \$237.00 per year per residential unit for the collection and removal of garbage, trash, refuse, and recyclables from each resident's premises once a week.
- (B) Payment shall be made by each resident to the Clerk/Treasurer upon receipt of a bill for same between September 1 and September 30, and the city shall act as collecting agent of said garbage assessments payments for the payment of the contract carrier(s) collecting and removing the garbage, trash, refuse, and recyclables from city residents.
- (C) All trash, garbage, and recyclables shall be collected and removed from the premises of the residents of city as prescribed in this chapter.
- (D) Business houses (and certain designated apartments or multiple-dwelling units) in the city shall have their garbage, trash, refuse, and recyclables collected and removed from their premises at their own cost, and may do so either through the garbage collection agencies of the city or by private contract, but their garbage, trash, refuse, and recyclables shall be removed from the city each week to protect the health, safety, and general welfare of the city.
- (E) This section shall be in effect for the period from July 1, [2021] 2022 through June 30, [2022] 2023.

(F) Each residence unit, whether a single apartment or single unit within a multiple-dwelling unit of any like dwelling unit, shall be considered a resident user of the garbage, trash, refuse, and recyclables collection(s), and each shall pay the required garbage, trash, refuse, and recyclables collection fee to the city under this section, except where exempted by specific action of the City Council.

SECTION 2

Any and all ordinances in conflict with this ordinance shall be, and hereby are, repealed to the extent of said conflict.

SECTION 3

If any part of this ordinance or its application is deemed invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the city council intends that such invalidity will not affect the effectiveness of the remaining provisions or applications and, to this end, the provisions of this ordinance are severable.

SECTION 4

That this ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and shall be published under KRS § 83A.060 (9) and other applicable law.

ORDINANCE NO. 7, 2022

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY, IMPOSING TAXES FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR 2022, AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT AND COLLECTION OF SUCH TAXES, AND THE PENALTIES AND INTEREST THEREON FOR FAILURE TO PAY SAME

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I

The City of Park Hills hereby provides for the assessment of all real and personal property for calendar year 2022. The City elects to use the County assessment prepared by the Kenton County Property Valuation Administrator.

SECTION II

The following ad valorem taxes for the calendar year 2022 are hereby levied, assessed and imposed by and for the City of Park Hills, upon the following described property and the owners thereof, jointly and severally:

- A. An ad valorem tax on real property at the rate of \$.209 Dollars for each One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of the value thereof, as assessed pursuant to the provisions hereof. The foregoing rate, however, shall not apply to real property determined to be an Abandoned Urban Property under Ordinance No. 6, 2004. Abandoned Urban Property shall be taxed at the rate of \$.75 Dollars for each One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of the value therof, as assessed pursuant to the provisions hereof.
- B. An ad valorem tax on all motor vehicles assessed as of January 1, 2022, is hereby fixed at the rate of .334 Dollars for each One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of the value thereof.
- C. An ad valorem tax on all corporate franchises and personal property other than motor vehicles at the rate of \$.75 Dollars for each One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of the value thereof, as assessed pursuant to the provisions hereof. Corporate franchises shall be assessed and returned according to Kentucky law.
- D. A road tax on all real property at the rate of \$.155 Dollars for each One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of the value thereof, as assessed pursuant to the provisions hereof.

SECTION III

The procedures set forth in Sections 33.010, 33.011, and 33.012 of the Park Hills Code of Ordinance shall govern the collection of the ad valorem taxes levied pursuant to this Ordinance.

SECTION IV

The tax as provided herein, shall be payable to the City Clerk/Treasurer between the dates of September 1, 2022 and September 30, 2022.

The City has a lien upon the property assessed under the terms of this chapter for the taxes levied upon that property, and for all penalties, interest, fees, commissions, charges, and other expenses, including court costs and attorney's fees as an additional penalty under KRS §90A.070(2), incurred by reason of delinquency in payment of the tax bill or in the process of collecting it. The lien has priority over all other obligations or liabilities for which the property is liable.

SECTION V

Any and all persons, corporations, companies or other legal entities failing to pay said taxes during the period set forth above, shall be assessed a penalty on the amount of the taxes in an amount equal to ten percent (10%) between October 1 and October 31, 2022; and an amount equal to twenty-five percent (25%) after October 31, 2022, together with interest at the rate of twelve percent (12%) *per annum* from due date, and the costs of collection including reasonable attorney fees, court costs and related expenses.

SECTION VI

Any and all ordinances in conflict herewith shall be, and hereby are, repealed to the extent of said conflict.

SECTION VII

If any part of this ordinance or its application is deemed invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the City Council intends that such invalidity will not affect the effectiveness of the remaining provisions or applications and, to this end, the provisions of this ordinance are severable.

SECTION VIII

That this ordinance shall be signed by the Mayor, attested to by the City Clerk, be published and effective upon publication.

MUNICIPAL ORDER NO. 4, 2022

AN ORDER OF THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION WITH PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT SERVICES OF KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY (PDS) FOR CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL OF A TEXT AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE XIII, SECTION 13.0 H. OF ITS OFFICIAL ZONING CODE ORDINANCE CONCERNING OFF-STREET PARKING REGULATIONS GENERAL REQUIREMENTS.

WHEREAS, City Council for the City of Park Hills, Kentucky, at an open meeting on June 13, 2021, considered a request by Good Spirits retail liquor store to amend its zoning code ordinance concerning off-street parking regulations general requirements for retail establishments to modify such to permit 1 space for every 300 square feet with each space to be a minimum of 9' in width and 18' in length, with driving aisles of 22' in width; and.

WHEREAS, after discussion and review, City Council approved the request and agreed and so authorized the Mayor to make application with Planning and Development Services (PDS) to approve such a text amendment to it official zoning code ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, such request is also in keeping with PDS's Z21 Project for updating the zoning ordinances of various municipalities in Kenton County in order to create common regulations and requirements for which they recommend approval of such an amendment;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE CITY OF PARK HILLS, KENTUCKY, as follows:

SECTION I

That the Mayor is hereby authorized and so directed on behalf of the City to make application with Planning and Development Services of Kenton County, Kentucky (PDS) requesting consideration and approval of a text amendment to Article XIII, Section 13.0 H. the City's official zoning code ordinance regarding off-street parking regulations general requirements for retail establishments to modify the same to permit 1 space for every 300 square feet with each space to be a minimum of 9' in width and 18' in length, with driving aisles of 22' in width.

SECTION II

That City Council shall thereafter consider the eventual recommendation of PDS before deciding to implement any amendment to its official zoning code ordinance thereby and in conformity therewith.
