# 1. St. Joseph Lane sidewalk

The Committee discussed the status of this project, which has been held up due to issues relating to the state grant. *Update: At the 3.9.23 business meeting of City Council, Council voted to approve the new agreement with the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, which calls for an additional \$50,000 for an on-site inspector (\$40,000 of which will be paid for by the state), and also voted to allow the Mayor to enter into a contract with TMS Construction. The timetable for the beginning of construction is not yet known.* 

# 2. Amsterdam Road

The Mayor reported that the grant application for the deep fix of Amsterdam is on schedule to be submitted in June, as planned.

# 3. Brent Spence Bridge

The Committee will continue to monitor this project and continue reaching out to adjacent cities (Ft. Wright, Ft. Mitchell and Covington) to coordinate efforts.

# 4. Infrastructure planning

The Committee discussed opportunities to improve planning for infrastructure projects, including:

- Updating the road maintenance list
- Securing data on cost, vendor availability and traffic counts

#### 5. Tentative budget discussion

The Committee held a tentative discussion about the Infrastructure budget, both for the balance of FY22-23 and for FY23-24. Items discussed included:

- Cleveland (curbs)
- Emerson (water)
- Park Road (west side) (mill and overlay)
- Exter to Irish Rose (mill and overlay)

#### 6. Communications

Councilman Shields will write an Infrastructure update for the next City newsletter. The Committee will also explore launching a blog on the City's website to provide updates and information.
