

**CITY OF PARK HILLS  
INFRASTRUCTURE AND PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE  
MEETING MINUTES FROM THURSDAY, MARCH 14, 2024 MEETING**

**1. Amsterdam Road**

- The Committee voted unanimously to approve Mayor Zembrodt's Interim fix discussion and recommendation with this statement: The Infrastructure Committee unanimously approves Mayor Zembrodt's decision to expend funds for a temporary fix of Amsterdam Road from Sleepy Hollow to Hillcrest Road in advance of the deep fix of Amsterdam that will be paid for by the recently-awarded state grant - ***provided this interim fix does not negatively impact that grant***. The Committee believes this interim fix is warranted given not only the poor state of this section of Amsterdam but the resulting safety issue from drivers attempting to avoid the problem areas as they drive this section of Amsterdam.
- The Committee will work with Mayor Zembrodt and Police Chief Stanley on a safety and traffic maintenance plan for the Road's deep fix.
- The Committee will work with Mayor Zembrodt and City staff on a communications plan to keep residents informed about the deep fix, which likely will include door-to-door contact with Amsterdam Road residents, signs and updates on the City's website and Facebook page.

**2. Traffic counts**

- City Clerk Julie Historical Alig is developing a document containing all historical traffic counts.
- Councilmember Spoor is managing the effort to use the new traffic count strips to provide traffic counts on Arlington Road and Park Road near the Boulevard. St. James will be studied next.

**3. Road survey report (Mayor Zembrodt and Councilmember Elkins)**

- Councilmember Elkins and Mayor Zembrodt went over the updated road survey report, which will be posted to the City's website once all comments and updates are incorporated.

**4. Mt. Allen green screen (Mayor Zembrodt)**

- Mayor Zembrodt is still working with the developer to improve this green screen.

**5. Brent Spence Bridge Subcommittee (Councilmembers Elkins and Shields)**

- Councilmembers Elkins and Shields will meet to discuss the next steps in this effort.

**6. 2024-25 infrastructure plan and budget (Mayor Zembrodt)**

- The 2024-25 infrastructure plan and budget were reviewed by the Committee. The budget is being finalized by the full Council.

**7. New business**

- The Committee asked Public Works Director VonHandorf to explore putting reflective paint on the North Arlington sidewalk to help walkers see the culvert that runs alongside it.
- Mayor Zembrodt said the newest timeframe for the installation of the Old State Gate was mid-April.
