Mr. Wice stated that it is up to council to choose the parcels and property owners would not be engaged unless council wants them to be. The mayor inquired about TIFs and IRB's. Mr. Wice said that the analysis would provide data for that and there are certain parameters you must meet. They are spelled out in KRS.

Ms. Froelich would like to have Council agree tonight to move forward as the economic development & business committee has recommended. Council believes the areas outlined in the presentation would be good areas to study. Mr. Wice would like to look further into the area near Devou Park. Council agreed and would like to move forward with the plan especially since there is no cost to the city.

A parcel analysis is one way to complete this assessment when looking at a specific area.

A parcel analysis is a local economic assessment on a smaller scale.

Parcel analyses are often used when looking at specific business districts or study areas.



What a Parcel Analysis Can Do

A parcel analysis can serve as an educational tool to gather support for new economic development goals.

Documenting the existing conditions, like the factors below, assists in identifying local assets but also challenges in the area.

Parcel analyses are often the first step in neighborhood development because the findings can help organize for change.

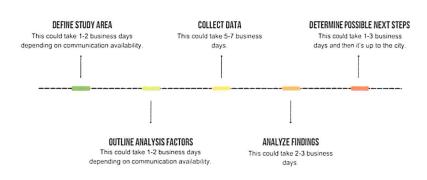
Parcel analyses can help create a strategic plan by establishing which strategies are needed for the area. The findings from a parcel analysis could shape what kind of business-oriented or place-based strategies are needed.



Steps in a Parcel Analysis

Timeline

- Define the study area.
 Determine where the starting point and ending point is.
- Outline the factors and elements needed for the analysis.
- 3. Collect data and information.
- Analyze what those findings indicate about the study area, including local assets and challenges.

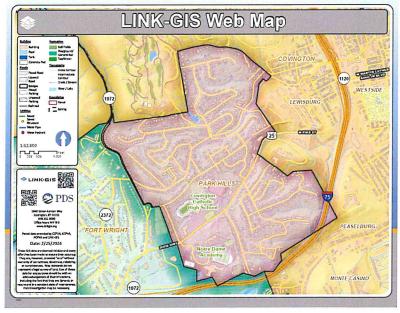
Highway Commercial, Neighborhood Commercial, and Institutional parcels along Dixie Highway

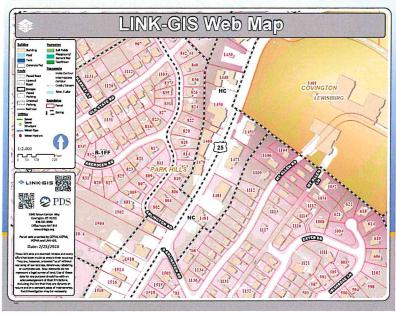

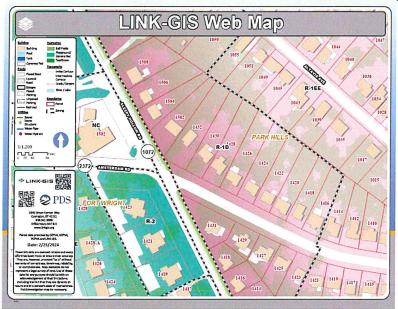

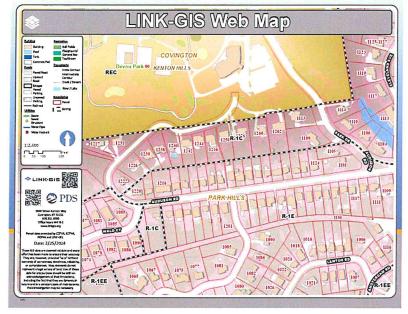

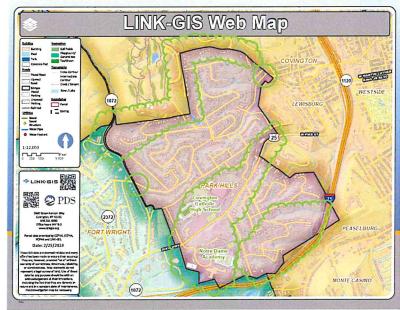
